Scope Note

General George W. Balloch was a member of the Board of Trustees of Howard University and served as the first Treasurer of the Board of Trustees from 1867 to 1872.

General Balloch was also Chief Disbursing Officer of the Freedmen's Bureau from 1865 to 1871.

The George W. Balloch papers were acquired as a gift from Mr. Stanley Balloch Safford in 1965. The papers span « linear foot and cover the period 1865 to 1902.

Included in the papers, are letters, photographs, printed material, and financial papers of Howard University. Of special significance, to the collection is a holographic account book pertaining to Howard University and the Freedmen's Bureau from 1867 to 1872.

Biographical Sketch

- 1825 Dec. 3 Born in West Claremont, New Hampshire the son of George Williamson and Amanda (West) Balloch.
- 1844-1847 Attended Norwich University in Vermont
- 1849 Married Martha J. Palmer
- 1856-58 Town Clerk of Sommerworth, New Hampshire
- 1858 The first Police Justice of Somerworth, New Hampshire.
- 1861 Appointed First Lieutenant Company D under General Oliver Otis Howard.
- 1865 Appointed Colonel and Inspector of Subsistence and assigned to Freedmen's Bureau.
- 1865 Received honorary A.M. from Norwich University.
- 1865-1871 Served as Chief Disbursing Officer of the Freedmen's Bureau
- 1868 Mustered out of service as Captain and Community of Subsistence, having been brevetted successively Major, Lieutenant Colonel, Colonel and Brigadier General of Volunteers.
- 1868-1871 Served as Superintendent of Streets for Washington, D.C.
- 1867-1872 Served as the first treasurer of the Board of Trustees of Howard University.
- 1867-1902 Served on the Board of Trustees of Howard University.
