Scope Note

The Mary E. Branch Collection was created from the efforts of Dr. Sadie Daniel St. Clair, who was assembling information for a proposed biographical study of Miss Mary E. Branch. The information in this collection spans the period July, 1909 through May 3, 1948, and totals « linear feet.

Miss Mary E. Branch was the first woman president of Tilloston College, Austin, Texas, as a coeducational institution of higher learning. This collection contains biographical data, correspondence in terms of form letters signed by President Branch, and letters from inquiries written by Dr. Sadie Daniel St. Clair regarding Mary E. Branch. Other items included are typescripts of Mary E. Branch's addresses and writings. The collection does not contain any personal information about Mary E. Branch's family, nor is there any documentation of her other career activities.

Born in Farmville, Virginia, to Tazewell and Harriet (Lacey) Branch. Tazewell Branch, a two term member of the Virginia Legislature, had been a slave during Reconstruction.
