NOTES.

Batteries I and K, 3d Artillery, are under orders to change station from Fort McPherson, Ga., to Key West Barracks, Fla. See paragraph 2 Special Orders, No. 10, Headquarters Department of the East, January 13 1894. Battery K goes first, to be followed by Battery I. Upon arrival of Battery I at Key West Barracks, Battery H starts for Fort McPherson. For convenience of future reference Batteries I and K, 3d Artillery, are reported in this Roster as at Key West Barracks, and Battery H, 3d Artillery, as at Fort McPherson.
