Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter of May 5, 1931, in which you make inquiry relative to the amount of Thomas Montgomery Gregory's adjusted service certificate.

Upon investigation it has been found that when Lieutenant Gregory's adjusted service credit was originally computed, an error was made. The records show that Thomas Montgomery Gregory trained as a civilian candidate for commission at Fort Des Moines, Iowa, from June 17, to October 14, 1917. During this period he acquired no military status. He was commissioned a first lieutenant, Officers' Reserve Corps, on Oct. 15 1917, assigned to active duty the same day, and honorably discharged on Feb. 24, 1919.

Since he acquired no military status until Oct. 15, 1917, he is not entitled to adjusted service credit for the period prior to that date. Deduction of 60 days as required by section 201 of the World War Adjusted Compensation Act, from service rendered between Oct. 15, 1917 and Feb. 24 1919, leaves an adjusted service credit of 433 days' home service compensable at the rate of \$1.00 a day or \$433. which amount is this date being certified to the Director, U.S. Veterans' Bureau.
