Mrs. John C. Wyman, in one of her letters since the death of Mrs. Grimke, in speaking of her says:

"I remember Lottie as I write your name. She personified Wordsworth's verse describing his ideal Lucy as

Is shining in the sky."

In another letter she says: "I thank you for telling me what you wrote of Lottie. She had one of the sweetest and most delicate natures I ever knew. I saw a great deal of her for a few years. Yet how gently she bore herself, with what a grace of gesture she moved and lived within her tragic sphere - till you came and flooded her pathway with ~~HHHH~~ sunshine.
