HISTORICAL SKETCH OF FRELINGHUYSEN UNIVERSITY

The Frelinghuysen University, unlike Minerva, did not "spring fullfledged from the head of Jupiter," but is an institution of development and growth. It was organized April 27, 1906, at a meeting held at the residence of the late Dr. Jesse Lawson, 2011 Vermont Avenue, Washington, D C. When the school was organized it was named the Interdenominational Bible College; and Dr. Jesse Lawson was elected as its President.

In the organization of the College the following named persons participated: Hon, Miflin W. Gibbs (at that time) United States Consul to Madigascar; Rev. Samuel G. Miller, a white Presbyterian minister; Hon Judson W. Lyon, (at that time) Registrar of the United States Treasury; Rev. Daniel E. Wiseman, Pastor of the Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer; Dr. Kelly Miller (at that time) Dean of the College of Art and Science, Howard University; and Rev. Walter H. Brooks, Pastor of the 19th Street Baptist Church

In 1917 the name was changed from Interdenominational Bible College to the name of the Frelinghuysen University, in honor and commemoration of the life and character of the lamented Frederick Theodore Frelinghuysen, former U. S. Senator of New Jersey, and Secretary of State under President Chester A. Arthur. It was under the leadership of Senator Frelinghuysen that the Civil Rights of Colored Americans were written into the Statutes of the United States
