## Capital Teacher Supplies Glossary

Dr. Anna J. Cooper, former principal, now teacher of Latin at the Dunbar High school, last week received from the University of Paris copies of an edition of "Le Pelerinage de Charlemagne," for which she supplied the English glossary. The edition contains an introduction by Abbe Felix Klein, professor at the Catholic Institute of Paris.

The book was published first in London, with English glossary, in 1836, by Francis Michel. All trace of the edition was lost in 1879, although several editions appeared in Germany up to 1913. The English glossary supplied by Dr. Cooper follows closely the German glossary. The edition contains the ancient text and modern text with notes by Koschwitz.

The committee in charge of the affair was headed by William Cooney, Paul Reynolds and Carberry O'Shea, officers of the Athletic association,

As one of the filters was open and being cleaned, the students were given the opportunity of going down in the sand beds and viewing at first hand the work of cleansing. Illustrated charts and maps were utilized to make clear the method whereby the water is taken from the Potomac, stored in reservoirs, and finally filtered. Mr. Curtis, superintendent of the plant and Dr. C. J. Lauter, chemist and bacteriologist, personally conducted the tour.

In the debate that followed, the affirmative speakers contended that the government owed a duty to the public to intervene in view of the national calamity that threatens the failure of the miners and operators to reach an agreement on the questions involved.

The speakers for the affirmative were Mr. Spinatto, William Doherty and R. Cushwa; for the negative, Mr. Downey, Arron Ezersky and H. Padelbsky. The decision was awarded the negative by a vote from the floor.
