THE College of Dentistry of Howard University will offer a course for the training of Dental Hygienists beginning with the opening of the school year, September 26, 1934.

Candidates eligible for admission to the course are young women who have graduated from accredited high schools with good records. The course will be one year in length.

The Dental Faculty Delegation Makes Inspection Tour

FOR the first time in the history of the College of Dentistry, an adequate representation of the faculty was present at the meeting of the International Association for Dental Research and the American Association of Dental Schools, which convened, jointly, in Chicago, March 17-21, inclusive. The delegation from the Dental College was especially fortunate in being present at these epoch-making meetings of the most outstanding organizations for dental advancement. The faculty group was made up of the Dean, Dr. Russell A. Dixon, Dr. Adolphus Walton, Dr. Robert M. Hendrick, Dr. John A. Turner, and Dr. Walter B. Garvin.

At a session of the International Association for Dental Research, Dr. Russell A. Dixon reported original findings on "Histopathological Changes in Pulp and Dentine Under Different Filling Materials." This presentation showed a thoroughness of investigation which was impressively received by the Association.

Following the two day session of the Research Association, the American Association of Dental Schools met to consider the final report and recommendations of a three year study of dental curricula. The survey was made by the Curriculum Survey Committee, appointed by the American Association of Dental Schools, and financed by the Carnegie Foundation. For preliminary consideration of subjects, the meeting was divided into group conferences and some member of our Dental Faculty participated in each conference. This is the first time that a

cross-section of the faculty has been represented with this body. Their presence in such meetings means much to the relationship of Howard University Dental College with other dental schools of America.

En route to and from the meetings in Chicago, the delegation visited the following Dental Schools: Ohio State University, Indiana University, Northwestern University, and Western Reserve University. Much time was spent in a detailed inspection of methods of teaching, general educational approach, and the physical plants of the schools visited. The value of such a tour and contacts will have a very broadening and far-reaching effect on the general program of dental education at Howard University.
