To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Know ye, That the bearer hereof, Brevet Major General Oliver O. Howard, Brigadier General of the Army of the United States, is about proceeding abroad.

These are therefore to request all whom it may concern to permit him to pass freely, without let or molestation, and to extend to him all such friendly aid and protection as would be extended to like officers of Foreign Governments resorting to the United States.

America, have hereunto set my hand and caused
the seal of this Department to be affixed at
Washington, this 10th day
of March A. D. 1884, and
of the Independence of the United States the
one hundred and eighth.
