THE CIVIL RIGHTS DOCUMENTATION PROJECT

In 1967, the Civil rights Documentation Project (CRDP) set out to chronicle systematically the civil rights era through a series of recorded interviews. This series, now known as the Ralph J. Bunche Oral History Collection, is a unique and comprehensive account of the civil rights movement. It captures for all time, the voices, thoughts, recollections and interpretations of leaders of the civil rights movement, members of its rank and file, supporters, activists involved in related activities and those who opposed the movement. It is an extraordinary record of a turbulent and transforming period of United States history.

The Project was the brain child of Dr. Ralph J. Bunche and was supported by a major grant from the Fund for Advancement of Education. Dr. Bunche was then Under Secretary of the United Nations, Director of the Trusteeship Division and a member of the Board of Directors of the Fund.

The Ford Foundation established the Fund in 1951 as an independent entity "to advance and improve formal or institutionalized education in North America." Over the next several years however, the Ford Trustees gradually brought the Fund under the control of the Foundation and eventually integrated it into its operations in 1967. Dr. Bunche proposed the Civil Rights Documentation Project in 1966, as one of the Fund's final grants. Ultimately, through grants from both the Fund and the Ford Foundation, the Project became one of the largest oral history efforts focusing on civil rights and related matters.

Acknowledging the enterprising nature of both the Fund and the Foundation's support, CRDP Project Director, Dr. Vincent J. Browne, wrote in 1974:

"It was through the support of the Fund for Advancement of Education and the Ford Foundation that the Civil Rights Documentation Project was made possible. It should be noted that their support included more than their financial generosity, but also their interest and willingness to fund an oral history project which in a way could be described as a very venturesome undertaking."¹

The return on that investment made in 1967 has appreciated immeasurably. Scholars of the civil rights movement recognize the oral history collection as one of the most inclusive sources of its kind on civil rights, and have used it extensively. In the last two decades the collection has attracted hundreds of national and international scholars, and researchers and students at all levels

of academic preparation. It has also been used by writers, and radio, television and film producers.

Taylor Branch, credits the collection in his Pulitzer Prize winning book, Parting the Waters: America in the King Years, 1954-1963. David Garrow, in his Bearing the Cross: Martin Luther King, Jr. and the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, 1955-1968, acknowledged the significance of the oral history interviews. Others have used it to develop scripts for radio and television documentaries, most notably the "Eyes on the Prize" series.

Twenty-eight interviewers recorded more than 700 people during the life of the project. Some oral authors were interviewed more than once. As a group these individuals represent a broad range of civil rights activities. While many were well-known civil rights leaders at the time, a large number of them were known only to their local communities. In addition, there were interviews with several individuals who were generally opposed to the civil rights struggles of Blacks. The result is a collection that covers the widest possible spectrum of the civil rights field, as well as activities in other areas which were affected by the "movement." Eleven distinct categories of individuals were interviewed, including:

1. Persons involved as participants in such civil rights activities as sit-ins, voter registration drives, picket lines, boycotts, the Freedom Rides, the March on Washington, the Selma March, and the Poor People's Campaign.
2. Persons active in the implementation of court decisions in school desegregation cases.
3. Lawyers and judges handling civil rights cases.
4. National, state and local leaders of civil rights organizations.
5. Leaders in organizations giving significant support on behalf of civil rights activities.
6. Academicians and scholars who have focused attention on civil rights through their research and writing.
7. Officials of the national government including members of Congress and administrators in the executive branch.
8. State and local elected officials including members of state legislatures, city councils, and boards of education.
9. Persons supporting civil rights through their contributions or performances in such fields as the theater, music, art and literature.

Other Audio Collections

Included in this category are the following:

The Gift Sound Recording group which is composed of donated recorded cassettes for which there is no provenance or signed Interview Agreements Therefore this collection is not available to researchers. 25 cassettes.

The James Johnson group of audio tapes appear to be recordings of radio and television programs. There is no provenance or signed Interview Agreements donating these tapes to MSRC. Therefore this collection is not available to researchers. 11 cassettes.

The Lou LuTour Radio Documentary Series on the Negro Press was donated to Moorland-Spingarn Research Center on July 31, 1975. The series consists of more than 140 recorded five-minute interviews of nearly 75 individuals associated with the work of the Negro Press. The series was completed between 1963 and 1968. This collection is now available to researchers because it was duplicated onto cassette tapes. 31 cassette tapes. 31 open reel tapes.

The Carroll Miller Models Project is composed of interviews he recorded with several individuals during the research for his book Role Model Black which was published in 1982. There are no signed Interview Agreements giving Dean Miller or Moorland-Spingarn the rights to these tapes. Therefore this collection is not available to researchers. 56 cassettes.

E. Pauline Myers' taped autobiography was deposited in the Oral History Department sometime before 1989. An Interview Agreement formally donating the cassette tapes to Moorland-Spingarn was signed by Miss Myers in June 1991. No decision has been made at this point about its availability for research use. 24 cassettes.

The Perceptions Project was another interview project which Dean Miller undertook at some point prior to 1989 and deposited the tapes in the Oral History Department. There are no signed Interview Agreements giving Dean Miller or Moorland-Spingarn the rights to these tapes. Therefore these interviews are not available to researchers. 43 cassettes.

In addition to the collections named and detailed above, there are scores of cassette and open reel tapes for which there is no provenance or agreements governing the ownership of their copyright. Despite these deficits, the tapes have been accessioned and cataloged in the Oral History Department. The value of this ad hoc collection of recorded speeches, presentations and conferences however has not been ascertained, because there has been no time to review them.

Within the cassette collection are approximately 120 tapes that Moorland-Spingarn Research Center purchased from Pacifica Radio. Ideally this collection should be transferred to the Library Division for research use and managed like other machine-assisted resources in the Library. A complete inventory of this 120 cassette tape library follows in the listing of the General Cassettes Tape Collection. Following is an inventory of all of these tapes:
