Scope Note

The papers of social worker, social science researcher, and Y.W.C.A. administrator, Myra Colson Callis, span the years 1830-1978 and measure approximately 23 linear feet. Biographical material is found in the series, Personal Papers, as well as within the collection's voluminous correspondence. Material relating to Ms. Callis's professional career is found within the Organizational Affiliations, Writings, and Correspondence series. Her research and writings examine issues such as women, work, and industry. Her work with the Y.W.C.A. is documented through correspondence, organizational affiliations, and photographs. Also of note in Organizational Affiliations is the transcript of her 1948 trial before the Federal Security Agency Loyalty Board.

The bulk of the Myra Callis Papers is comprised of her correspondence with her husband, Dr. Henry Arthur Callis, as well as with various other family members. This unique collection of letters spans over seven decades and provides a wealth of information on the relationships and accomplishments of a notable family of educators and professionals.

The Colson family is also documented in the series, Family Papers. Ms. Callis' father, James M. Colson II, was Principal at Virginia Normal and Collegiate Institute. Her mother, brothers, and sister were also educators. The activities of early Colson family members is documented in this series as well. Of note is a brief history of the family, 1830s correspondence, and an 1833-1835 record book from Monrovia, West Africa.

The Myra Colson Callis Papers were donated by Ms. Callis in 1974 along with the papers of her husband, Dr. Henry A. Callis (MSRC collection #191). Her brother, James Colson, donated additions to the collection in 1979.

It is arranged by family member, including Ms. Colson's parents, James M. and Kate D. Colson, and her siblings: William, Edna, James "Major," and Cortlandt. There is material other than correspondence documenting a number of relatives, notably her brother William who served in WWI, became a lawyer, and died young. Correspondents are arranged alphabetically, and organizational affiliations are noted in parentheses.

to Box 193-44 Columbia Employment Center, where Ms. Callis was employed as a social worker from 1935-1942. Correspondence from domestic workers and employers document both sides of the center's placement service. Also of note in this series is the material documenting the United Federal Workers of America. In 1948, Ms. Callis was tried before the Federal Security Agency Loyalty Board, and her case material is found under the UFWA's legal cases. Included is a full transcript of the trial.
