# BURT'S BOARDING HOUSE,

No. 12, LIVERPOOL STREET, BISHOPSGATE STREET, LONDON.

OPENED 20th OF 5th MONTH, 1833.

THIS ESTABLISHMENT is not confined to Members of the Society of Friends, but is designed for the accommodation of respectable persons, of all denominations, who prefer a private residence in London rather than lodging at an Inn; and besides the usual meals, well-aired Beds and private Sitting Rooms may generally be engaged from a single day or night, to any longer period. The Charges, it is believed, will be found as low as the accommodation afforded will admit. They are made either by the DAY, or by the MEAL, to suit the convenience of Boarders.

Particular attention is paid to the accommodation of YOUNG PERSONS, who, on coming to situations in London, may require a temporary and guarded residence until they can be permanently settled; and in cases where it may be necessary for INVALIDS or CHILDREN to come to Town unaccompanied by any of their Friends, on receipt of timely information they will be met, if desired, at the Places of their arrival, and every means will be adopted to secure their safety and comfort, so long as they continue at this Boarding House.

Commissions in Town or Country punctually attended to at a moderate remuneration. A regular charge being made for Waiting, no Fee to servants is required.
