## Scope Note

Mrs. Regia Bronson donated the Anna J. Cooper Papers to Howard University in 1971. The papers total five linear feet spanning the period 1881 to 1958. They are comprised primarily of writing by Anna J. Cooper, including news articles, speeches, poems, pamphlets and books.

There are also galley proofs, drafts, and some research materials of her book, *The Life and Writings of the Grimke Family* included in this collection.

Mrs. Cooper served as President of Frelinghuysen University, Washington, D.C. from 1930 to 1941. Among her papers are some materials relating to Frelinghuysen University including programs, legal documents, correspondence, and an account book from the School of Law, 1921-1929.

Other items of note are three scrapbooks of letters, stamps, manuscripts, news articles, memorabilia dating 1881-1940, and an autograph album dating 1883-1889. There are several books and periodicals that have been autographed and inscribed. Among these books is an autographed copy of *Au Pays de "la Vie Intense* by Felix Klein. The papers include several letters and cards from Felix Klein to Anna J. Cooper, as well as a poem by Mrs. Cooper dedicated to him.

## Biographical Sketch

- 1858 August 10 Born in Raleigh, North Carolina, the daughter of George Washington Haywood and Hannah Stanley.
- 1877 June 21 Married George Christopher Cooper.
- 1879 September 27 George Cooper died.
- 1884-1885 Professor of Modern Language and Literature, Wilberforce University, Ohio.
- 1885-1887 Instructor of Math, Latin and Greek, St. Augustine's Normal and Collegiate Institute, Raleigh, North Carolina.
- 1887 Received M.A. degree in Math from Oberlin College, Ohio.
- 1887 Began teaching at Washington High School, Washington, D.C.
- 1892 Published *A Voice from the South by a Black Woman of the South*.
- 1900 Addressed Pan-African Conference, Westminster Hall, London.
- 1901-1906 Principal of M. Street High School, Washington, D.C.
- 1906 Appointed supervisor of the Colored Social Settlement.
- 1906-1910 Professor of Foreign language, Lincoln Institute, Jefferson City, Missouri
- 1910-1930 Teacher of Latin, Dunbar High School Washington, D.C.
- 1911-1913 Attended summer sessions at 'la Guilde' in Paris.
- 1915-1917 Attended Columbia University summer sessions, preparing for her doctorate.
- 1920-1921 Attended extension courses at Columbia University, New York.
- 1925 Received a Doctor of Philosophy degree from the University of Paris.
- 1930-41 President and teacher at Frelinghuysen University, Washington, D.C.

- 1941-64      President Emeritus and Acting Registrar, Frelinghuysen University.
- 1964          Died.
