SCOPE NOTE

The papers of William J. Faulkner (1891 - 1987) Congregational minister, folklorist, author, and Fisk University Dean are in 14 series: family materials; personal papers; financial records; correspondence; writings by Faulkner; sermons, speeches and services by Faulkner; organizational affiliations; writings by others; program files; research files; photographs; artifacts; audio recordings and restricted items. The bulk of this collection is made up of Faulkner's correspondence and writings, which span his entire career from 1914 to 1980. Faulkner's renown throughout African American society is reflected in the voluminous correspondence from his professional and personal relationships. There are several manuscript versions of his book, The Days When the Animal's Talked Black American Folktales and How They Came to Be, published in 1977. This title represents a substantial and significant contribution to the history of African American folklore.

Also evident in this collection are a wealth of photographs which include portraits of Faulkner, as well as, candid images of Faulkner and his family at various vacations and holiday celebrations. There are also a number of images of Sigma Pi Phi meetings and conventions.

The family papers contain items from his wife Elizabeth Abele Cook Faulkner, fondly known as Bessable, his sisters Florence and Ethel Faulkner, and his children, Josephine, Marie and William Faulkner, Jr. Mrs. Faulkner's materials include correspondence and Cook family genealogical items. A unique element of his children's materials are the correspondence and writings of his son, William Faulkner, Jr.

SCOPE NOTE continued

Dr. Faulkner's son served in World War II as a pilot; he subsequently died in enemy fire.

Among the artifacts for William Faulkner, Jr. are his purple heart, military correspondence, military burial flag and service uniform.

The writings, sermons, and speeches by Faulkner chronicle his broad interested in Christian and secular issues facing African American people, such as segregation, racism, Christian love, African American folklore, current events, death and dying. There is also a small amount of items regarding Faulkner's life in the political arena while residing in Cape May and Wildwood, New Jersey. His civilian appointment to the City Council of Cape May brought about changes in education and select civil procedures. In the Writings by Others series there is material from numerous philosophers and Christian thinkers. Many of these items were used to augment sermons and include quotes and vignettes for funerals.

His organizational affiliations range from the Omega Psi Phi fraternity to Sigma Pi Phi to the Mu-So-Lit Club. Especially rich is the wealth of early materials on Omega Psi Phi and Sigma Pi Phi also known as the Boule and Mu-So-Lit Club programs and agendas.

His career began in 1914 when he first appointed to First Congregational Church in Atlanta. His long standing distinction at Fisk University propelled him into other arenas of ecclesiastic service at Park Manor Congregational Church in Chicago, as well as appointments to various ecumenical boards and organizations.

The papers were donated by his daughters Josephine Faulkner Webster and Marie Faulkner Brown between 1988 and 1990.

Biographical Sketch

November 16, 1891	Born to Lawrence Faulkner and Hannah Doby in Society Hill, South Carolina.
1902	Attended private school of Miss Euphemia Purcell in Society Hill South Carolina. Met an ex-slave Simon Brown who would inspire his love of folklore and become immortalized in his future writings.
1908- 1911	Attended Maysville Institute in Darlington County, South Carolina, Graduated with a degree in tailoring.
1914	Graduated cum laude from Springfield College, in Springfield, Massachusetts with a Bachelor of Humanities Degree.
1914-1916	Worked as Director of Physical Education at the Christian Street, Y.M.C.A. in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania
1916-1917	Opened Faulkner Brothers' Tailoring Business.
June 12, 1917	Married Elizabeth Abele Cook of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. They had four children.
1917-1919	Served on the War Council of the Y.M.C.A. as personnel secretary in Washington, D.C.
1919-1921	Worked as Director of Physical Education and Boys Work with the Butler Street, Y.M.C.A. in Atlanta, Georgia.
1922-1932	Worked in real estate and construction business with Walter E. Aikens in Atlanta, Georgia. They opened Aiken and Faulkner Contractors.
1925	Served as acting pastor for the First Congregational Church of Atlanta, Georgia. Appointed full pastor of the First Congregational Church of Atlanta, Georgia.
1933	Moved to Chicago, Illinois to attend Chicago Theological Seminary. He also entered the Divinity School of the University of Chicago.
1934-1953	Served as Dean of Men and Dean of Religion at Fisk University. He accomplished many things while at Fisk University, most notable was reorganizing the Fisk Union Church into a Congregational Church structure.

Biographical Sketch continued

1946	Received an honorary Doctor of Divinity from the Chicago Theological Seminary. He was the first African American to receive this honor.
1948	Broadcast the Easter Sermon over NBC at Radio City, New York.
1953-1962	Pastor, Park Manor Congregational Church in Chicago, Illinois.
1959	Commissioned by the United States Air Force to preach on European Air Bases in the Protestant Preaching Mission, in Germany. He was the only African American and Congregational minister in attendance.
1977	Publication of his book Days When Animals Talked: Black American Folktales and How They Came to Be.
1987	Died in Wildwood, New Jersey.

Series A Family Materials

Box 211-5 to This series includes biographical information such as a draft version of an autobiography, diaries, business calendars, financial records, publication promotional materials, speaking schedules, certificates and citations. There are various membership cards, as well as several unpublished biographical narratives.

Series C Financial Records

Box 211-7 These records document the financial transactions of William and Elizabeth Faulkner. A unique element to this series are those early twentieth and nineteenth century items that provide glimpses of genealogical information relating to the Faulkner, Cook and Barlow families.

business transactions in which Dr. Faulkner participated. There is also a
wealth of correspondence from his wife, Elizabeth Abele Faulkner, and
his son, William Faulkner, Jr. The dates range from 1914 to 1981.

Series E Writings by William Faulkner

Box 211-15 This series contains writings by Faulkner pertaining to African American to Box 211-18 folklore and folk tales. Many of these stories are from selected works on animal tales, as well and discussions about the nature and history of the African folklore mechanism in African American culture. There is special emphasis on the life and stories of Simon Brown, a former slave who influenced Faulkner's love for African American folk tales.

Series Description continued

Series F Sermons, Speeches and Services by William Faulkner

Box 211-19 This series contains writings by Faulkner such as sermons, lectures and to Box 211-24 editorials. Many of the topics pertain to spiritual growth and development, racism and segregation. Many of his sermons were products of activities held at Fisk University Chapel and during his Congregational Church pastorates.

Series G Organizational Affiliations

Box 211-25 Files include domestic and international organizations in which William Faulkner held membership. For example, National Conference of Association of College Chaplains, Sigma Pi Phi, and Omega Psi Phi.

Series H Writings by Others

Box 211-26 This series includes information about religious, political and historical events in American history and the world. There are writings by white and Black theologians, politicians, scholars and columnists.

Series I Programs

Box 211-27 Items include programs from colleges and universities in which Faulkner to Box 211-28 had been a presenter or recipient of an honorary award. Also included are numerous church bulletins and religious programs from 1920 to 1980, which cover the dates of his pastorates at several Congregational churches. Of interest are funeral programs and inaugural and installation services for people such as Fisk University President Dr. J.R. Lawson, Ghanaian President Kwame Nkrumah and United States President John F. Kennedy.

Series J Research Files

Box 211-28 Files include newspaper and magazine clippings that Faulkner used to highlight in his sermons and speeches. Many of these items primarily contain religious themes, and historical topics.

Series K Photographs

Box 211-29 Images consist of pictures of Faulkner and his family, as well as sites he to visited a when touring Europe and numerous American locations. Of interest are the numerous portraits of Faulkner that chronicle his life from 1914 to 1960.

Series L Audio Recordings

Box 211-30 This series contains numerous recordings, both audio cassettes and LP to Box 211-33 masters of Dr. Faulkner reading from his published works on African American folklore. There are also recordings of several Faulkner sermons.

Series M Artifacts and Oversize

Box 211-34 This series contains artifacts such as Faulkner's tuxedo and a ministerial to Box 211-40 robe, William Faulkner Jr.'s World War II uniform, and grandson Larry Brown's airline steward's uniform. Also there are speaking engagement advertisement posters, scrapbooks, antique writing utensils, photographic image blocks of Mr. & Mrs. Faulkner, Dr. Faulkner's study Bible and numerous membership pins.
