Scope Note

The papers of Lee Andrew Gill, M.D. (1878-1981), medical doctor, civic, fraternal, and religious lay leader, document the life and times of a Howard University medical school alumnus whose life spanned more than 100 years. The papers date from ca. 1878 to 1981, and document the everyday struggles and triumphs of a much honored black physician during and after the period of segregation in the District of Columbia. Correspondence, writings, photographs, publications, and information on local churches and civic, social, fraternal, and medical groups are featured in the collection which totals two linear feet.

Some of the collection highlights are an 1837 diary of Eliza Armstrong and correspondence from then Vice-President Theodore Roosevelt (1901) and Edith Roosevelt, and Eleanor Roosevelt (1938). (Dr. Gill's mother cooked for the Theodore Roosevelts in the summertime.) Additionally, there is a small notebook filled with painstaking notes detailing Dr. Gill's treatments of his patients and their small payments (1911). Also found are medical school notebooks and examinations, and numerous handwritten talks given at churches and other venues on religious, moral, and medical topics.

Generous in his giving, Dr. Gill donated his medical and engineering skills as well as his money to a wide assortment of organizations. These included black churches, schools and other institutions, including both his alma maters of Hampton Institute and Howard University. Further emphasizing his wide ranging interests, the collection also contains programs, brochures, pamphlets and other written materials. The bulk of the collection was acquired from Dr. Gill's daughter, Mrs. Vivian Gill Lee Douglas in 1991. Other materials were added in 1998.

1895	Entered Hampton Normal and Agricultural Institute. Worked his way through as a janitor; played football and was a member of the Hampton Players.
1899	Awarded diploma for the three-year trade course in engineering and steam fitting, with honors.
1902	Married Margery Rencher, who later died in 1931. Three children born from this union: Vivian Frances, Lee Douglas, Lee Rencher, and Sheffield Oliver.
	Accepted position as wireman in the Bureau of Engraving and Printing.
1908	Earned degree from Howard University medical school.
1946	Retired from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing after 44 years in the electrical department.
1956	Completed a postgraduate course at the George Washington medical school at age 78.
1976	Retired from medical practice.
1981	Died at age 103 of congestive heart failure.
