do certify that we have known Henry
Turner a free person of ^{color} with yellow complexion
about five feet, eight inches in height and
expressive features, and quietly spoken for
many years, and he has always conducted
himself as an honest, sober & peaceable
man - both civilly & religiously - He has lived
in the district of Oconee from a Boy
we therefore recommend him, as fully
entitled to the confidence and regard
of all good citizens, whenever he may
sojourne -
