Scope Note

The Oliver Otis Howard Collection measures approximately six linear feet inclusive of individually framed and wrapped items.

The collection contains letters from Oliver O. Howard to his mother, written while he was a cadet at West Point between the years 1850-1854, and as late as 1857; as well as correspondence with other members of his family and friends up to 1906.

There are articles, speeches, manuscripts, diaries, memorabilia, programs, testimonials, poetry, lyrics, photographs artifacts, newspapers and newspaper clippings. The newspaper clippings document many of General Howard's military feats, and provide substantial biographic information. There is also other information an General Howard's battles with the Indians, specifically with Chief Joseph, leader of the Nez Perce Indians of Idaho.
