Scope Note

The papers of William Johnson, Jr., a well known Baltimore caterer, and those of his daughters, Elizabeth Catherine Johnson and Mary Johnson (Spellman), span the period from 1890 to 1977. Johnson and his daughters were all graduates of Howard University. Elizabeth Johnson worked for the Probation Department of the Circuit Courts of Baltimore; Mary Johnson Spellman was a former assistant Dean of Women at Morgan State College.

The collection was received in two installments. Miss Elizabeth Johnson, the last remaining family member, donated some photographs, certificates, and diplomas during the first half of 1982. Other materials were acquired in September of that year.

The bulk of the collection contains photographs, some especially important to Howard University history. Included are images of Johnson's classmates and faculty from classes as early as 1890 and 1891. George Cook, the principal of the Howard University Normal Department is depicted in these. Johnson the teacher is also shown with his students from Unionville School in Talbot County, MD in 1895. Also of interest are tintypes ca. 1890; photographs by William A. Warfield, Superintendent of Howard University's Freedmen's Hospital; and snapshots by Elizabeth Johnson of classmates and staff of the Bishop Tuttle School located on the campus of St. Augustine College, and, later, many others taken while she was a Howard University student.

Other collection highlights are the highly decorative Howard University and Spencerian Business College (Washington, DC) commencement invitations and programs dating from 1890 - 1892, and addresses by Howard University presidents William W. Patton (1880) and Mordecai W. Johnson (1926).

Elizabeth Johnson also contributed many Howard University memorabilia--programs of many campus events, invitations, schedules and newsclippings.

1869	William Johnson, Jr., born to William and Sarah (Gibson) Johnson, former slaves, on the Wye Plantation in Talbot County, MD.
ca. 1879	Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Johnson, uncle and aunt of William Johnson, Jr. established catering business. Also purchased 939 Eutaw St. in Baltimore at that same time; transferred to Johnson's parents in 1897.
1890	William Johnson, Jr. completed the Howard University Normal Department three- year course.
1891	Completed H.U. Normal Department four-year course.
1892	Graduated from the Spencerian Business College in Washington, DC.
1897	Eutaw Street property transferred to Johnson's parents.
1894	Received teaching certificate and applied for position in Unionville, Talbot County in MD.
1898	Took over uncle's catering business.
1899	Resigned teaching position.
1902	Married Mary Catherine Mitchell who died in 1909.
1918	Gave up catering business.
1923	Employed as Talbot County Club stewart.
1954	Died of heart ailment at age 84; interred at Arbutus Memorial Park, Baltimore, MD
