INFORMATION CONCERNING

1969 BACCALAUREATE AND COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES

TIME AND PLACE

Baccalaureate Exercises will be held on Sunday, June 1, Commencement Exercises, on Friday, June 6; both beginning at 5:30 P.M.

In the event of fair weather, the exercises will be held on the grounds of the upper quadrangle, in front of Douglass Hall; in the event of rain, in the main gymnasium of the Physical Education for Men Building, Sixth and Girard Streets, Northwest.

ATTENDANCE

All candidates for degrees are required to participate in the academic procession at both the Baccalaureate and Commencement Exercises. Under special circumstances, a candidate may be excused from either or both exercises, if the Dean of the school or college concerned indicates approval in a letter to the Secretary of the University.

Faculty members are expected to participate in the academic procession at the Commencement Exercises, attired in appropriate

academic costumes. Information regarding costumes may be obtained from the Deans of the respective schools and colleges or from the Office of the Secretary of the University.

PROCUREMENT OF COSTUMES

Candidates for degrees who meet all requirements for graduation by May 23 will obtain academic costumes at the University Bookstore, ground floor, Law School Building, on Tuesday, May 27, Wednesday, May 28, and Thursday, May 29, from 9:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M., and on Sunday, June 1, from 10:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M.

Faculty members and administrative officers may reserve academic costumes through the Tudor College Shop, by calling NOrth 7-1212. An individual's costume shall be that prescribed by the institution which conferred the last degree received by him.

ACADEMIC COSTUME REGULATIONS

The official costume consists of cap, gown, hood, and black shoes.

The cap is an essential part of the academic costume and is to be retained on the head throughout the academic exercises, except during prayer and the singing of the Alma Mater. In particular, the cap is not to be removed at any point in the conferring of the degree.

At the Baccalaureate Exercises, no candidate will wear the hood designating the degree which will be conferred upon him the following Friday. However, a candidate possessing a degree may wear the hood designating that degree.

RECEIVING DEGREES (GRADUATES):

1. At the direction of the Dean of the college or school, the candidates rise, face the rostrum, and remain standing at attention.
 2. The Dean presents the class to the President of the University.
 3. The President confers the degree.
 4. The person at the graduate's immediate left invests him with the hood; then all graduates face forward, remain standing at attention, and await the signal of the Dean before sitting.

RETURNING COSTUMES AND SECURING DIPLOMAS

All graduates' caps, gowns, and hoods must be returned to the practice gymnasium on the ground floor of the Physical Education for Men Building, immediately after the Commencement Exercises. On presentation of receipts for costumes, diplomas may be obtained in the same area. Thereafter, beginning on Monday, June 9, diplomas may be obtained in the Office of the Secretary, Room 440, Administration Building.

ASSEMBLY OF DEGREE CANDIDATES

For both Baccalaureate and Commencement, degree candidates will come to the practice gymnasium on the ground floor of the Physical Education for Men Building not later than 4:15 P.M., regardless of weather conditions. Individual lockers for wraps, and rest rooms, will be available.

The procession will form not later than 4:45 P.M. Under the direction of class presidents, who will serve as assistant marshals, candidates will form in columns of twos, behind the markers designating their respective colleges. At the signal from the University Marshal, the candidates will march to their seats at either the main gymnasium or the upper quadrangle, depending upon the weather conditions.

On reaching the seats reserved for the candidates they will remain standing, facing the rostrum, until the President of the University acknowledges the salute of the University Marshal: then all candidates will sit simultaneously.

ASSEMBLY OF FACULTY MEMBERS, DEANS, AND ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS

These members of the University staff will not participate in the academic procession at the Baccalaureate ceremonies.

In the event of fair weather for the Commencement Exercises, Faculty members, Deans, and designated administrative personnel will come, by 4:30 P.M., to the lounge of Cramton Auditorium, Sixth and Fairmont Streets, Northwest. In the event of inclement weather, they will come to the south portion of the practice

gymnasium on the ground floor of the Physical Education for Men Building. Ordered costumes, facilities for checking wraps, and rest rooms will be available. The line will form not later than 4:45 P.M.

ADMISSION OF GUESTS

For the Baccalaureate outdoor location, guest seating will be available on the first-come, first-served basis.

For the Commencement outdoor location, guest tickets for reserve seats (held until 5:15 P.M.) will be issued as follows: to each degree candidate, four; to each member of the University staff listed in the personnel directory, two; to alumni, as called for at the Office of Alumni Affairs, Room 432, Administration Building, or at the alumni hospitality booth on the upper quadrangle. Other seats will be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

For the BACCALAUREATE indoor location, guest tickets will be issued to degree candidates only, as follows: one ticket providing admission to the Physical Education for Men Building, and one ticket to Cramton Auditorium, the latter being equipped to present the program by closed-circuit television.

REHEARSAL

A rehearsal of the procedures involved in receiving degrees will be held in front of Douglass Hall on Friday, May 29, at 10:30 A.M. All degree candidates and all Marshals of the divisions of the University will attend. (In the event of rain, the instruction will be given in Room 116, Douglass Hall.)

GENERAL

PRINTED INVITATIONS for Commencement are furnished by the University only.

Definitive information concerning a candidate's qualification for graduation is ordinarily not available until approximately one week before Commencement Day. For the convenience of candidates, academic regalia is issued earlier. Likewise, for obvious reasons, invitations are issued well in advance of Commencement Day. However, the issuance of either academic regalia or invitations to a given candidate does not guarantee that such candidate will be certified for graduation by the school or college concerned.

INCLEMENT WEATHER ARRANGEMENTS

In the event of rain on Baccalaureate or Commencement Day, the exercises will be held in the main gymnasium of the Physical Education for Men Building, Sixth and Girard Streets, N.W. Degree candidates will assemble in the north portion of the practice gymnasium, which is on the west side of the ground floor. Faculty and administrative staff members will assemble in the south portion of the same room; and their ordered costumes will be available on the same floor. Also in that area will be individual lockers for the checking of wraps by graduates and faculty members; and rest rooms will be available.

For BACCALAUREATE, candidates will receive three tickets — two providing admission to the Physical Education for Men Building; and the third, to Cramton Auditorium, Sixth and Fairmont Streets, N.W.; the latter being equipped to present the program by closed-circuit television.

For COMMENCEMENT, candidates will receive two tickets—one to the Physical Education for Men Building; and the other to Cramton Auditorium.

Honorary Degrees

DOCTOR OF EDUCATION

ELIZABETH DUNCAN KOONTZ

Elizabeth Duncan Koontz, director of the Women's Bureau of the U.S. Department of Labor, is a native of Salisbury, North Carolina. A graduate of Price High School in that city, she received the Bachelor of Arts degree in English and elementary education from Livingstone College in 1938 and the Master of Arts in elementary education from Atlanta University in 1941, and later studied at Columbia University, Indiana University, and North Carolina College.

Mrs. Koontz began her teaching career in 1938 in Dunn, North Carolina and subsequently taught in Landis and Winston-Salem, North Carolina. She returned to Price High School in 1945 as a special education teacher of slow-learners and disadvantaged children and held that position until she became president of the National Education Association last July. President Nixon appointed her to head the Department of Labor Women's Bureau, which administers programs dealing with women in industry, last February.

Among Mrs. Koontz's national, professional and civic activities are the following: U.S. delegate to the United Nation's Commission on the Status of Women; former president, vice president, and secretary of the NEA Asso-

ciation of Classroom Teachers; member of the NEA Council for Exceptional Children, the Education Committee of the National Urban League, and the editorial boards of Education U.S.A. and Education Digest. A former member of President Johnson's Advisory Council on Education of Disadvantaged Children, she represented the NEA at conferences in West Berlin in 1962 and Seoul, Korea in 1964. Also she was a member of the American Delegation to the Fourth Dartmouth Conference in 1964 in the Soviet Union.

Mrs. Koontz has been president of the Salisbury Unit of the North Carolina Teachers Association, a member of the executive board and former president of the North Carolina Association of Classroom Teachers, and a former member of the Governor's Commission on the Status of Women in North Carolina. She received an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree and a Distinguished Alumni Award from Livingstone College. Last year the Salisbury Civitan Club honored her with a Civitan Distinguished Teacher Award. She is married to Harry L. Koontz, a mathematics teacher and athletic director of Rowan County (North Carolina) Schools.

DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS

JULIUS ALBERT THOMAS

Julius Albert Thomas, former director of industrial relations with the National Urban League, was born in Greensboro, North Carolina. He attended public schools in that city and in Charleston, West Virginia, graduated in 1918 with honors from Howard University, where he received the Bachelor of Arts degree, and later did graduate work at Columbia University.

Mr. Thomas joined the staff of the National Urban League in 1924 as executive director of the Atlanta, Georgia branch, and subsequently held similar posts with branches in Jacksonville, Florida and Louisville, Kentucky. He was appointed director of industrial relations for the League in 1943 and continued in that post until his retirement in 1961. For another year he remained with the League as a consultant. His present occupation is that of industrial relations consultant to several well known corporations including the Radio Corporation of America, Western Electric Company, Mobil Oil Company, the Ford Foundation, Bristol Myers Company, Allied Chemical Company, St. Regis Paper Company, P. Lorillard Company, American Bosch Corporation and Eastman Kodak Company.

While serving with the national Urban League, Mr. Thomas initiated campus career conferences at Howard, Tennessee A. and L., Hampton, Tuskegee, Virginia State, Maryland State, Delaware State and other predominantly Negro institutions of higher learning. He developed similar programs to reach high school students through the

League's local branches. It is estimated that more than 300,000 college and high school students have been reached through these conferences.

In 1949 when major corporations first sought to recruit Negro talent, it was Mr. Thomas who initiated campus recruitment at Howard. This program has expanded to the point where most predominately Negro institutions are included in the annual recruitment visits of the nation's largest companies.

A frequent contributor to magazines and newspapers and a popular lecturer on social and economic problems, Mr. Thomas holds honorary degrees from the University of Maryland, Delaware State College, and Virginia State College. He has also been honored by the Selective Service System, the National Technical Association, the *Chicago Defender*, and the City of New York. In 1954 Howard University conferred upon him an Alumni Achievement Award for "distinguished post-graduate achievement," and in 1960 he was honored by the City of New York for "distinguished public service."

Presently, Mr. Thomas is a member of the New York State Apprenticeship Council and of the advisory committee of the New York State Youth Employment Services. Also he is vice president of College Placement Services, a program designed to implement the employment of Negro college graduates. He and his wife, the former Constance L. Gillespie, live in New York City.

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE
WILLIAM BERTALAN WALSH

William B. Walsh, president and medical director of Project Hope (Health Opportunity for People Everywhere), is a native of New York City. After graduating from Brooklyn Preparatory School, he received the Bachelor of Science degree in 1940 from St. John's University and the Doctor of Medicine degree in 1943 from Georgetown University School of Medicine.


During World War II, Dr. Walsh served as a medical officer aboard a destroyer in the Pacific. While performing his duties he saw that friendship of people was more easily gained by medical help than anything else attempted. In 1958, when he was co-chairman of the Committee on Medicine and Health Professions of the People-to-People Program, he suggested that a Navy hospital ship, no longer being used, be converted into the world's first peacetime hospital ship. President Eisenhower agreed, and Dr. Walsh founded the private, non-profit People-to-People Health Foundation, Inc., to raise funds. This foundation became the parent organization of Project Hope.

In 1960 the U.S.S. Consolation was chartered to the Foundation and rechristened the S.S. Hope. Since her

maiden voyage that year, the S.S. Hope has helped to raise health standards for millions of people on four continents.

Dr. Walsh is the author of two books: *A Ship Called Hope*, an account of the ship's maiden voyage to Asia, and *Yanqui, Come Back!*, the story of Hope in Peru. He is the recipient of numerous national and international awards, in addition to being the holder of honorary degrees from St. John's University, the University of Cartagena (Columbia), Beaver College, and Georgetown University. In 1965 President Johnson appointed him chairman of Project Vietnam, a pilot program which sent volunteer American physicians to help with the medical needs of South Vietnamese civilians. He is also a member of several professional organizations and has served on various national medically orientated committees.

Formerly a heart specialist in private practice and an assistant professor of internal medicine at Georgetown, Dr. Walsh now devotes his full time to Project Hope. He and his wife, Helen, have three sons; William Jr., John, and Thomas.
