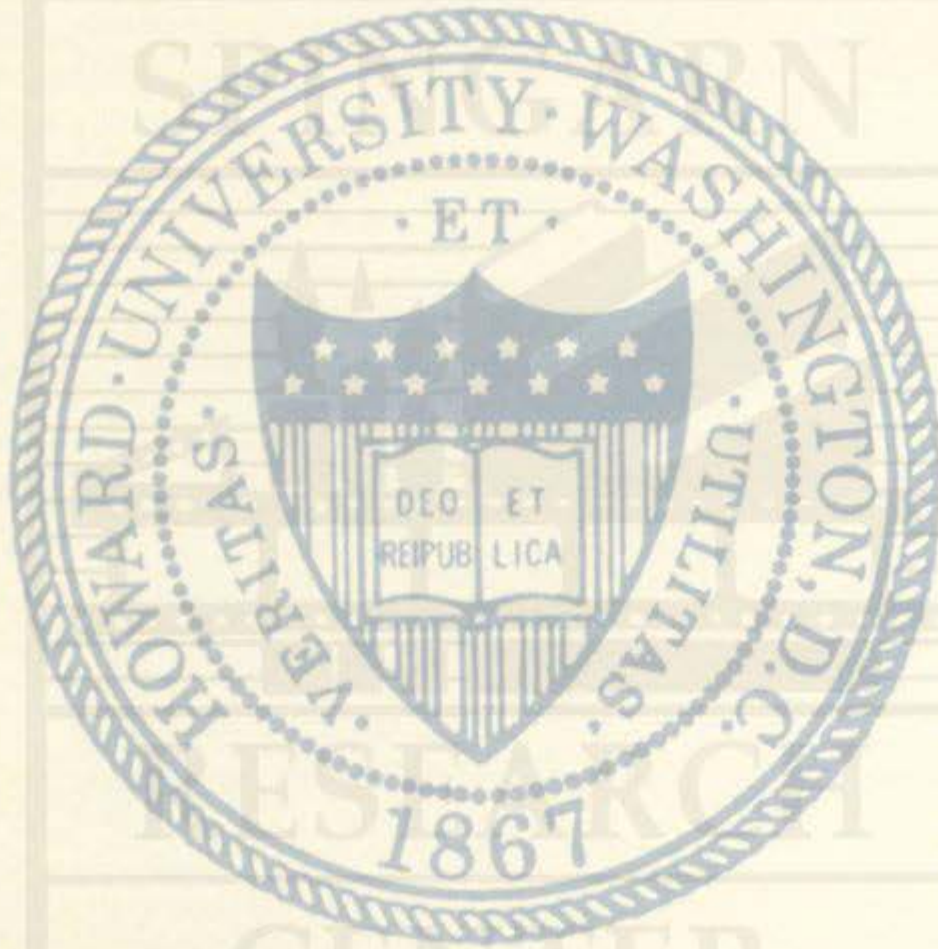

PEARL BAILEY BELLSON

The Candidate Will Be Presented By Dr. William K. Collins
Member, Board of Trustees

Pearl Bailey Bellson was born in Newport News, Virginia, the youngest of four children. Her father was a preacher and her mother, a housewife. She is affectionately and popularly known simply as "Pearl."

Her early ambition was to be a school teacher; however, her success in an amateur contest, after the family moved to Philadelphia, changed that decision and she embarked on a show business career beginning in the coal region of Pennsylvania and progressing to some of the biggest nightclubs in New York.

Her legitimate stage debut was in "St. Louis Woman" (1946), winning the Donaldson Award as best newcomer on Broadway. Subsequent shows were "Bless You All" (1950), "Arms and the Girl" (1950) and "House of Flowers" (1954). Her latest show was "Hello Dolly" (1967), the longest running Broadway company of "Dolly," having run 716 performances. For her performance in "Dolly," Pearl won a special Tony Award.

Films have also been a part of Pearl's life: "Variety Girl" (1947);

"Isn't It Romantic" (1948); "Carmen Jones" (1954); "That Certain Feeling" (1956); "St. Louis Blues" (1958); "Porgy and Bess" (1959); "All The Fine Young Cannibals" (1960); "Norman, Is That You?" (1976); and "The Landlord" (1970).

Pearl has written five successful and popular books: *The Raw Pearl* (1968), *Talking To Myself* (1971); *Pearl's Kitchen* (1973); *Duey's Tale* (1975); and the last one which she calls her gift of love, *Hurry Up, America, and Spit*.

In addition to numerous appearances in top nightclubs, both in the United States and abroad, Pearl starred in the ABC-TV series, *The Pearl Bailey Show* during the 1970-71 season. She has also entertained at the White House, more often than any other performer except perhaps Bob Hope. She has received numerous awards and honors and has served as Special Advisor to the United States Mission to the United Nations, an appointment by the President of the United States.

COY GLENWOOD EKLUND

Coy Glenwood Eklund was born in Brookston, Minnesota on September 6, 1915. He was educated at the University of Michigan and Michigan State University, receiving from the latter school the Bachelor of Science degree in 1939.

He began his insurance career with The Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States in 1938. From 1942 to 1946 he served in the United States Army and advanced to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel on the staff of General George S. Patton. He was awarded five Battle Stars and was decorated with the Croix de Guerre by General Charles de Gaulle, then President of France.

After the war, Mr. Eklund rejoined The Equitable and in 1947 was appointed Agency Manager in Detroit. In 1959, he was elected Vice President, Agency Vice President in 1961 and Senior Vice President in 1964. He was named to the Board of Directors in 1965,

was elected Executive Vice President in 1969, President in 1973 and Chief Executive Officer on April 1, 1975.

He received the Distinguished Alumnus Award from Michigan State University in 1965 and was awarded honorary doctorates from St. Augustine's College, Northern Michigan University and the Michigan State University.

He is a director of both the Salk Institute of Biological Studies and Grand Central Art Galleries. He is also a member of the President's Commission on Executive Exchange and Chairman of the President's Council for International Youth Exchange. He serves on the Boards of Americans for Indian Opportunity, the Wonder Woman Foundation, the American Council for Capital Formation and the National Urban League, of which he is Chairman.

LUTHER HILTON FOSTER

Luther Hilton Foster was born in Lawrenceville, Virginia on March 21, 1913. He received Bachelor of Science degrees from Virginia State College in 1932 and Hampton Institute in 1934. He was awarded the Masters degree in Business Administration from Harvard University in 1936, the Master of Arts degree from the University of Chicago in 1941, and the Doctor of Philosophy degree from the University of Chicago in 1951.

He began his employment career as Budget Officer at Howard University in 1936. In 1941 he became Business Manager at Tuskegee Institute, a position he held until he was named president of that institution in 1953, serving in that capacity until retirement in 1981. He is presently Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of the Robert R. Moton Memorial Institute.

He holds directorships in an impressive number of companies and is either a trustee or member of a diverse array of organizations, including: the United Negro College Fund; the March of Dimes/Birth Defects Foundation; Sears, Roebuck and Company;

the Georgia Warm Springs Foundation; the Center for Creative Leadership; the Overseas Development Council; and the Harvard Business School Visiting Committee.

He has served as an influential policy maker with some of America's most prestigious and powerful organizations, private and governmental. He has served on the President's Task Force on Priorities in Higher Education (1969-70); the President's General Advisory Committee on Foreign Assistance Programs (1965-68); and the President's Advisory Commission on International Educational and Cultural Exchange (1962-68). He is also a member of the United States Air Force Academy Advisory Council and the Department of Education's National Advisory Committee on Black Higher Education and Black Colleges and Universities.

His extensive and numerous list of awards and honors includes nine honorary doctorate degrees from institutions recognizing his great contributions to higher education and to humanity.

WILLIAM HENRY GREENE

William Henry Greene was born in Jefferson County, Alabama on July 26, 1900. He received his primary and secondary education in Oklahoma. His college and professional education was gained from Walden College, Atlanta University, Fisk University and Howard University. Dr. Greene received the B.S. degree in 1920 and the M.D. degree in 1924 from Howard University, after which he served on the staff of Freedman's Hospital for 14 years.

His long and devoted affiliation with Howard University is exhibited in part by his memberships in University organizations. He holds Life Memberships in the President's Club and the General Alumni Association, is a member of the Howard Medical Alumni Association, and has served as Vice President and President of the Howard University Alumni Federation.

In 1969 he became a member of the University's Board of Trustees and in 1976 received the Alumni Award for Distinguished Achievement in University and Community Service. He ranks among the top contributors, giving generously of his time and

money to the University, a considerable amount of his financial support going toward scholarships and revolving student loan funds.

Dr. Greene is widely traveled and has visited some 51 foreign countries and all 50 states of the United States. Throughout his 47 years of practicing medicine and the more than 65 years of living in the District of Columbia, he has been an enthusiastic "organization man" and has served devotedly in civic, social, fraternal, medical, educational and religious groups. This service has also extended to similar organizations throughout the nation. As a member of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Dr. Greene has received virtually every award and held almost every local, regional and national office offered by that organization.

Among the numerous awards and honors he has received are: the "John Milton Lee Achievement Award"; the "Laurel Wreath"; the "Alumni Distinguished Post-Graduate Achievement Award"; and the "Grass Roots Award."

JAMES VAN DER ZEE

The Candidate Will be Presented by Mrs. Beverly B. Kelch

James Van Der Zee, one of the major figures in American photography during the 20th century, is widely noted for his 60-year chronicle of the people and places that composed the Harlem community.

The second of six children, he was born James Augustus Joseph Van Der Zee on June 29, 1886 in a four-bedroom frame house, built by his grandfather in Lenox, Massachusetts.

Mr. Van Der Zee's parents worked in Lenox as maid and butler in the home of ex-President Ulysses S. Grant. The family moved to New York City in 1905, just before the period when Harlem turned Black. Though trained as a musician, he was always fascinated by photography and earned his first camera by answering an advertisement he discovered in a magazine.

In 1915, Mr. Van Der Zee opened his first studio on 135th Street. It was called The Guarantee Photo Studio and was later changed to the GGG Studio, named after his second wife Gaynella.

As a neighborhood photographer, he produced over 200,000 pictures, covering a period of six decades. During his early years, he counted among his celebrity patrons Countee Cullen, Jack Johnson, Marcus Garvey and "Daddy" Grace. Recent portraits, to name a few, include Muhammad Ali, Bill Cosby and Lou Rawls.

With the popularization of home cameras in the 1940's, Van Der Zee's business dwindled. He then supported himself by taking wedding and funeral photographs, making pictures for passports and chauffeurs' licenses, calendar portraits and mail order restorations.

The general public first became aware of Mr. Van Der Zee's works in 1968, when a researcher from the Metropolitan Museum of Art discovered his "gold mine" quite by accident. The museum used his works in its appropriately titled exhibition, "Harlem On My Mind." Shortly thereafter, Mr. Van Der Zee turned down an offer from Time-Life, Inc. for his collection, because of the anticipated formation of an ongoing institute to house his works.

In July of 1969 the institute was incorporated. Mr. Van Der Zee's reputation in the photography field continued to escalate and he was honored by the American Society of Magazine Photographers the same year. A volume of his work was also published in 1973 by Morgan and Morgan Monograph. In 1917, he invented a technique for photographing funeral pictures, a technique which was later published entitled *The Harlem Book of the Dead*, now a recognized classic.

SHIRLEY ST. HILL CHISHOLM

Shirley St. Hill Chisholm, currently Purlington Professor at Mount Holyoke College, has successfully fulfilled numerous roles throughout her career in both the academic and political arena.

She was the senior Democratic woman in the United States House of Representatives; former leading member of the Congressional Black Caucus and the only Black woman to sit on the powerful House Rules Committee.

Born in Brooklyn, New York, on November 30, 1924, Shirley Chisholm spent her early childhood on the island of Barbados, in the West Indies. After graduation from Girls High School in Brooklyn, she earned a Bachelor of Arts degree (cum laude) and a Master of Arts in education, as well as a diploma in administration, from Columbia University. She has been awarded honorary degrees from many prestigious colleges and universities throughout the country.

As a school teacher and director of a day nursery, Mrs. Chisholm became deeply involved in all aspects of day care and education for children. Because of her proficiency and popularity, she entered public service in 1964 and ran successfully for the New York State Assembly on the Democratic ticket.

She was first elected to the 91st Congress in 1968. Her constituency comprised the 12th Congressional District in the borough of Brooklyn. As a freshman member of the Congress, she established herself as an articulate defender of the rights of the oppressed. She

placed an amendment before the House to remove her name from the Agriculture Subcommittee on Forestry and Rural Villages because she knew it had no pertinence to the needs and problems of her district. She prevailed and was then granted a seat on the Veteran's Affairs Committee which had some relevancy to her constituency.

Upon the convening of the 92nd Congress in 1971, Mrs. Chisholm won a spot on the House Education and Labor Committee. She served on that committee for six years before moving to the Rules Committee where she became a ranking member.

In 1972, Mrs. Chisholm made history by seriously campaigning for the Democratic Party's nomination for President of the United States, the first Black woman to seek this high office. Although she was not successful, her name, ideals and commitment became embedded in America's consciousness.

Mrs. Chisholm is the author of two books: *Unbought and Unbossed*, her autobiography; and *The Good Fight*, the story of her 1972 bid for the Presidency. In February 1982, she announced that she would not seek reelection to the Congress. She cited her longstanding intention never to remain in politics throughout her productive and creative life and thus, returned to the academic environment. By writing, teaching, lecturing and traveling around the nation, Mrs. Chisholm hopes to create a new national state of mind that demands peace, prosperity and equality for all Americans.

THE CONFERRING OF DEGREES IN COURSE

The order of presentation of schools and colleges for the conferring of degrees is based on two factors — the year of establishment of the school or college and the distinction between graduate and undergraduate programs. The first eleven schools and colleges, beginning with the College of Liberal Arts and ending with the College of Allied Health Sciences, were established over the years from 1868 to 1974. These eleven schools and colleges provide basically undergraduate programs. The next five schools and colleges, beginning with the School of Divinity and ending with the School of Social Work, were established between the years of 1868 and 1945. These schools and colleges offer professional graduate level programs. The last school listed, the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, was established in 1934 and offers graduate level programs exclusively.

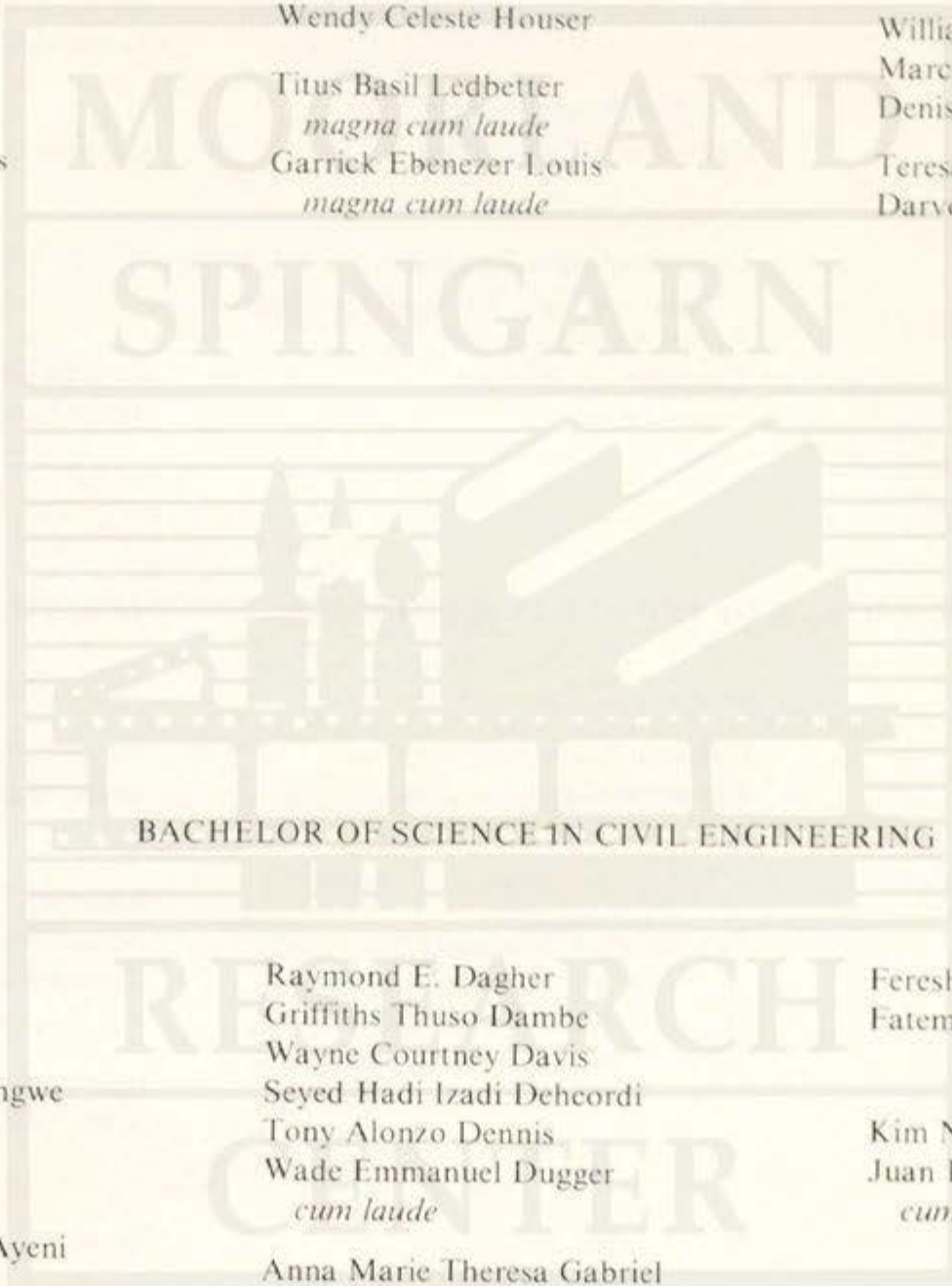

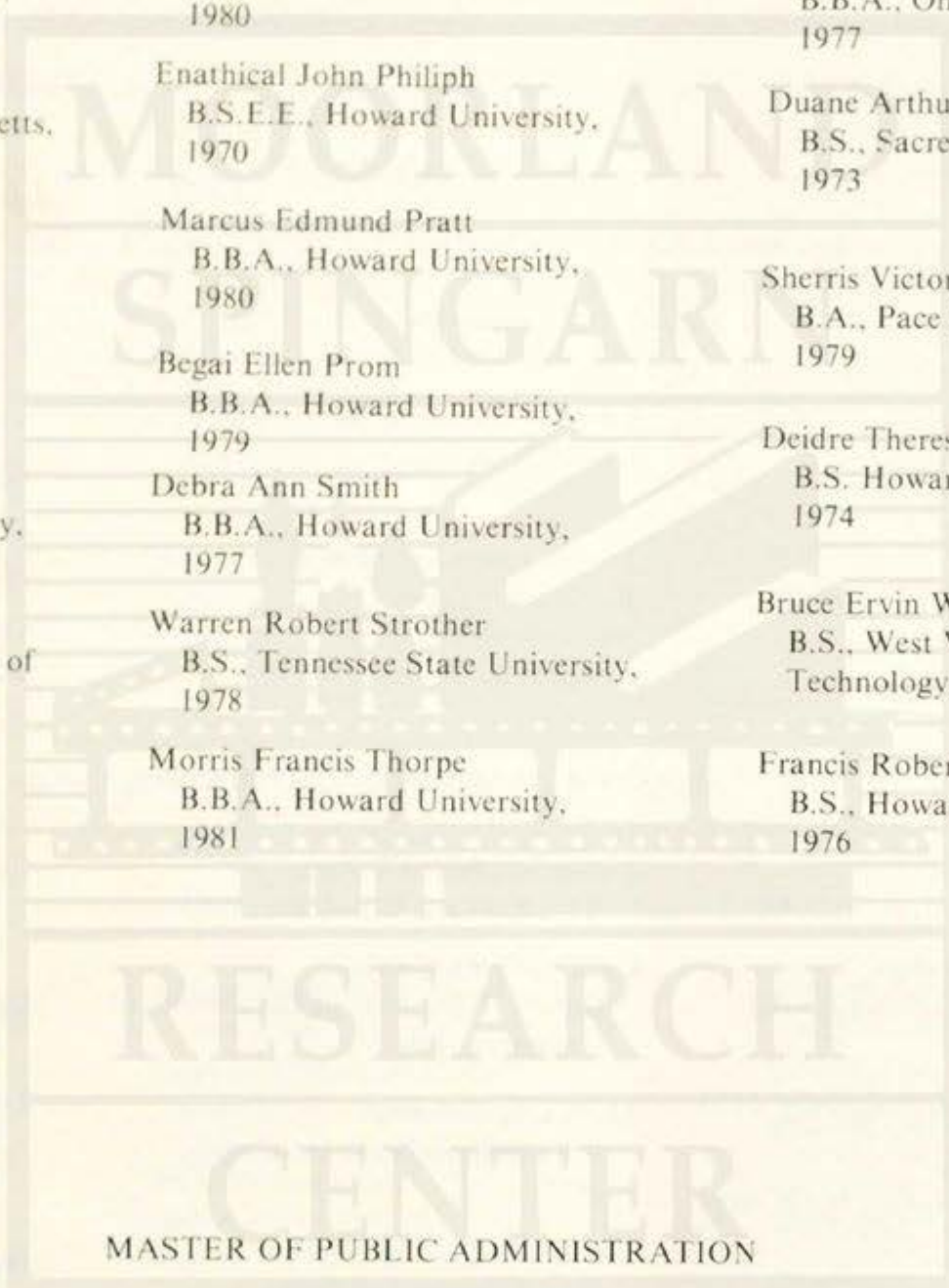

THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The caps, gowns, and hoods worn at college and university functions date back to the Middle Ages. Monks and students used them to keep warm in medieval castles and halls of learning. From these practical origins, they have developed into the accepted garb which symbolizes scholarly achievement.

Baccalaureate gowns have a long pleated front with shirring across the shoulders and back. They are primarily distinguished by flowing sleeves, pointed at the fingertips. These gowns may be worn either open or closed.

The master's degree gown is worn open, and the sleeve is cut so that the forearm comes through a slit just above the elbow.

Gowns for the doctor's degree are also worn open. They carry broad, velvet panels down the front, and three velvet bars on the full, round sleeves. This velvet trimming may be either black or the color distinctive of the degree.

Mortar boards or caps worn with baccalaureate and master's gowns generally have black tassels. The tassel of the doctoral cap is usually made of gold bullion.

Faculty members and guests in today's procession are robed in gowns and hoods which represent the institutions from which they have received degrees.

The hood gives color and real meaning to the academic costume. Its silk lining bears the colors of the institution conferring the degree. The hood is bordered with velvet of a prescribed width and color to indicate the field of learning to which the degree pertains as follows: medicine, green; music, pink; nursing, apricot; pharmacy, olive green; public administration, peacock blue; science, golden yellow; social work, citron; theology, scarlet; architecture, brown; arts, letters, and humanities, white; business, drab; dentistry, lilac; education, light blue; engineering, orange; fine arts, brown; law, purple; philosophy, dark blue.

THE MACE

THE MACE, carried by the University Marshal, Dr. Joseph B. Morris, Chairman, Department of Chemistry, is the ceremonial symbol of the University. Its origin dates back to the Middle Ages. It is used on all occasions of academic ceremony at the University. At today's Commencement, the entry of the Mace heralds the arrival of the academic procession.

THE BATON

THE BATONS carried by the Marshals and Assistant Marshals of each school and college are being used to lead the academic procession of the respective schools and colleges into and out of the place of the ceremony. The batons are made of wood, painted blue, and tied with white ribbons denoting the colors of Howard University.

THE PRESIDENTIAL CHAIN OF OFFICE (The Medallion)

The Presidential Chain of Office, worn by President Cheek, was presented to the University on the occasion of the Centennial Celebration in 1967 by Trustee Herman B. Wells and his mother, Mrs. Granville Wells. The chain symbolizes the current and past holders of the Office of President. The basic material of the chain is sterling silver, plated with hard gold. Both the University Seal and the Centennial Seal are appended to the chain.
