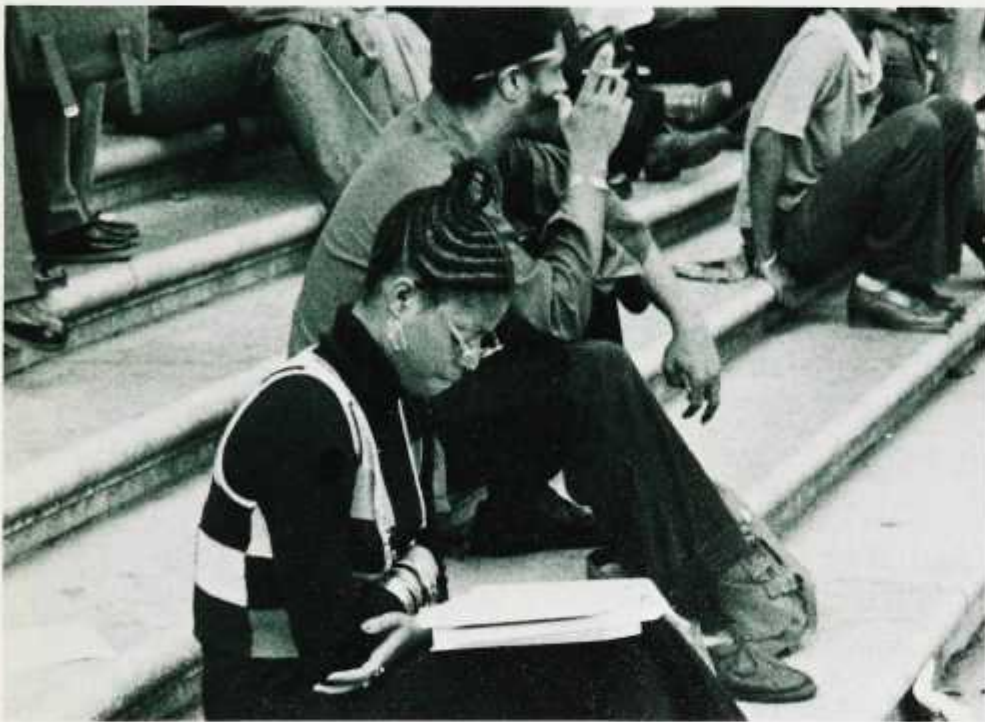
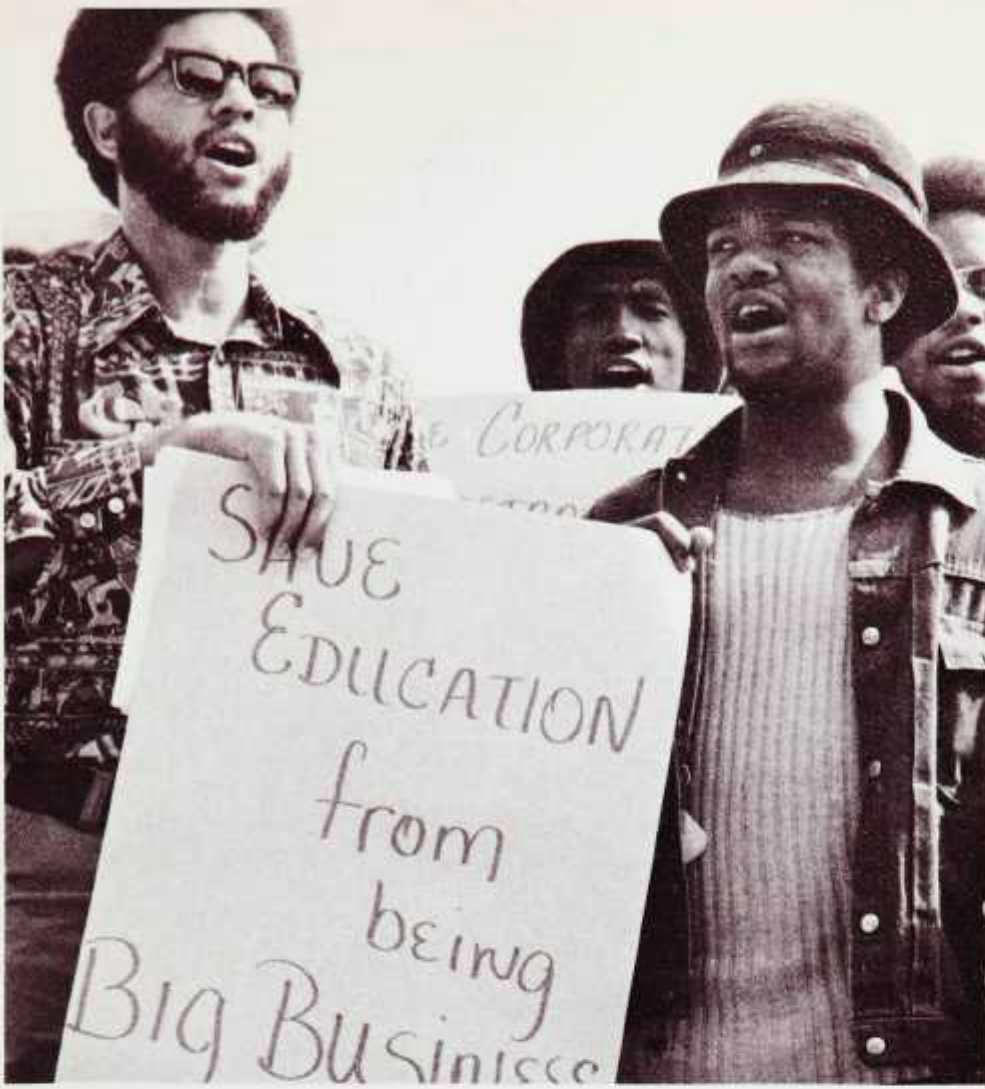


However, the BISON asks, "has any progress been made, have we learned anything, is there more Unity— what is the situation of Black People today?"





Someone most certainly can answer those questions, but after all the rhetoric, the answers seem empty.

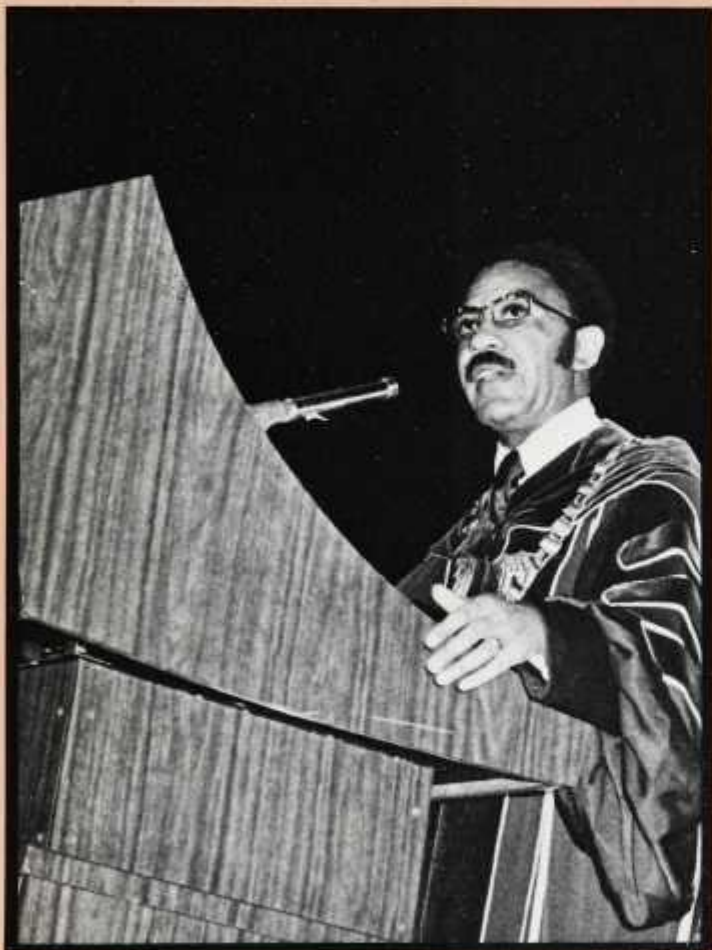

Howard, though traditionally a leader in the Black Struggle, is taking an active role in the current crisis.

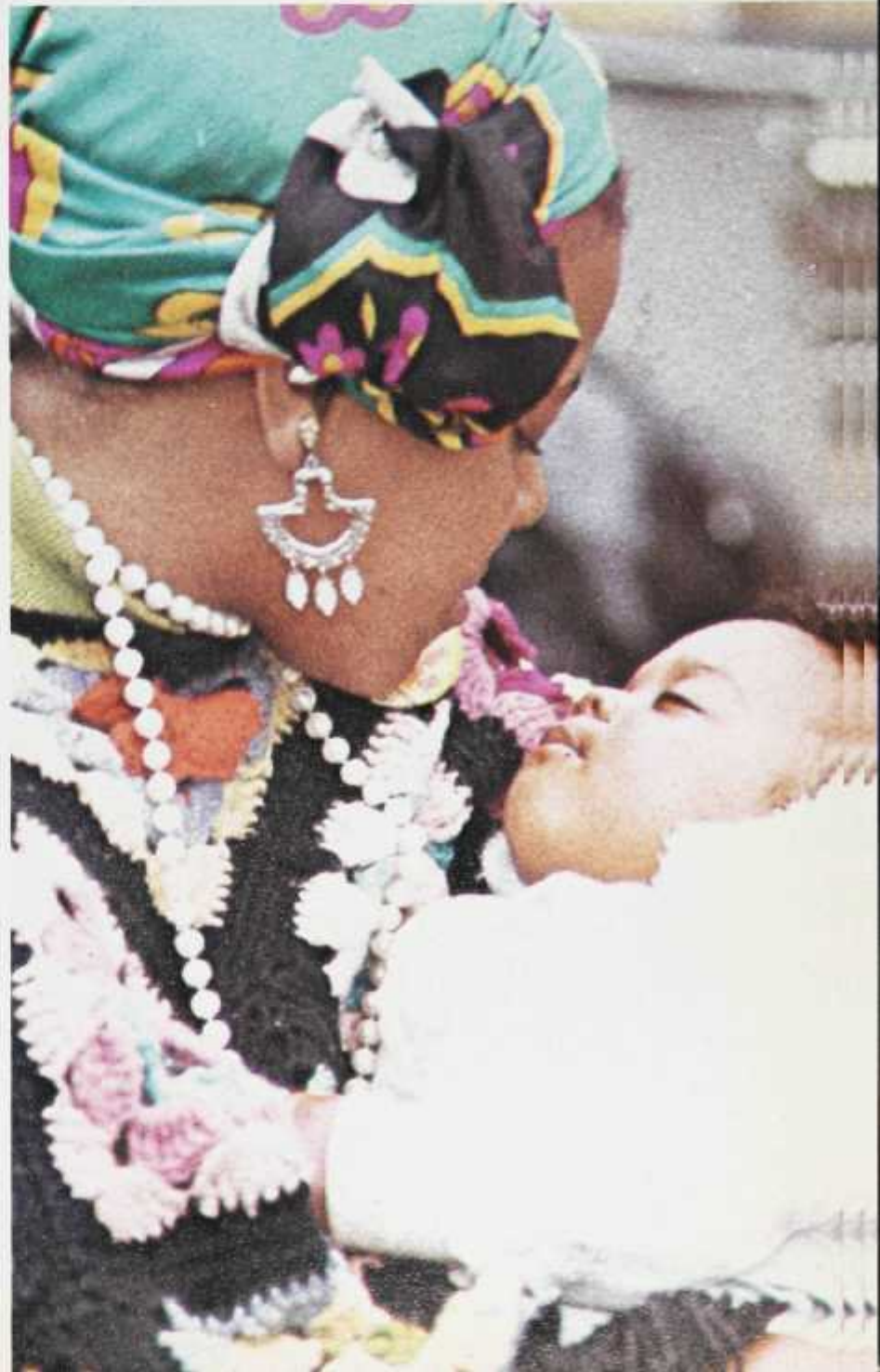




Black schools are being phased out in rapid order—here today, gone tomorrow. The cost of maintaining schools is skyrocketing, and Black schools are the most severely hit.

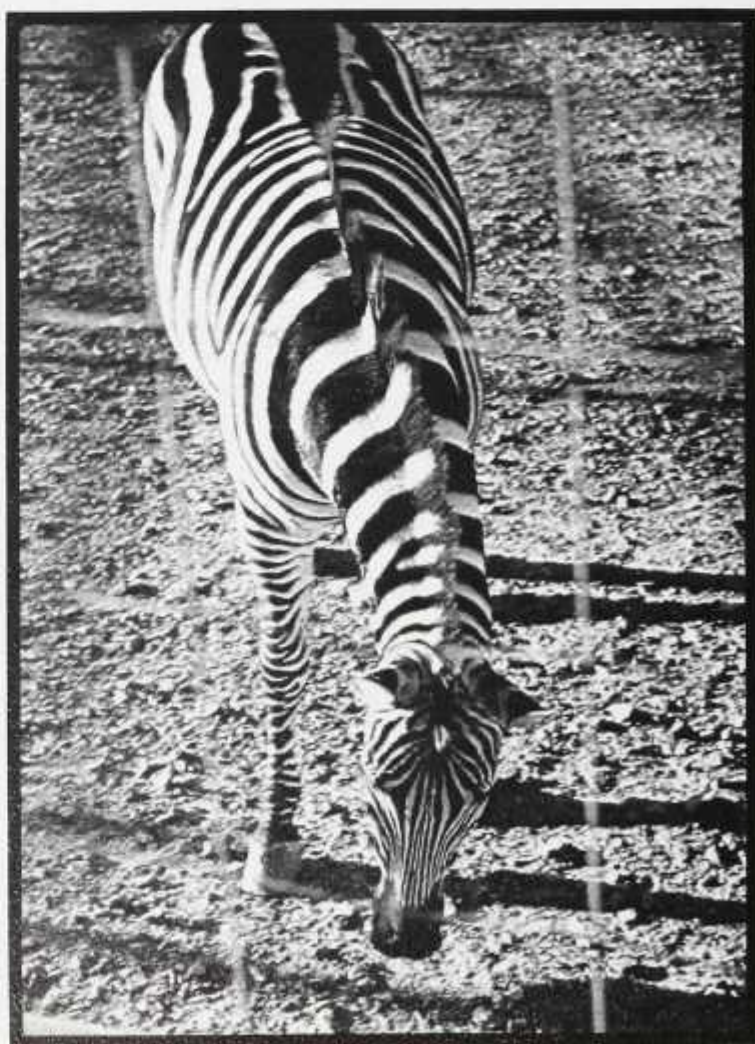
Each of us gets something from Howard—hassles, money, good times—sometimes an education. No matter what, all of it can be used in the Struggle for our Liberation.

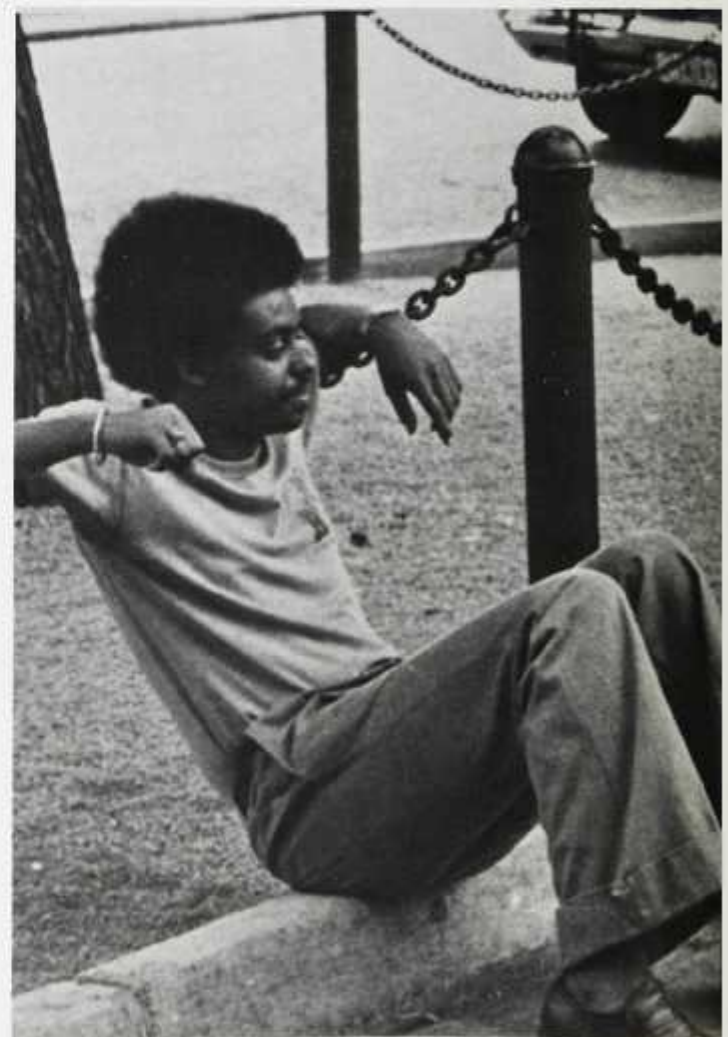


STUDENT LIFE



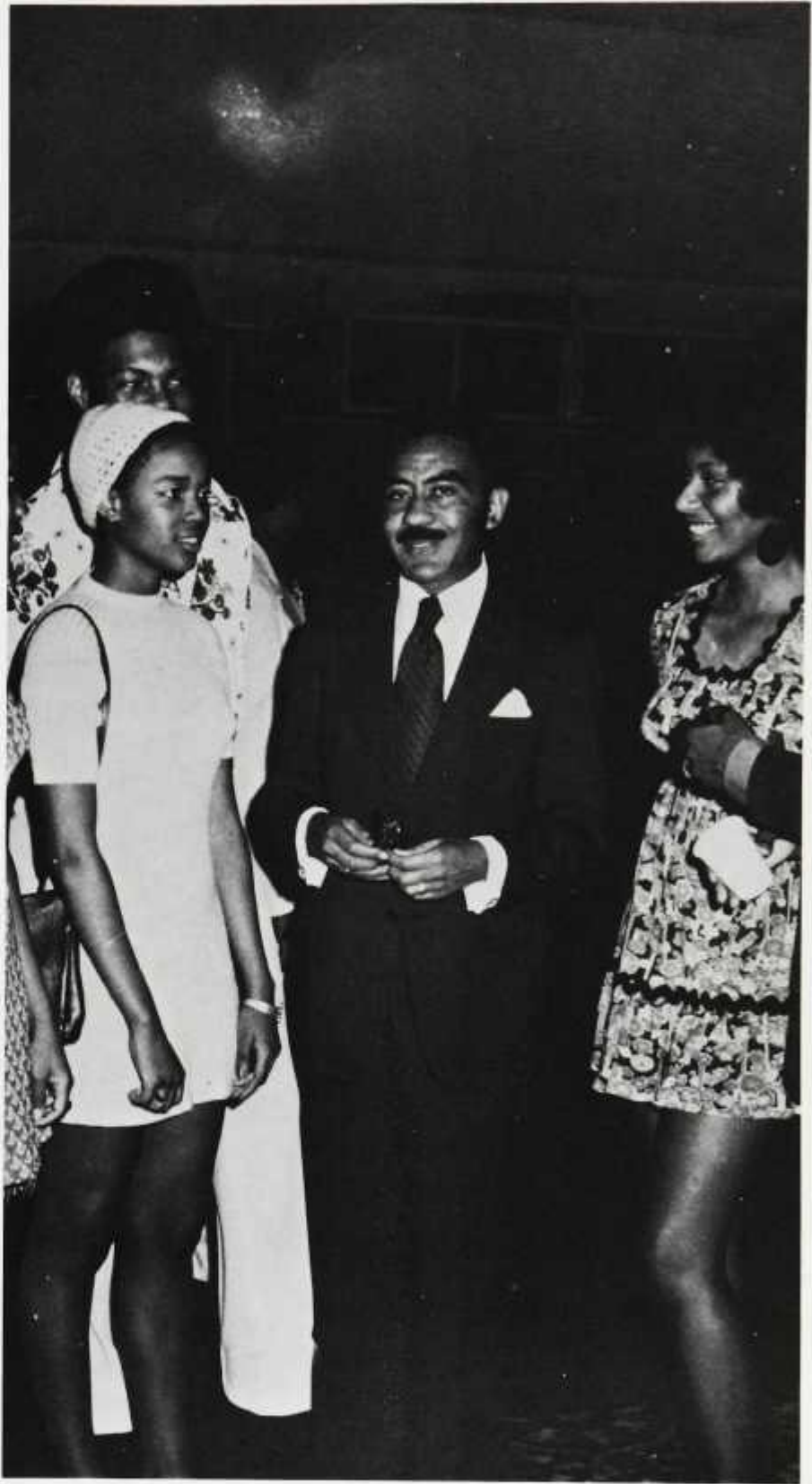
After a busy day of sights and sounds, the tour group stops for refreshments.

Nabdham

The Nabdham Compound, the Homecoming project of volunteer Architecture students, symbolized Architecture's functional role in nation-building. The Compound, made of painted chipboard, chicken wire, polyurethane foam and some strategically placed two-by-fours, was completed in about three weeks. A replica of the muck and straw living quarters of the Nabdham tribe of Northern Ghana, these compounds constitute the structures essential to both tribal and familial survival. The Nabdham project reflected the fact that Architecture students could utilize technology while still remaining on the pragmatic level, the level of Black survival.

Half-time audience in Kennedy Stadium was enthralled by the queen presentation, Howard University Soulsteppers, floats and a cheering crowd.

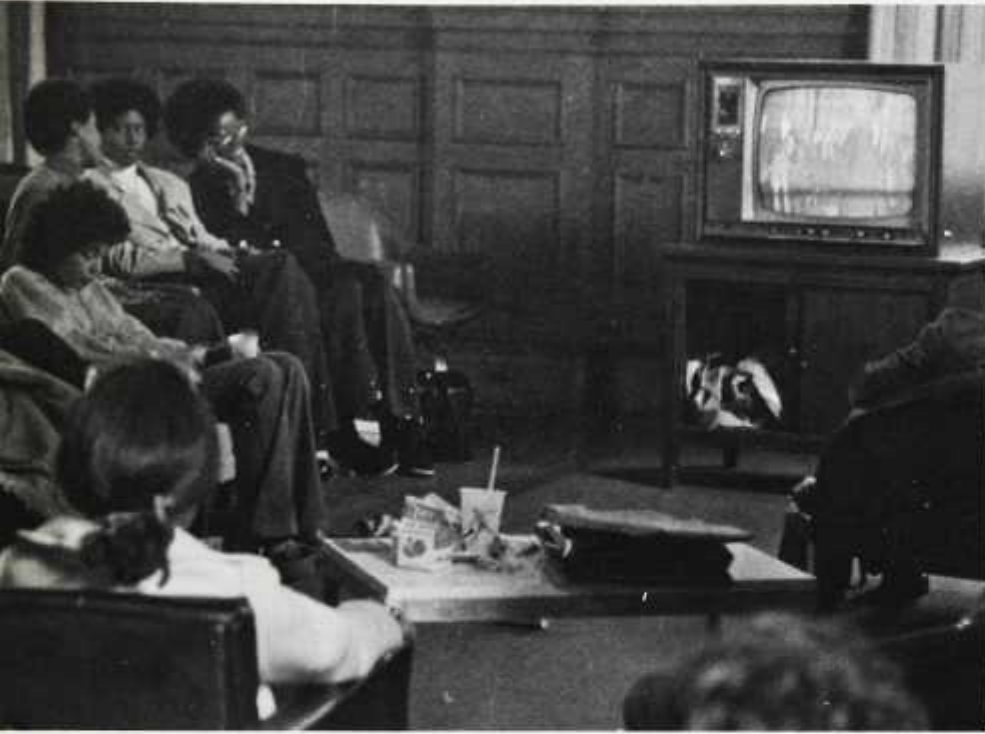

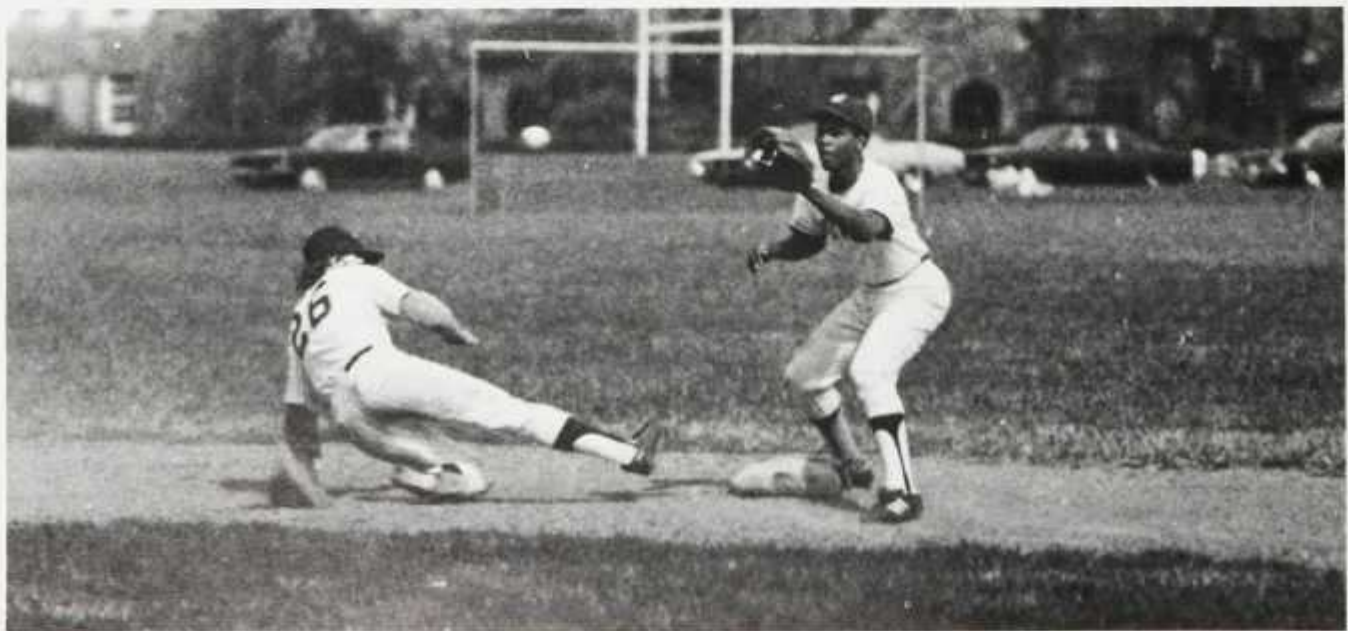


FOOTBALL: Bisons Two school records

University Health Service

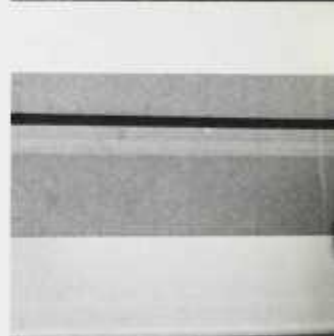
(In Sickness Or In Health)

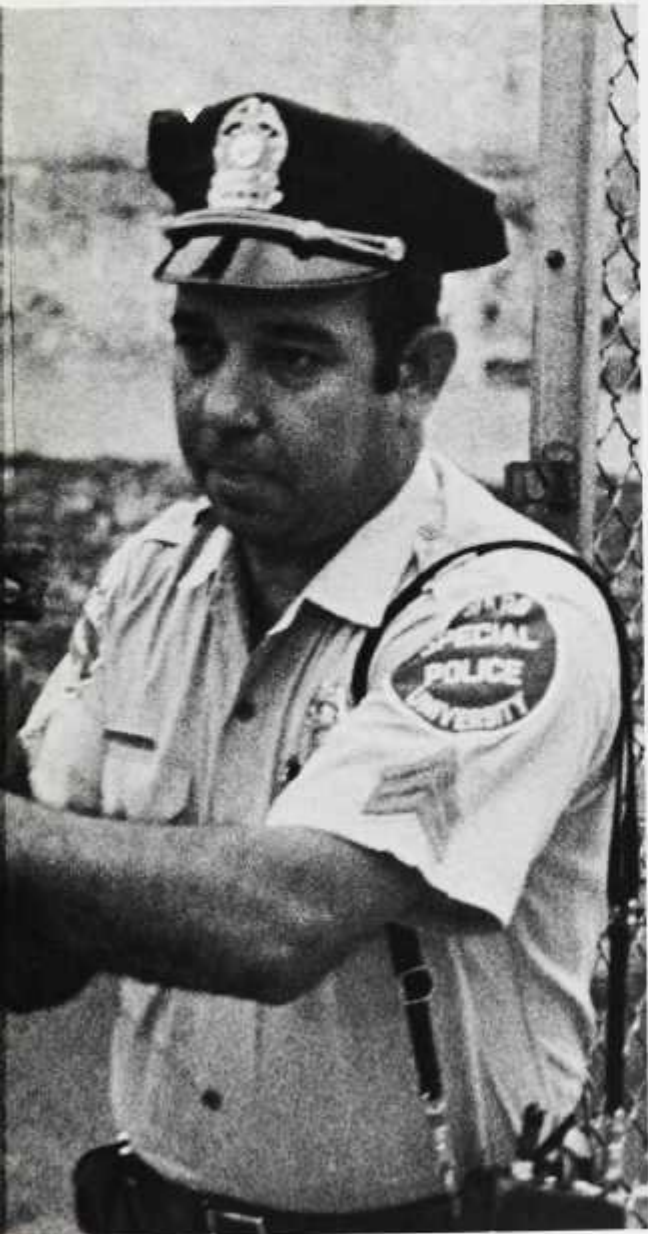

These student food service representatives have been instrumental in serving as a mediator between the student body and the dining service. Among the most recent changes in the dining services have been the inclusion of popular music "while you dine", and carpeting in the main dining hall.

The University has four dining halls, located in Baldwin, Meridian Hill, Cook and Slowe Hall dorms for the convenience of the students.



Food Services



The menu varies from oriental specials to "Soul Food" to a vegetarian diet. The food service also caters dinners and banquets and receptions for the university affairs.

The service also sponsors convenient plans for the students who have budgeting problems. Meals can be bought on the monthly plan with a choice of two or three meals a day; or students can buy coupon books that can be used in all university cafeterias and the snack-bar ("Punch Out"), as well. But, even these plans don't seem pleasing enough for the students who charge that the price of a decent meal is too high to pay at the university cafeterias.



Student Accounts

One of the most undesired tasks of the Howard student is paying his bill. But, every semester it has to be done. The Student Accounts Office eventually handles all student financial problems. It's responsible for savings, withdrawals, securing of loans and crediting scholarships to student accounts.

ADMINISTRATION



One of the most serious problems confronting Howard University today, is the lack of adequate funding. In recent years, the university has made several efforts to help alleviate this problem. One such effort was the establishment of the Office of Development and University Relations. Dr. Roger Estep is directly responsible for the operations of this office.

In attempts to bring about the necessary changes and development, Dr. Estep extends his capabilities to soliciting funds for the university from all available sources. Some of the most attractive sources have been the alumni, foundations, government and trusted friends and faculty.

According to Dr. Estep, Howard's relationship to the community has improved, as have the students' relationships with the university. He feels that students tend to take themselves much more seriously in accordance with their purpose.

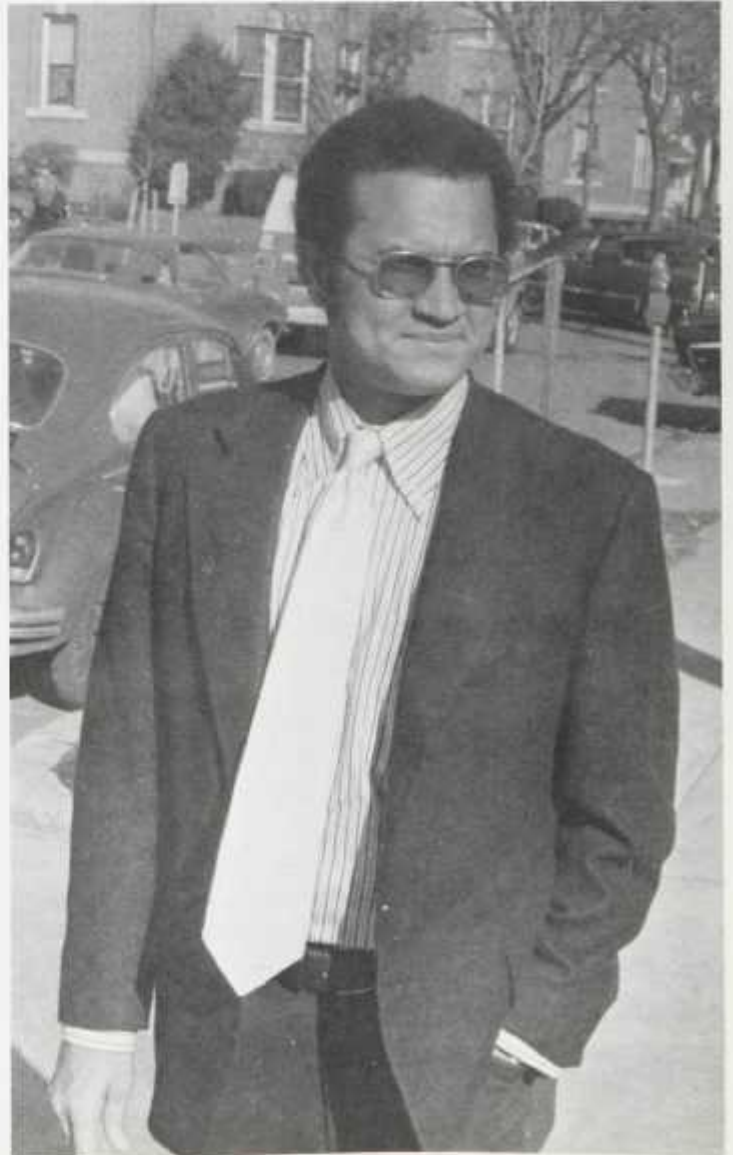

A university cannot operate without money. Staff and faculty have to be paid. Students have to pay tuition. Scholarships and loans have to be allocated. Thus, money is the backbone of any institution of higher learning. At Howard, Dr. Caspa Harris is the man who deals with the money. His office receives and records all monies and incomes from all sources due and belonging to the university, making disbursements by checks for payment of bills, salaries, reimbursements, etc.

Dr. Harris confirms the fact that financial assistance is one of the most serious problems facing Black schools, but urges Black students to contribute to their alma mater as much as possible. He believes that whoever controls the money, controls the school. Since Howard continues to operate in spite of her financial problems, Dr. Harris must truly be keeping a tight string on the money-bag.

A person can receive training in just about all of the fields of health affairs, here at Howard. The colleges of Medicine, Pharmacy, Nursing, Dentistry, and Freedman's Hospital, all offer professional health training to interested students. Dr. Carlton P. Alexis, Vice-President for Health Affairs, sees to it that administrative and educational leadership is provided for the students as well. His major responsibility is to help improve the quality of instruction and the quality and scope of the university's scientific research programs. He feels that there is a great need for more qualified Black people in the field of professional health. He is doing everything he can to help insure such competence in his students.

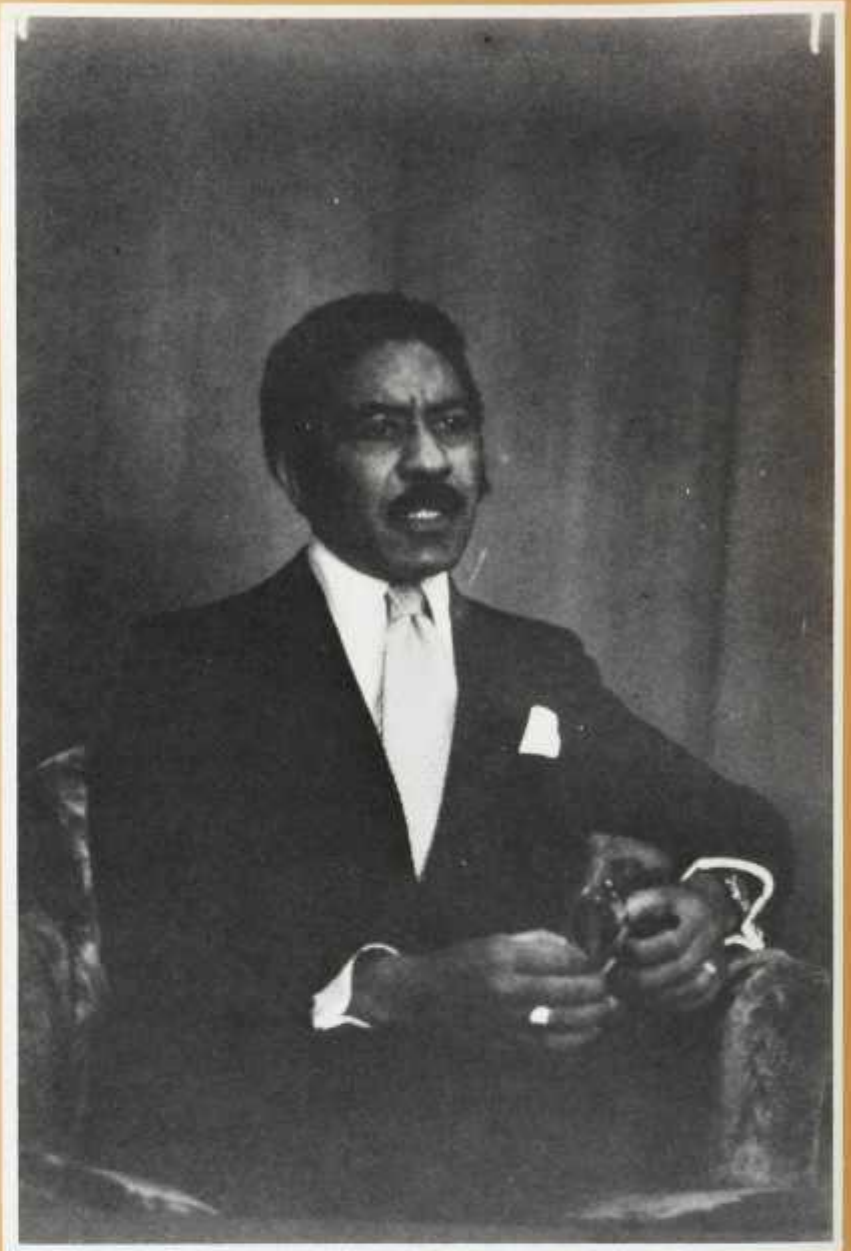




What can you say about a man who became president of the largest Black university in the country at the age of thirty-three?

When James Cheek was a student at Shaw University, he was suspended because he participated in student protests. Years later, he returned as its president. Unfortunately, some of the same staff members who were employed at the time of his suspension were still present. Of course, they didn't remain with the university long after that.

For a man who aspired to be a philosopher, writer and, as he phrased it, an "influencer of thoughts," Dr. James Cheek didn't do himself any injustice by accepting the position as President of Howard University. Since he became President in 1969, he has undoubtedly utilized his expertise in influencing thought on Howard's campus in respect to what he believes Black college students should be about the continued disparity and equity that exist between access to the opportunities, rewards, benefits and problems of this society. He further explained that the same type of problems of oppression that characterized students in the late fifties characterized the same students in the sixties and seventies. Full participation in the political process and our ability to have impact on the reforming society are all part of what he calls the absence of social justice. Black people must be made aware that Black students in college anywhere, represent a very small minority, but are the leadership corps for Black people nonetheless, and no injustice has ever been overcome without a leadership that's dedicated.



The President

During his tenure at Howard, Dr. Cheek has earned the reputation of being a "crowd pleaser", and the only real "student leader." Among his many accomplishments at the University have been the establishment of more professional schools, and he is presently planning a 10 year program to help raise funds for the university, stating that "resource deficiency" is the most critical problem facing Howard. Further accomplishments have been the acquisition of 108 acres for the university to be used as an advanced center

for biological and physical sciences; hiring out more full-time faculty, and construction of new physical facilities, such as the soon to-be-built Student Center, and the Howard University Hospital.

Dr. Cheek stresses the importance of students being basically responsible for their own education, but says he never imagined himself as Howard University President, so he really can't say how long he'll be around to assist.

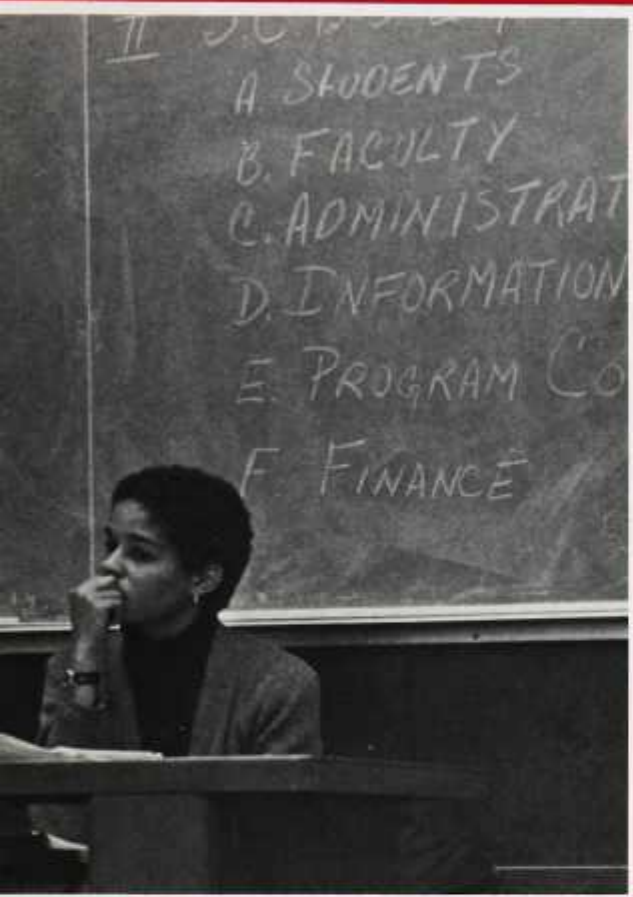


Save And Change

Howards' School of Communications opened in the spring of 1972. It offered an inordinately challenging and exciting program. The school is challenging because of the rigorous study that is involved to achieve in a specific field of study. Furthermore, various activities such as Howard University Speaks and The Communications Careers Conference are just a few of the exciting programs that were initiated by the School of Communications.

In the fall of 1972, the student council was officially recognized as an organization on campus. The council members began implementing projects which would enhance the education of the students.

This school year the student council has continued the progressive pace the previous council set. The council has tried to inculcate the concept of "Save and Change Black Schools" in various programs. The council feels that communications—radio, T.V. and Film, Journalism—is extremely important in the struggle to maintain Black schools. Also, to save and change Black schools in a racist environment, Black people must communicate with one another to insure the survival of our institutions.

The council feels very strongly about corresponding with other Black schools, particularly Black communications schools. In the future, the council hopes to establish a news service that would encompass many schools. Accordingly, the job of Saving and Changing Black Schools will involve hours of hard work, and communications students will play an important role.

"Take back your mind," "Educate to liberate," and "Black journalism . . . a search for the truth" are a few of the slogans which express the educational philosophy of Tony Brown, Dean of the School of Communications. Dean Brown, who is also executive producer of television's "Black Journal" teaches that Blacks must learn to create alternative institutions based on a positive evaluation of themselves since they have been systematically excluded from the existing institutions.

With this conception, the industrious and outspoken Tony Brown formed the School of Communications in February 1972. According to him, it is the largest Black communications school in the country, claiming half of the nation's currently enrolled Black communications students. Under Brown's direction, the school has developed a curriculum and a faculty enviable to any proficient communications school, Black or white.

A disagreement between Brown and the Board of Trustees on Brown's "unorthodox" methods of obtaining equipment for the school, the frequency of his physical absence from the school, and his policy on faculty advising students resulted in Brown's unexpected resignation in December 1973. Communication students, disturbed over the resignation, met with Dean Brown and Dr. Andrew Billingsley, Vice President for Academic Affairs, in an effort to keep Brown from leaving. Brown stated that the whole matter was "not negotiable." However, in January 1974, Dr. James Cheek, university president, sent a memorandum to communication students and faculty stating that Brown would remain as Dean until at least the end of the academic year.



The highlighting event of the School of Communications is a careers conference held in March every year. The conference, which brings together Blacks seeking jobs in communications with prospective employers, is the brainchild of Brown and is orchestrated by him. This year, Brown has escalated the conference to a national level. He declared March 10-16th "Communications for Freedom Week."

According to the Dean, the Dental School currently conducts thirty-three community programs and provides advice and data for five other schools.









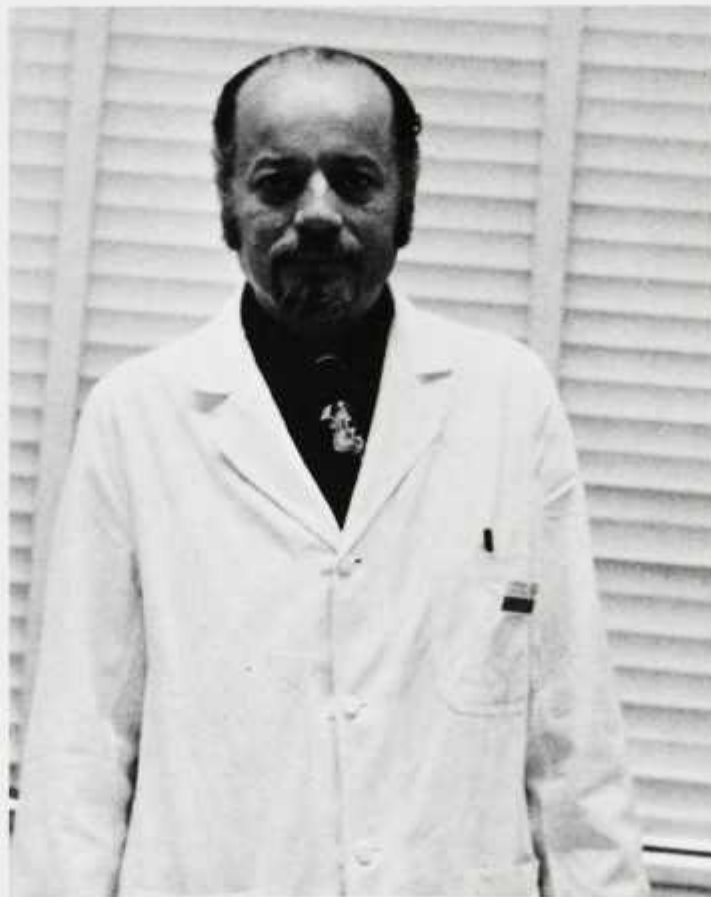

EDUCATION



Dr. Joseph Durham—Dean, School of Education

According to Dean Durham, Black education has traditionally been a carbon-copy of white education. This is good in some ways, as some things are common in education. However, some of the images used in teaching, in courses such as history and reading, should be changed to be more fundamental. It is most important to develop ego, strength, and self esteem. For instance, a Black child's reader should reflect something he knows. Recently, there has been much discussion as to whether the undergraduate program should be continued. Dean Durham feels we should continue to train teachers on the undergraduate level. He feels there should be an earlier introduction of the perspective teacher to the public school system. Along these lines he is encouraging the development of programs which would prepare Black students for going into Black schools as good, strong teachers. They would help to break the cycle of deprivation where the poor Black child is taught by the inexperienced Black teacher.

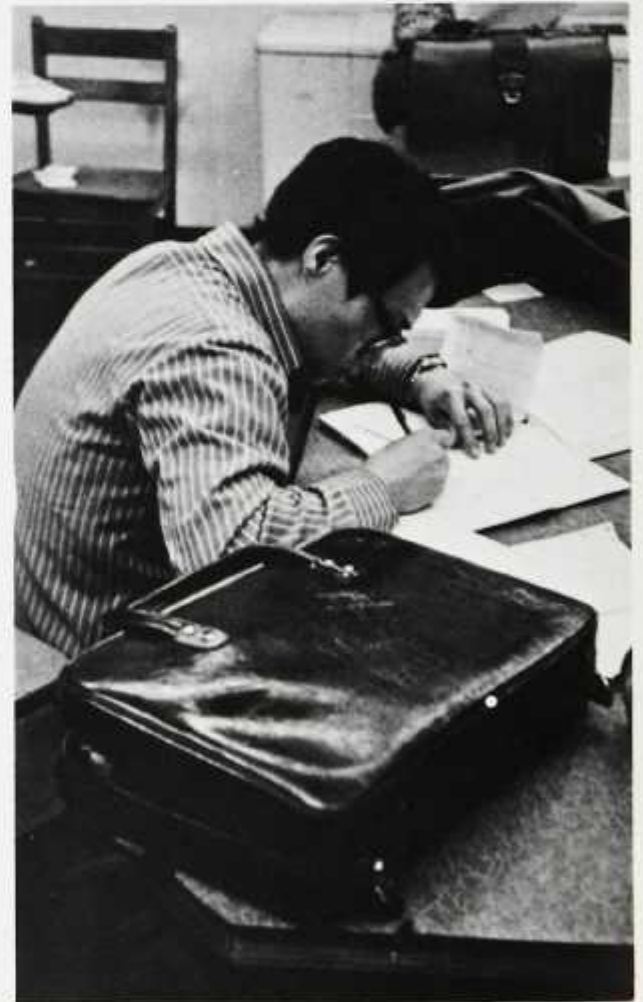
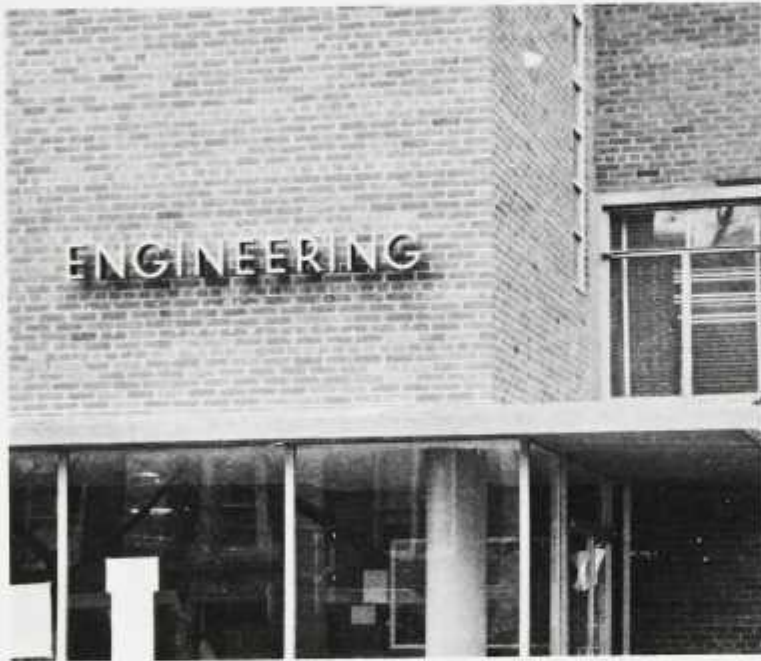
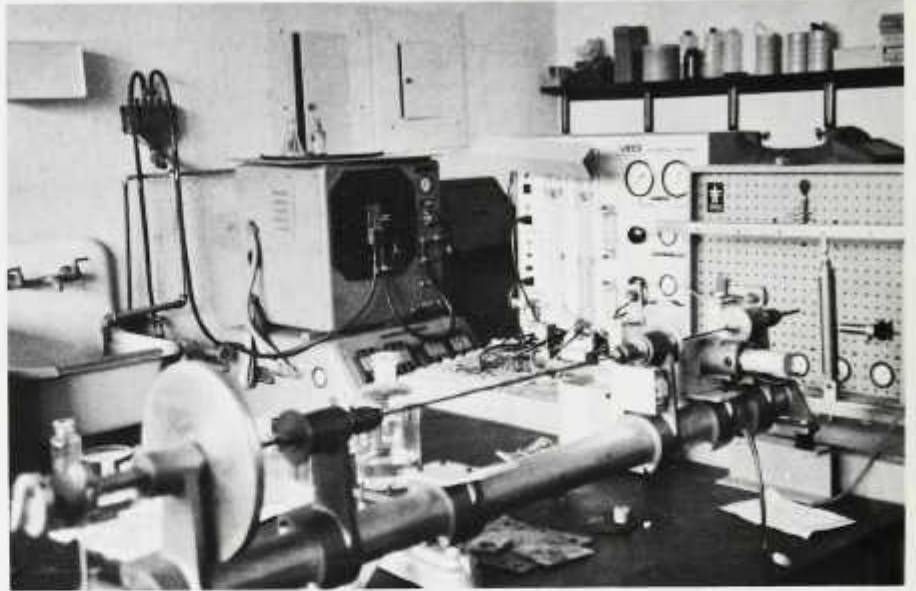

The primary issue black schools must be aware of is the clientele they are serving, and they must design their programs to serve the needs of that clientele. In achieving academic excellence, it is not sufficient to screen out students who don't meet certain artificial standards. It is the responsibility of black schools to screen in students.

Dean Pierre hopes to see the school become one of the most outstanding in the country. In order to do this, he plans to design a better curriculum.

Dean Pierre is effectively working to "Save and Change Black Schools" outside of the University. Under a 12 million dollar grant from the Sloan foundation, he and his colleagues are working on a program to recruit minorities into the field of Engineering. Another component of the program is the giving of grants to colleges. Howard will be one of the few schools receiving one of these grants.

Dean Reid believes that the initial change in educating Blacks should come in the elementary and secondary levels, by giving Blacks the necessary background for a successful college experience. One of the major problems of Black schools today is the reality that too often too many institutions become so involved with social services, that the traditional educational proponents are neglected. The traditional standards of education should be returned to, so that we might develop minds that are ready to compete and obtain brain power—real power.

The Law School is contributing to the destiny of Black schools by working on cases which challenge their existence, other clinical activities in the community, and conducting seminars to make the community aware of the social services provided by the Law School. The most important contribution of the Law School is that it is training and developing legal technicians to serve blacks and minorities in obtaining the equality of achievement in the modern world.

Future plans are to increase the recruitment program, to establish a graduate school, and to encourage other Black universities to enhance their recruitment programs.

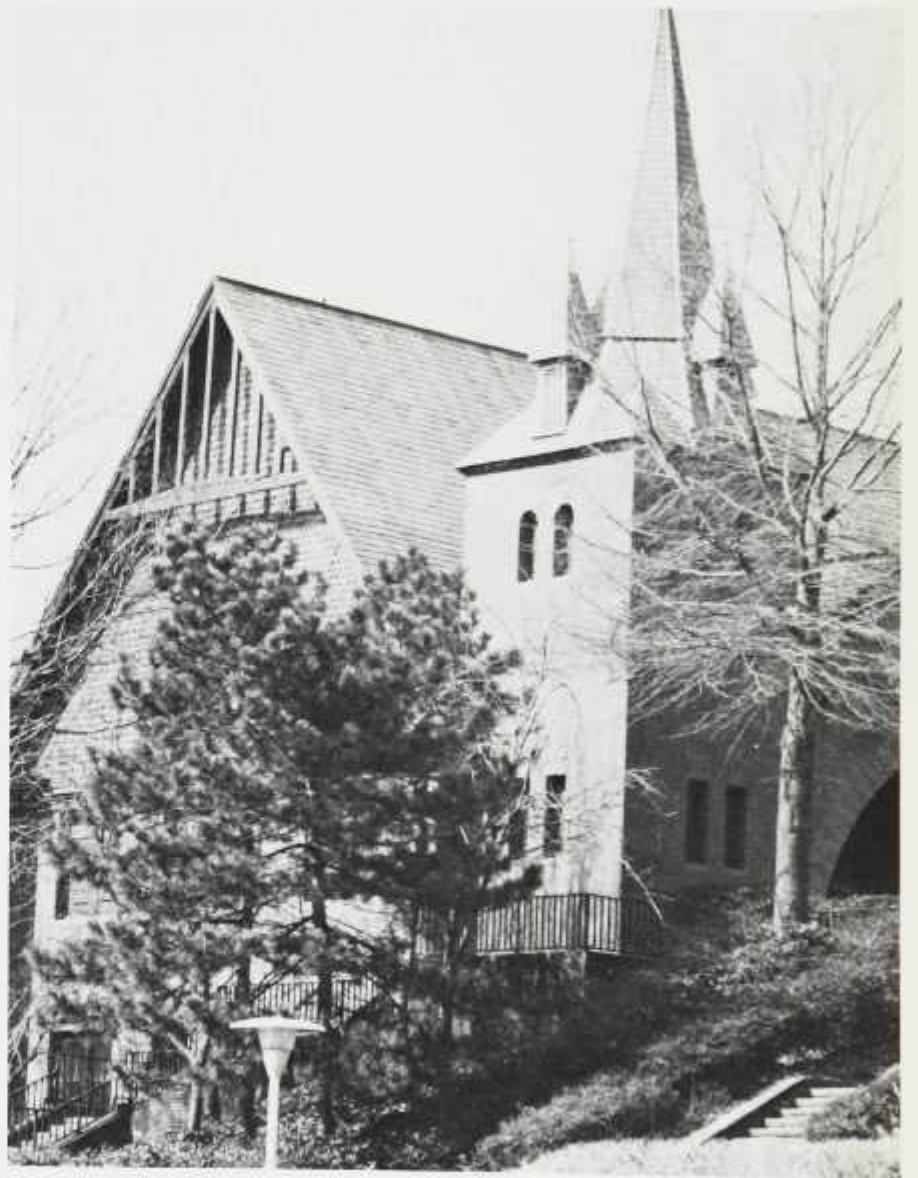

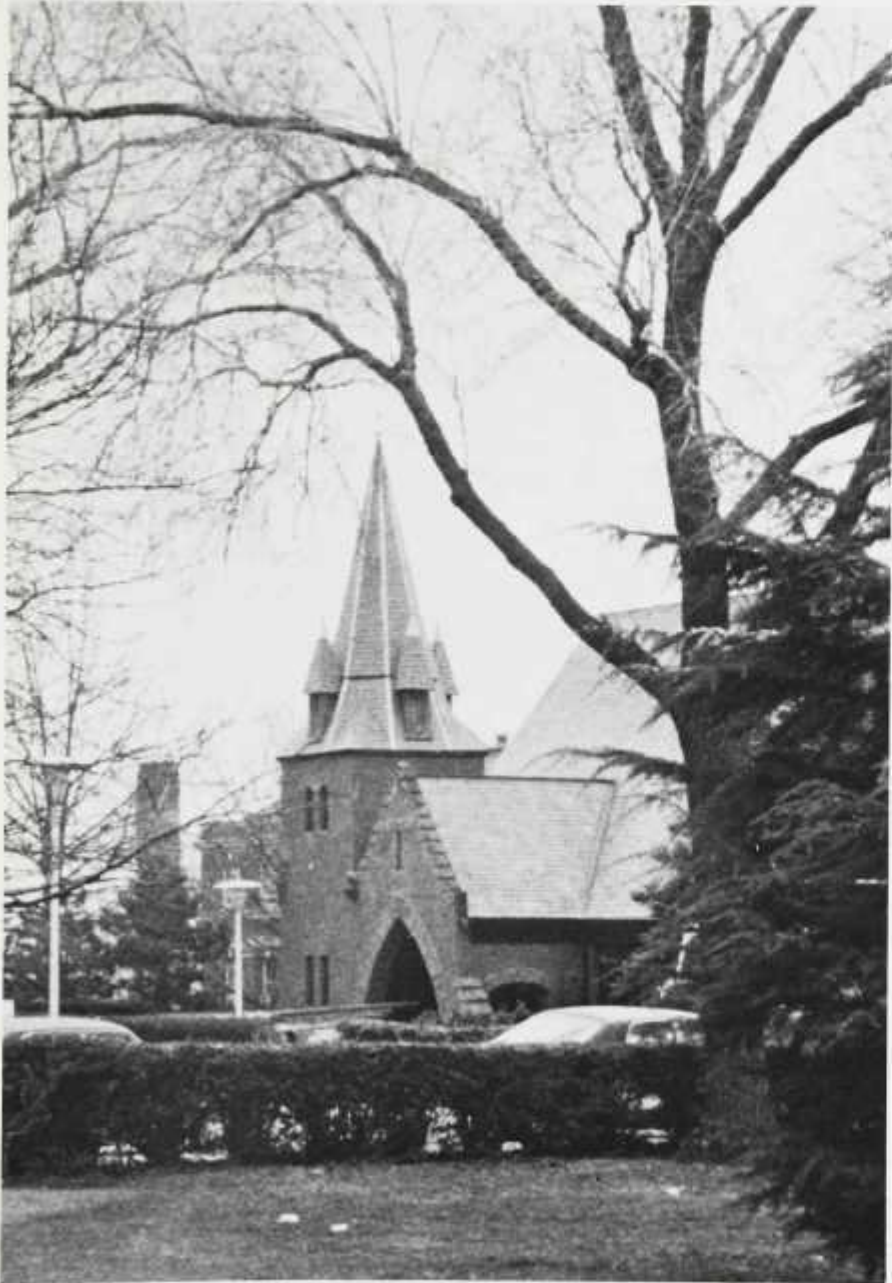

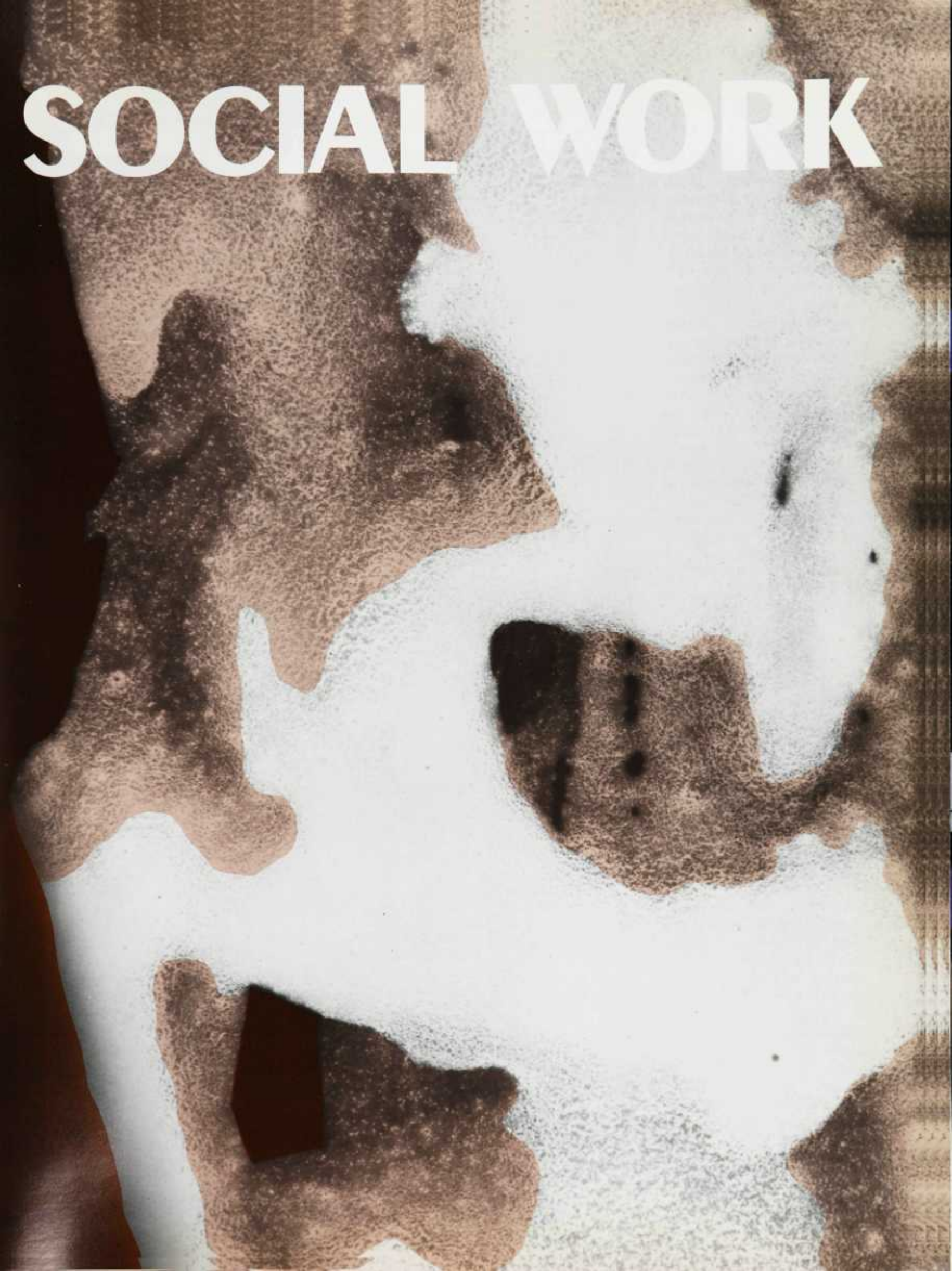

SOCIAL WORK



"Saving Black schools is necessary because Black schools are the only ones which answer the manpower needs of our community. It is essential that we clearly define our mission—the worst possible thing we can do is to emulate the white institution. Black schools must have a clear orientation towards Black prospectives and vitality—until we develop a strong sense of ethnocentricism and the confidence of relying upon ourselves. It is also essential that we develop more institutions — educational, economic, political, and social, because at this point, we don't have the quantity or quality institutions we need."

Dr. Glasgow believes that the field of Social Work must be changed drastically. It should not be centered around philanthropy—but, instead, should be aligned with the people. He would like to see Social Work students trained to take control of social organizations which will serve the community. He is also interested in orienting the Social Work curriculum towards training students to be middle management personnel in the human service, involving planning, policy-making, licensing, administration of institutions, and legislating. The dean would also like to see more students involved in direct services.



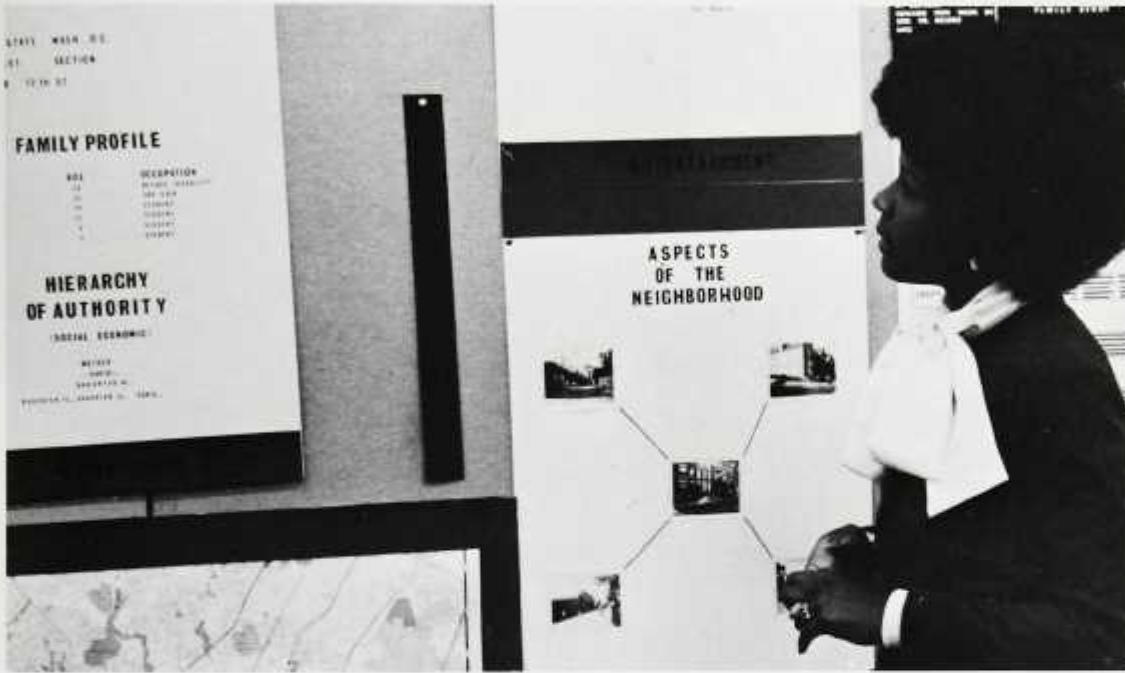

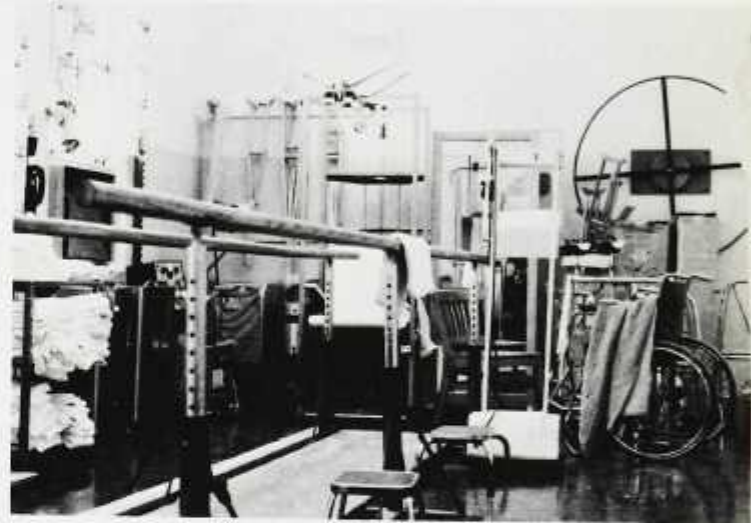




Dr. Ireland believes there is a real need to conserve Black schools and that a fundamental factor in this conservation, is the projection of an "image of excellence" by faculty members.

To project this image, Dr. Ireland says that Freedman's Hospital needs more modern facilities and highly skilled personnel.

"It is the people," Dr. Ireland contends, "that play an essential part in the changing of Black schools."

"It is our mission here at Freedmans' and the College of Medicine to see that good medical care is provided to Black communities all over the world," Dr. Vincent Roux, hospital medical director, said.

The destruction of Black schools, he added, dates back to early days of integration, when Black institutions were given federal funds so that their "own kind" would attend. Blacks didn't take advantage of this hidden opportunity, he said, and flocked to white colleges.

"Recently," he continued, "Blacks have become more aware of themselves and the importance of Black colleges and have now begun to take steps to preserve these institutions."

"In Freedman's Hospital and the College of Medicine, the preservation of Black schools is very realized by the constant improvement of the medical education process."



A member of numerous dental and community organizations, Dr. Juliann S. Bluitt, a 1962 Howard dental graduate, has demonstrated outstanding achievement in her chosen field.

Dr. Bluitt is a faculty fellow at Northwestern University's Center for the Teaching Professions. Previously, at the university, she served as Associate Dean for Auxiliary and Community Programs and Patient Relations; Associate Dean for Auxiliary and Community Programs and Patient Relations; Associate Professor in the Department of Dental Hygiene; and a Medical School lecturer.

The 35 year old native Washingtonian obtained her B.S. degree from Howard in 1958. In both undergraduate and graduate school, she excelled and received various scholarships, one being the Louis Ball Award.

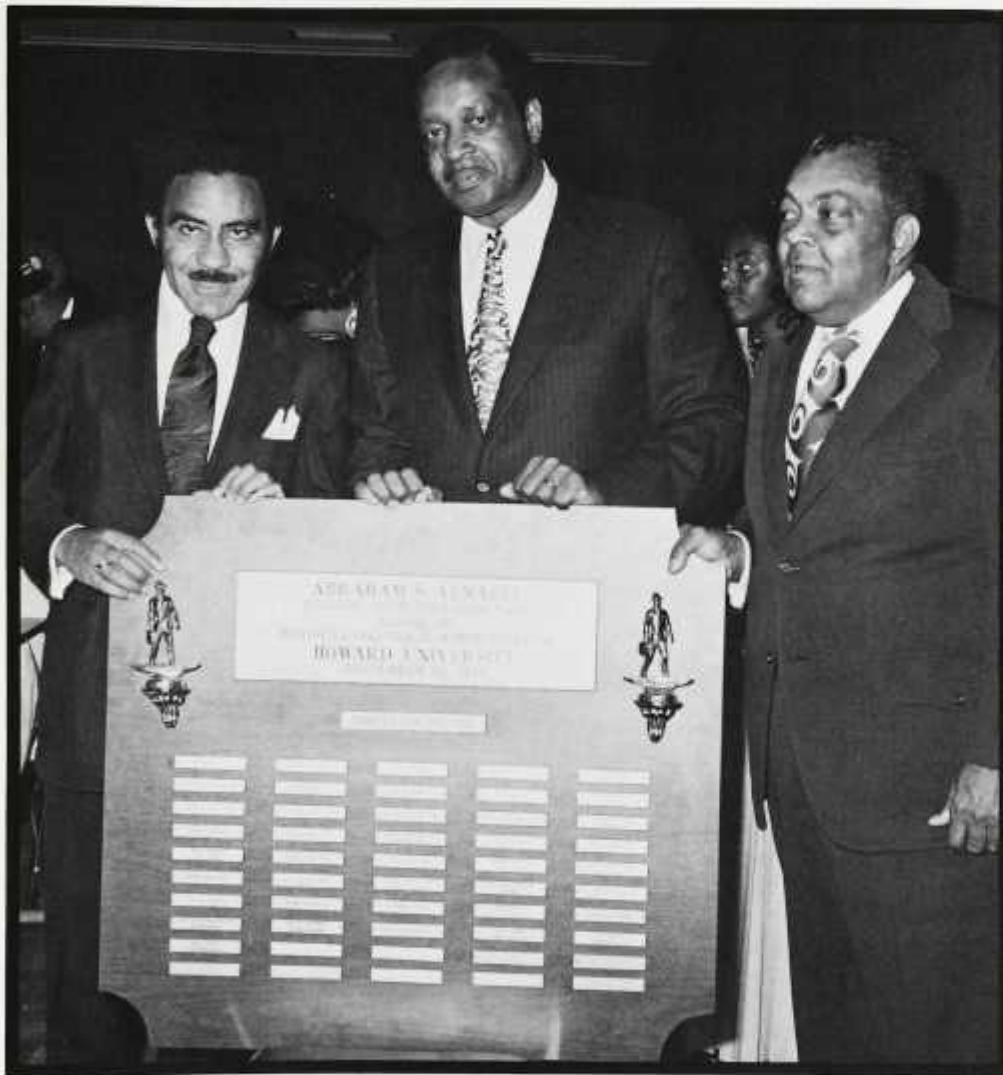

Besides devoting time and effort to the educational needs of Black students, he shows his dedication to the survival of Black schools by donating the proceeds from his book to Howard's School of Business and Public Administration.

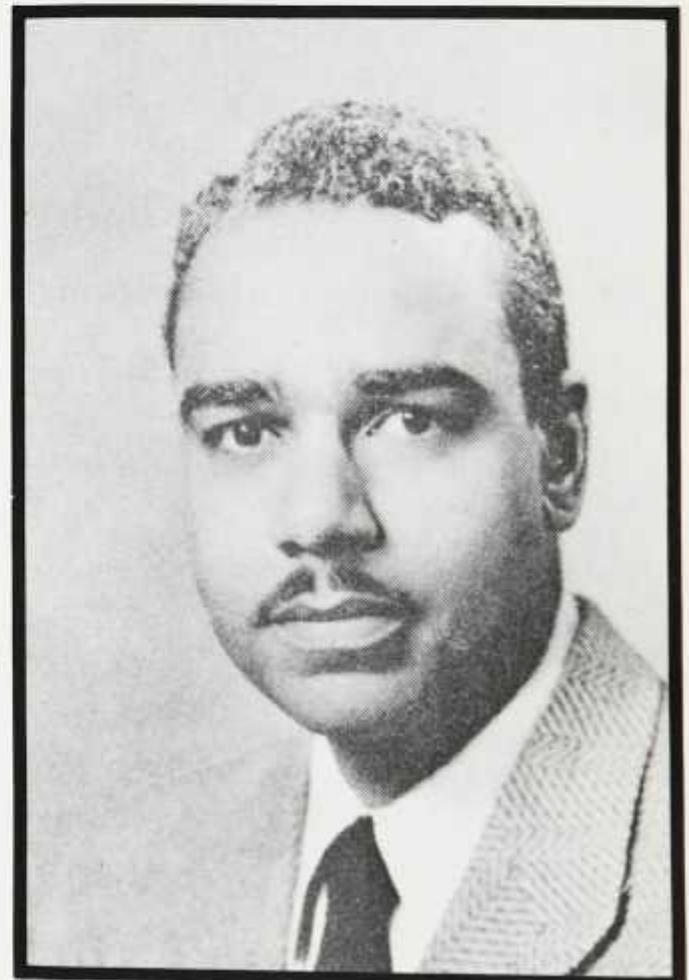

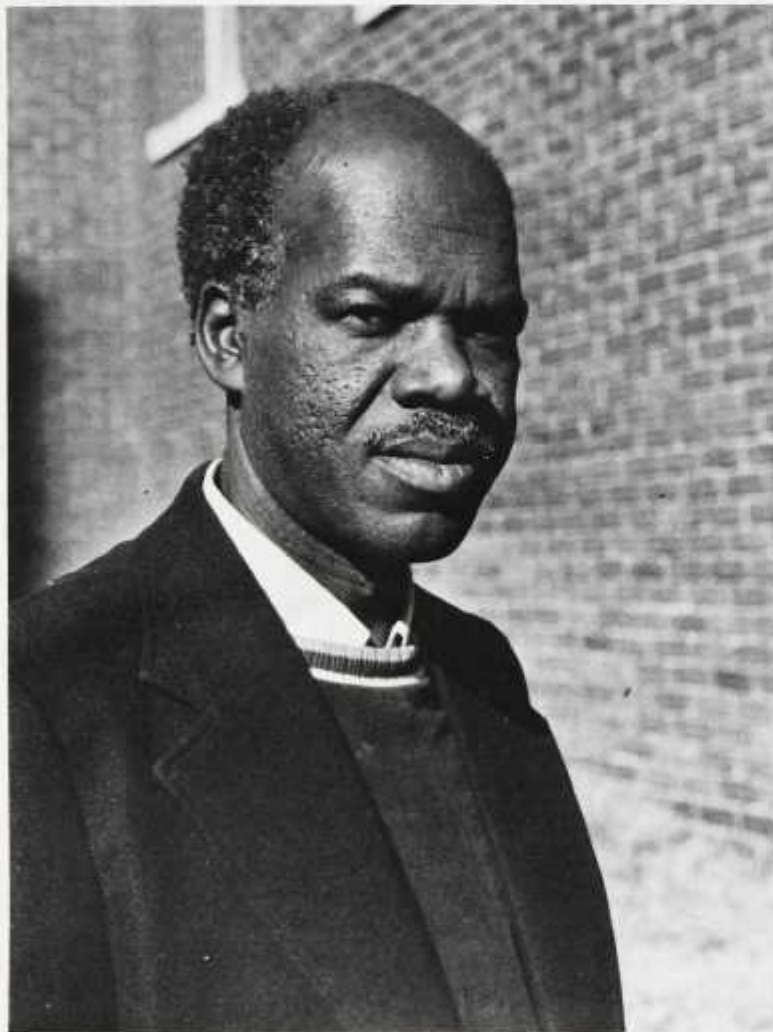

Dr. Ferguson has been instrumental in establishing the Co-operative Education program in the School of Engineering. Through this program, students receive work experience as well as their usual academic preparation. Dr. Ferguson has completed 14 years of research in his field and has taught 14 years, 11 of those at Howard.

Professor Semple came to Howard University via MIT where he held the position of Research Assistant. He is responsible for the current move in the engineering science curriculum. Arnold ("fly-by-Knight") McKnight



Dr. Arnold W. McKnight, a professor in the School of Education, sees Howard University as being an intellectually aggressive domain.

"Black schools have to get away from the bad mores established by white schools," the doctor said. "Specifically," he continued, "we have to start being proud of what we are and push forward in spite of the money barriers placed before us."

Dr. McKnight feels that Black schools hold a specific place in society in terms of instilling these attitudes in our children. He believes that Black schools should emphasize pride in Blackness and that our whole focus should be dealing with the survival of blackness and "taking from white society that which helps us to survive."

The HILLTOP will exist as long as one student tries to effect change. And, as the HILLTOP has found out, change is essential to growth, and growth is essential to existence.





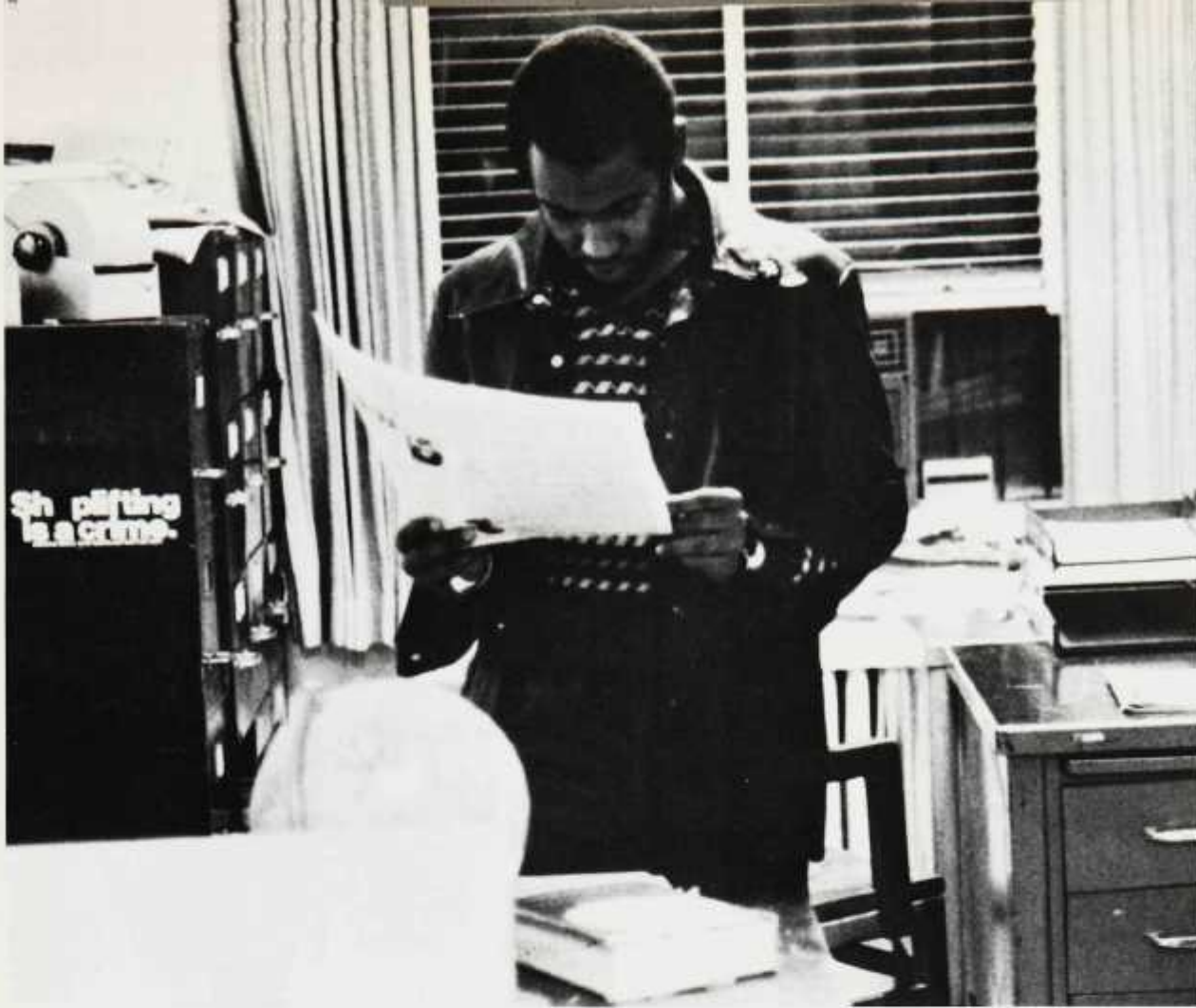

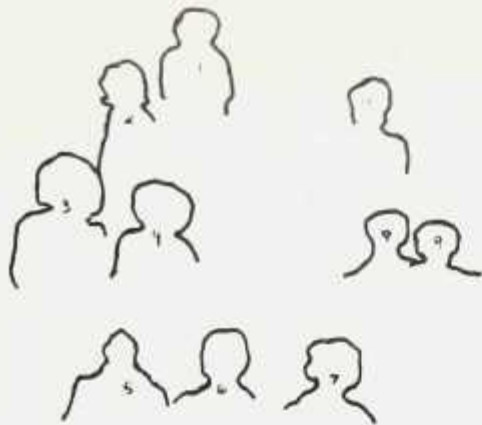



Dear Howard,


When we arrived on campus four years ago, we were told at the Freshman Assembly that there were certain things that once given, could not be taken back. Among the significant was, "an opportunity whose time has come." "Opportunity" is defined by Webster as a "good chance for advancement or progress." Before May, 1974, some of us would meet our opportunities, while others of us would continue to seek them. A few of us would "punch-out", and some would leave school for financial reasons, and still others would depart for personal reasons. And, next September, some of us will still be around, just waiting for opportunity to knock twice. But, there's one thing for certain, come May, this year, less than half of our original class will graduate.

We came from as far away as California and Africa, and as nearby as Georgia Avenue. We came in different shapes, sizes, and complexions. Some of us came with money to spare, while far too many of us with close to none. Our reasons for choosing Howard University is a place to pursue our educational goals, differed. For a lot of us, Howard came highly recommended by relatives and friends. For some of us, the inexpensiveness of tuition at that time and the allocation of financial assistance was the determining factor. And, of course, we can't forget about those of us who came to party and find mates; not those of us who came to serve. But, most of us claimed the desire to attend a credible Black university as our reason, and at that time, we thought you were both, credible, and Black.

Prior to our arrival here, many of us had experienced a taste of student unrest at our respective high schools. For, we had also protested, demonstrated, and demanded that the traditional school system make some changes. If you remember, several students died at Kent State and Jackson State Colleges because they wanted the same. And, we can't forget the assassinations of Bob Kennedy and Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr.; nor the rise of the Black Panther Party, clenched fists, "right on," and the instant ambition to learn swahili. But Howard? When we enrolled here in September, '70, we found you to be just as "Black", and no Blacker, than the rest of Black America. America.

We were introduced to the "partying" atmosphere via freshman orientation. The first week will be cherished in our hearts whenever we remember Howard. There hasn't been, and probably never will be, another one like it. The panic, the boatride, movie, show, and yes, even the "hangin on the wall." We enjoyed it all! We have come to realize that one of your most generous qualities is providing your guests with an accommodating social education. Your campus parties were usually always crowded, as were your cabarets at WUST. The fashion lended itself to the most casual attire of all, bluejeans. And, many of us kept fit by walking where we had to go, or hitching, when there was no ride. However, regardless of the tempo around us, we partied, and we partied hard.

Academically, we found the transition from instructional learning in high school to a more independent learning system in college to be quite adjustable for the academic-minded students, and slightly difficult for those who were obsessed with mastering the "get-over" techniques. Yeah, some of us "got-over." Others of us wished we could have, and the remainder of us seemed dissatisfied with just merely getting-over." It is a scientific fact, that for every action, there is a reaction, and far too many of us won't be accepted into graduate or professional schools hereafter. And, we must not forget all of us who are constantly talking about the "honors" we could have had, if . . .



You see, now that we will be receiving our degrees, we wonder how many of us are truly satisfied with our chosen professions. Unfortunately, we can't re-live the last four years, only put them in perspective.

We realize that by being at Howard, we have had access to some of the best minds in the country (old and young, alike). We have had the privilege of attending a school with a solid foundation, and distinguished reputation. We have competed with each other in hope that you will be proud of us all, just as we stood together when we thought you might be taken from us.

Of course, it's only fair that you, as an institution, take some of the blame for our academic failure, because after all, we came to you for leadership. Your administrators, more times than not, disagreed with us about how you should handle your administrative affairs. They argued that they were older, more experienced in such matters, so consequently, much wiser. We only had our youth and eagerness to contribute, and you treated such qualities as handicaps to be rehabilitated. We, of another generation, hope that we won't ever have to pay a severe price for our vulnerability.

Howard, we watched you expand from a eleven college university to a fifteen school university. We were here when you acquired mass communication means. The Howard University Press and WHUR Radio Station are great attributes to any institution designed to educate. The schools of Nursing, Communication, Business and Education are very necessary for training Blacks to become self-sufficient. With respect, we commend you!

There were aspects of the university in which you did not demonstrate excellent quality, but you probably did your best, just the same. Such an area was your dormitories. While others learned to count the cracks in the wall, or kill the roaches on the floor, many of us were realizing the advantages of communal living. Yes, they were few, but, there were some. For example, how could we have known details of our neighbors' business, if we hadn't lived so close? How could we have attended so many campus activities, if they hadn't been only a step away? And, how could we stay up all night, rapping, "getting high", and playing bid-whist if we hadn't been together. We know you remember how hard we fought to be together; the sit-in at Cook Hall our freshman year, the granting of twenty-four hour coed visitation, sneaking people up when we didn't have it, and the dare-devil games we played when boredom cocked its heels.

We played other games, too. You know, sports and such. We were glad to be here to see our soccer team become national champions. And, we were here the following year, when we were stripped of our deserving honor. But, we managed to overcome one more disappointment, as we watched our other athletic teams soar to numerous victories. With the recruitment of our classmates, Bob Lewis and Warren Hollins, our basketball team was on a winning streak most of our years here. Our football team improved tremendously over the past four years with the assistance of outstanding graduating seniors, Eddie Richardson and Richard McGhee, both of whom were drafted into the pros. Perhaps the most consistently winning team at Howard has always been the team with the least amount of student support, the wrestling team. Championship wrestler Artie Cox, we salute you, finally! And of course, our baseball, track, and swimming teams have all enjoyed the sweetness of victory. These athletic accomplishments can't be mentioned without recognizing the support of the Howard University Soul Squad, and our cheerleaders, who first introduced African-oriented cheers to the conference. Now, we'll toast ourselves for going out and rooting for our



strong, beautiful Black men. May they continue to receive the spoils!

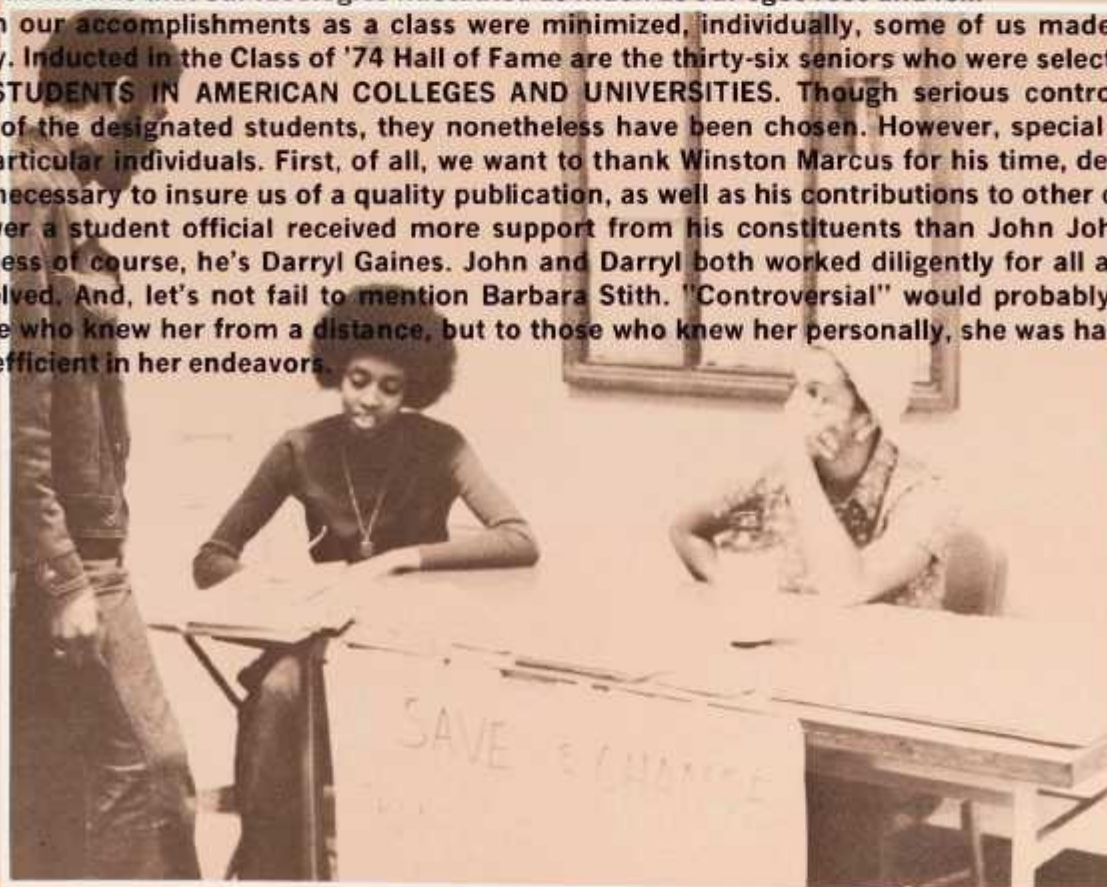
As in every institution of higher learning, there are students who will stand out as being exceptional in their chosen fields. These students range from participators in campus activities to community tutors. There were a great number of hard-working and devoted students, like Cathy Henderson, Renee Davis, and Jerome Jefferson, whose deeds will go unnoticed because they didn't aspire to campus fame. For these students in particular, and others whom we may have omitted, we will make our "thank-you" with the same humility with which you did your deeds.

In reality, we knew that a class, as a collective unit, couldn't do much in the way of defining "Blackness" in terms of a functionable concept, but, we wanted to be Black so bad. We put up our afros, and rapped a lot of rhetoric, and called ourselves, "Black." We do not mean to minimize the efforts of those students who felt that they were "Blacker than thou." We only want to demonstrate that perhaps we basically missed the Black revolution band-wagon, and just barely managed to hop on the tail-end when we got here. We were often told that we weren't relevant enough, but as the years passed, "relevant," has come to mean different things to different people. Or, were we kidding ourselves all along? Once more, the burden of proof rests with time.

Freshman Class President, Phyllis Wigginton, admitted that the class on a whole wanted to do so much; that very little was actually done. Dear Howard, if you feel that we should apologize, then so let it be. According to our Sophomore Class President, Geoffrey Simmons, several activities were sponsored that year: a food drive, newsletter, study skill center, and lecture series. Bulletin boards were presented to the university, and the Pan-African Reading Room was established in Douglass Hall. An outstanding faculty award was presented to Historian Chancellor Williams, as well as certificates being issued to outstanding sophomores. Namely, John Johnson, Ezekiel Mobley, Barbara Stith, Angie Finley, Michael Redd, and Jeri Randall.

Junior Class President, Tedy Andrews, has been rather quiet about our achievements during our junior year, but maybe there's a reason. We admit that we were more apathetic than usual that year, so maybe you feel that an apology is in order for that too. And, Senior Class Presidents, Mel Perry and David Glover seriously tried to bring us together for a final effort to leave our mark, so that we, as a class, would not have existed in vain. Maybe our greatest disappointment was that our ideologies fluctuated as much as our egos rose and fell.

Though our accomplishments as a class were minimized, individually, some of us made our mark at Howard University. Inducted in the Class of '74 Hall of Fame are the thirty-six seniors who were selected as the WHO'S WHO AMONG STUDENTS IN AMERICAN COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES. Though serious controversy exists over the selection of the designated students, they nonetheless have been chosen. However, special recognition has to be paid to particular individuals. First, of all, we want to thank Winston Marcus for his time, devotion, and hard work that was necessary to insure us of a quality publication, as well as his contributions to other campus organizations. John and Darryl both worked diligently for all activities in which they were involved. And, let's not fail to mention Barbara Stith. "Controversial" would probably best describe her for the people who knew her from a distance, but to those who knew her personally, she was hard-working, dedicated, and very efficient in her endeavors.



It's common knowledge that not all the student officials of our class served the students as much as they served themselves. We were constantly tormented by "alleged rip-offs" since we became familiar with the tale of Mungo our freshman year. As student budgets dwindled away at the hands of elected officials, the suspicion among the student body rose. In such situations, we guess we'll never truly know the content analysis of particular betrayals, but, it can be presumed that in future elections, students will weigh the integrity of candidates on the same scale that measures their capabilities. Serious consideration has to be done on the decision, since every student who believes that he can take the campus for a joy ride, without paying for his passage, can't be elected. Nor are those elected, and suspected, ever prosecuted.

Perhaps, one of our greatest lessons realized is that as human beings, we are imperfect. One demonstration of imperfection was realized when '74 HILLTOP Editor, Ezekiel Mobley set precedents by being the first editor to have his budget frozen, and then later be suspended as Editor-in-Chief, for negligence, failure to submit a detailed fiscal account of previous expenditures and future allocations, lack of cooperation with the HILLTOP Advisory Board in policy matters, and adequate or accurate reporting of the board's recommendations.

Unfortunately, Howard, our imperfections continuously caused us great suffering. We procrastinated ourselves into all night cramming, and overnight papers. The administration building screwed us around in a thousand different ways. And many a day, some of us drank water, and called it a meal. But yet, we endured!

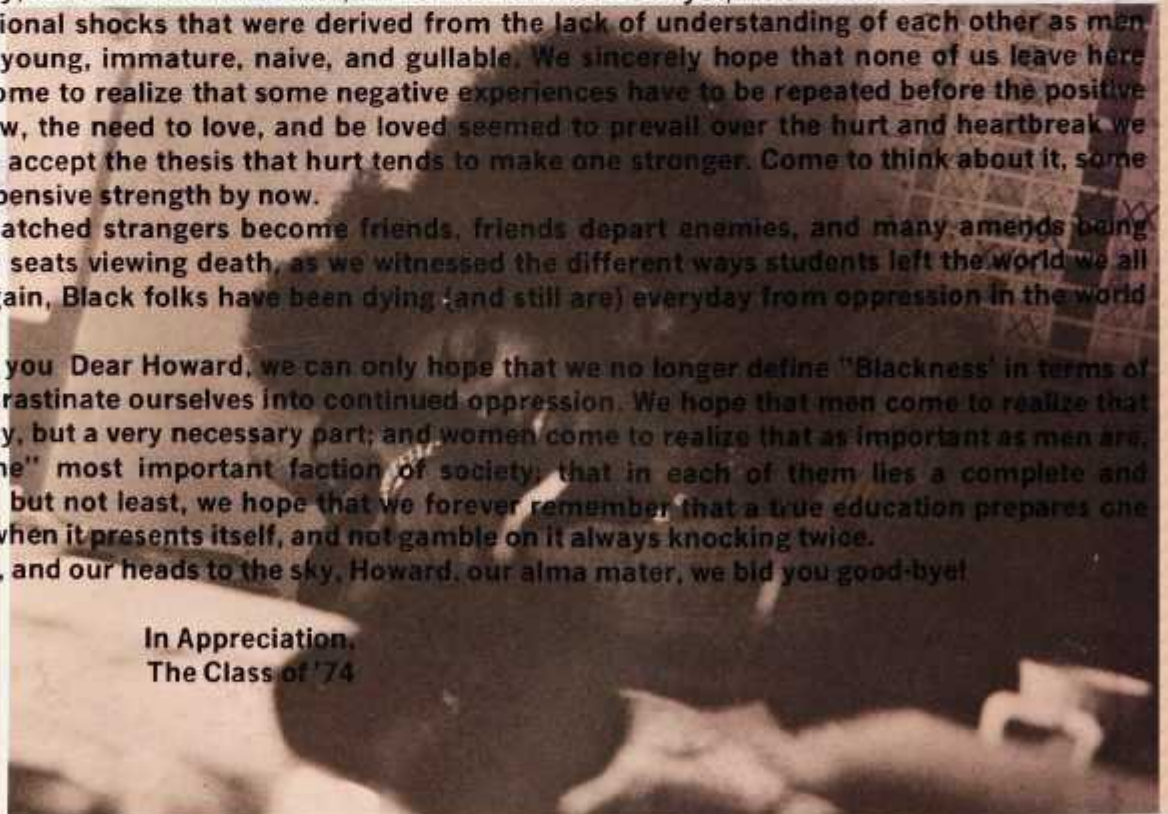
We even endured the emotional shocks that were derived from the lack of understanding of each other as men and women. We arrived very young, immature, naive, and gullable. We sincerely hope that none of us leave here that way, but, we also have come to realize that some negative experiences have to be repeated before the positive aspects are realized. Somehow, the need to love, and be loved seemed to prevail over the hurt and heartbreak we encountered. And, most of us accept the thesis that hurt tends to make one stronger. Come to think about it, some of us must have some very expensive strength by now.

Over the years, we have watched strangers become friends, friends depart enemies, and many amends being made. We have had front row seats viewing death, as we witnessed the different ways students left the world we all are familiar with. But then again, Black folks have been dying (and still are) everyday from oppression in the world we are forever calling, real.

However, now, as we leave you Dear Howard, we can only hope that we no longer define "Blackness" in terms of afros and soul music; or procrastinate ourselves into continued oppression. We hope that men come to realize that women are not tools of society, but a very necessary part; and women come to realize that as important as men are, they are not necessarily "the" most important faction of society; that in each of them lies a complete and separate individual. And last, but not least, we hope that we forever remember that a true education prepares one to recognize his opportunity when it presents itself, and not gamble on it always knocking twice.

So, with our hearts in hand, and our heads to the sky, Howard, our alma mater, we bid you good-bye!
