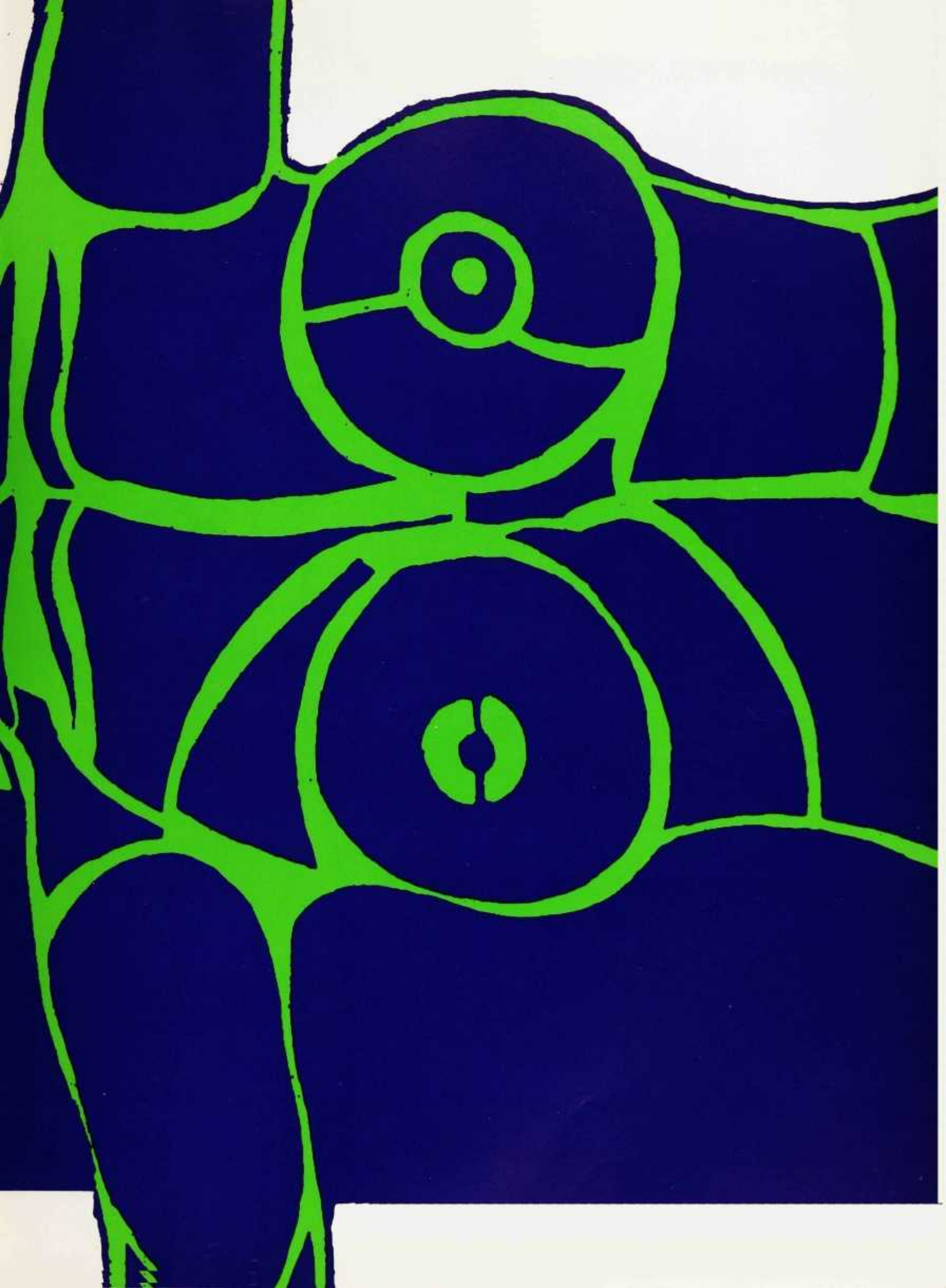

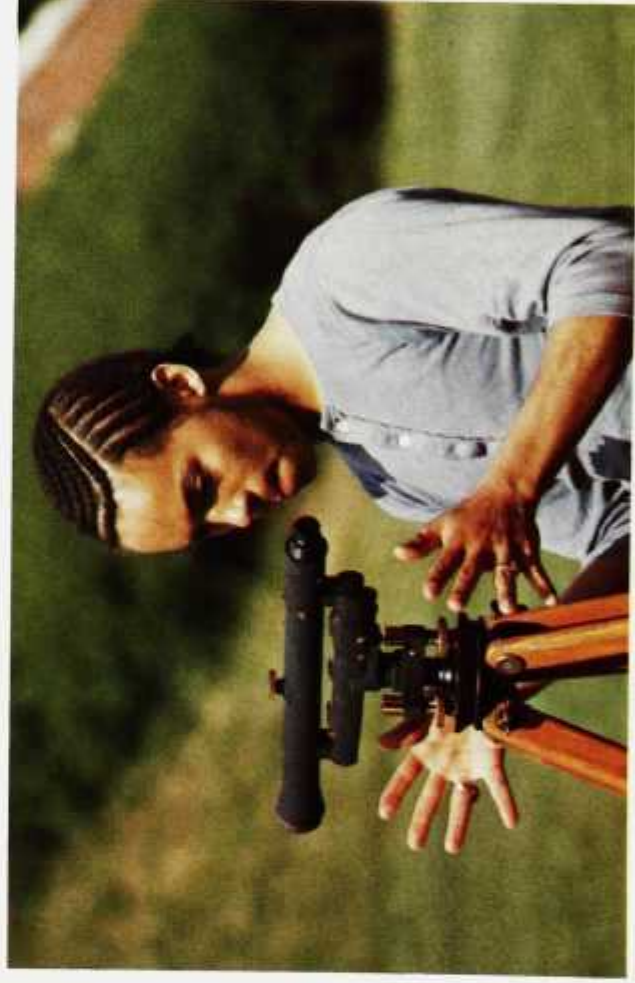

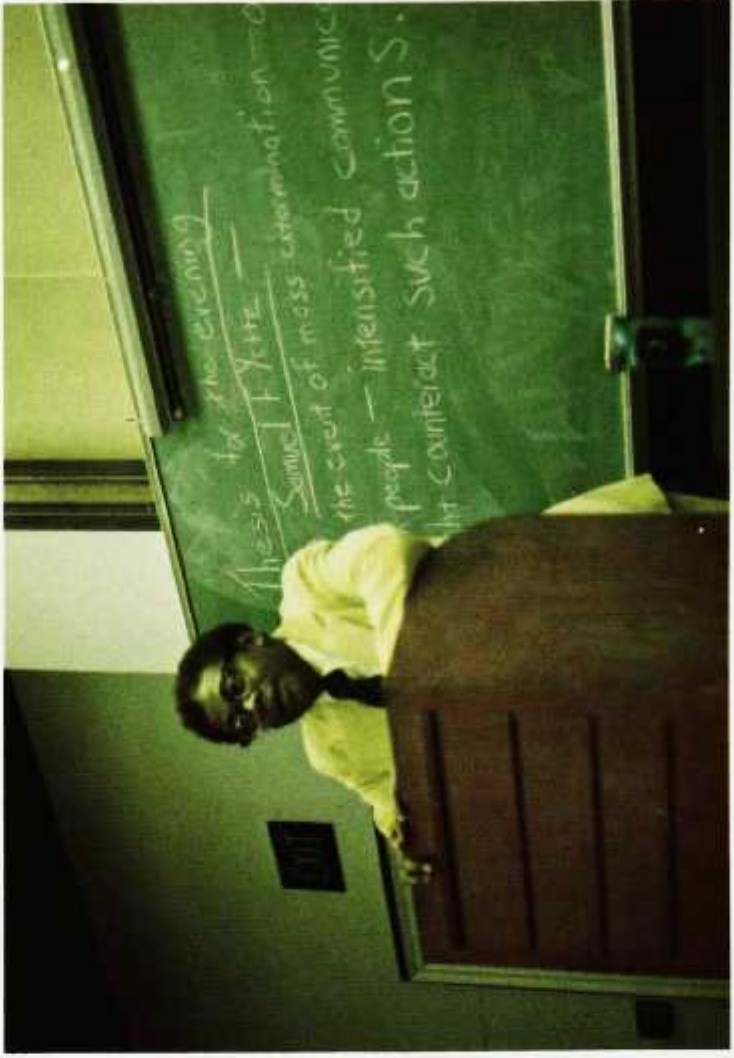

# Alumni Achievement

## Awardees 1975

John Henry Powell, Jr. In the fields of Law and Legal Service

Through legal expertise and an extensive background in law John Henry Powell, Jr. has assisted the progress of Civil Rights in this country for more than a decade. He was sworn in as Chairman of the U. S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission since its inception in 1965. He served as General Counsel of the Civil Rights Commission for more than three years, was an attorney in the Office of the Solicitor, U. S. Department of Labor and as Assistant U. S. Attorney for the Department of Justice in the Eastern District of

New York. Following as association with the law firm of Wachtel and Michaelson, New York, he started a private practice in Mineola, New York. He worked as special counsel to the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. During this same period, he was Special Counsel to Joseph F. Carlino, then speaker of the New York State Assembly.

Mr. Powell, born in Mineola, New York on February 11, 1937, received the B.A. degree, magna cum laude, from Howard University in 1953. He later received the Juris Doctor degree from Harvard University and the Master of Laws degree from New York University

Graduate School of Law. Alma Woodsey Thomas in the fields of Art and Colorifics

When Alma Woodsey Thomas received the B.S. degree from Howard University in 1924, she also received the distinction of being the first graduate of Howard's Department of Art. She received the M.A. degree from Columbia University in 1934, and studied painting at American University from 1950-60. She is perhaps best known for her earth and space paintings which are abstractions composed of mosaic patterns in concentric circles and straight lines in vibrant colors. Though inspired entirely by nature, she says

she is also indebted to the tradition of color painting made famous by this city.

Ms. Thomas born in Columbus Georgia, on September 22, 1894 was brought to Washington, D.C. as a small child and has lived here ever since. She taught at Shaw Junior High School from 1924 until her retirement in 1960. Since that time she has devoted her energies to painting and has represented at more than 70 shows, including major national exhibitions of contemporary Black artists. Her one-woman exhibitions have been held at the Franz Bader Gallery, the Whitney Museum of American Art, the Corcoran Gallery of Art and at Fisk and Howard Universities.

Frederic Ellis Davison in the fields of Military Science and Public Service

The highest ranking graduate of Howard's ROTC program, Major General Frederic Ellis Davison, USA (Ret.), is internationally recognized for his extraordinary leadership qualities and talents in military operations. His commitment to public service has been evidenced through his outstanding ability and his wide knowledge of military tactics.

General Davison, born in Washington, D.C. on September 28, 1917, received the B.S. and M.S. degrees in zoology and chemistry from Howard University in 1938 and 1940, respectively. In 1946 he was separated from the Army and enrolled in the Howard University College of Medicine for one year; thereafter, he returned to the Army as company commander at Ft. Dix, N.J. In 1963, he received the M.A. degree in International Affairs from George Washington University. He was honored by the Howard University Alumni Federation for outstanding public service in 1973.

Beginning his career as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army in 1939, he became the third Black ever to achieve the rank of General in the United States Armed Services and the first to lead an integrated combat infantry

division. Prior to his assignment as Commanding general of the Military District of Washington in November, 1973, he had completed two other assignments of the same level in Vietnam and in Germany.

James Henry Merriweather Henderson in the fields of Biological Science and Research

Recognized as one of the nation's leading biologists, Dr. James H. M. Henderson is director of the Carver Research Foundation at Tuskegee Institute. He has also held several other positions at Tuskegee in the span of his three decades of service to that institution. Through his career, he has been a frequent contributor to scientific journals as a result of his extensive research in plant physiology and biochemistry. In 1964, he was cited for conspicuous service in the field of biology by Howard's General Alumni Association.

An active member of numerous professional organizations, Dr. Henderson was appointed to the Commission on Undergraduate Education in the Biological Sciences in 1965 and has served as consultant to two panels of the National Academy of Sciences. Since 1973, he has been a member of the Executive Committee of the National Council of University Research Administrators and is past chairman of the American Society of Plant Physiologists Southern Section.

After earning the B.S. degree from Howard University in 1939, he enrolled in the University of Wisconsin where he was awarded the M.Ph. and Ph.D. degrees in 1940 and 1943, respectively. He did further study at the California Institute of technology from 1948-50 and at the Oak Ridge Institute for Nuclear Studies in 1951.

Recently appointed as co-chairman of the University's Request Committee, Dr. Henderson was born in Falls Church, Va. on August 10, 1971.

# The President

"Student Government should be active, forward looking, aggressive, and constructive."

"The President is a spokesman and catalyst for the institution—he must take the initiative in projecting goals and objectives and see to it that Howard gets the necessary resources to carry on its program . . ."

Dr. James Cheek, an idealist who looks beyond the moment. A man who believes that you can do something to make things better.





It is "imperative to marshal the resources of this institution to influence public opinion with scholarly research based on data that cannot be refuted", declares Dr. James Cheek, president of Howard University. Viewing himself as a catalyst in projecting goals, he is also largely responsible for the university's growth. Today, Howard claims seventeen schools, a hospital, a press, and new campus.

Among the objectives outlined by Dr. Cheek for the university were plans to publish a scholarly journal, the further development and strengthening of the graduate school, and the exploration and development of formal relations with foreign universities.

However, according to him, the overriding objective is "resource development" or the "cultivation of a diverse constituency" to support the institution financially. Program development, stated Dr. Cheek, is dependent upon adequate financing. He added that presently the university does not have the proper funding to support an institution of Howard's size, scope, and complexity.

The President also related plans for the ten year expansion program which included a television station, further development of Dumbarton, and the development of a campus in Beltsville, Maryland. Hopefully, according to the President, the Beltsville campus will house a center for advanced biological and physical science research and a college of veterinary medicine.

The newly founded press, stressed Dr. Cheek, is interested in impact not profit. It will function to educate whites about Blacks as well as educate Blacks about Blacks, and will attempt to fulfill the needs that other publishing houses have neglected.

What kind of man administers the affairs of such as important and complex institution? An idealist, who doesn't accept things as they are, was the sentiment expressed by Dr. Cheek.

One of his favorite philosophies authored by Browning states: "A man's reach should exceed his grasp . . . or what's a heaven for?"

Indeed Dr. Cheek's vision for Howard embodies this philosophy, for his plans for Howard extend beyond the university's present boundaries. He declares most emphatically that the leadership position of Howard will continue to exist and will be enlarged.

Junior Vadnay Cotton was voted to the MEAC's first team. Vadnay and Angelo Council were selected to the second all-tournament team in Baltimore.



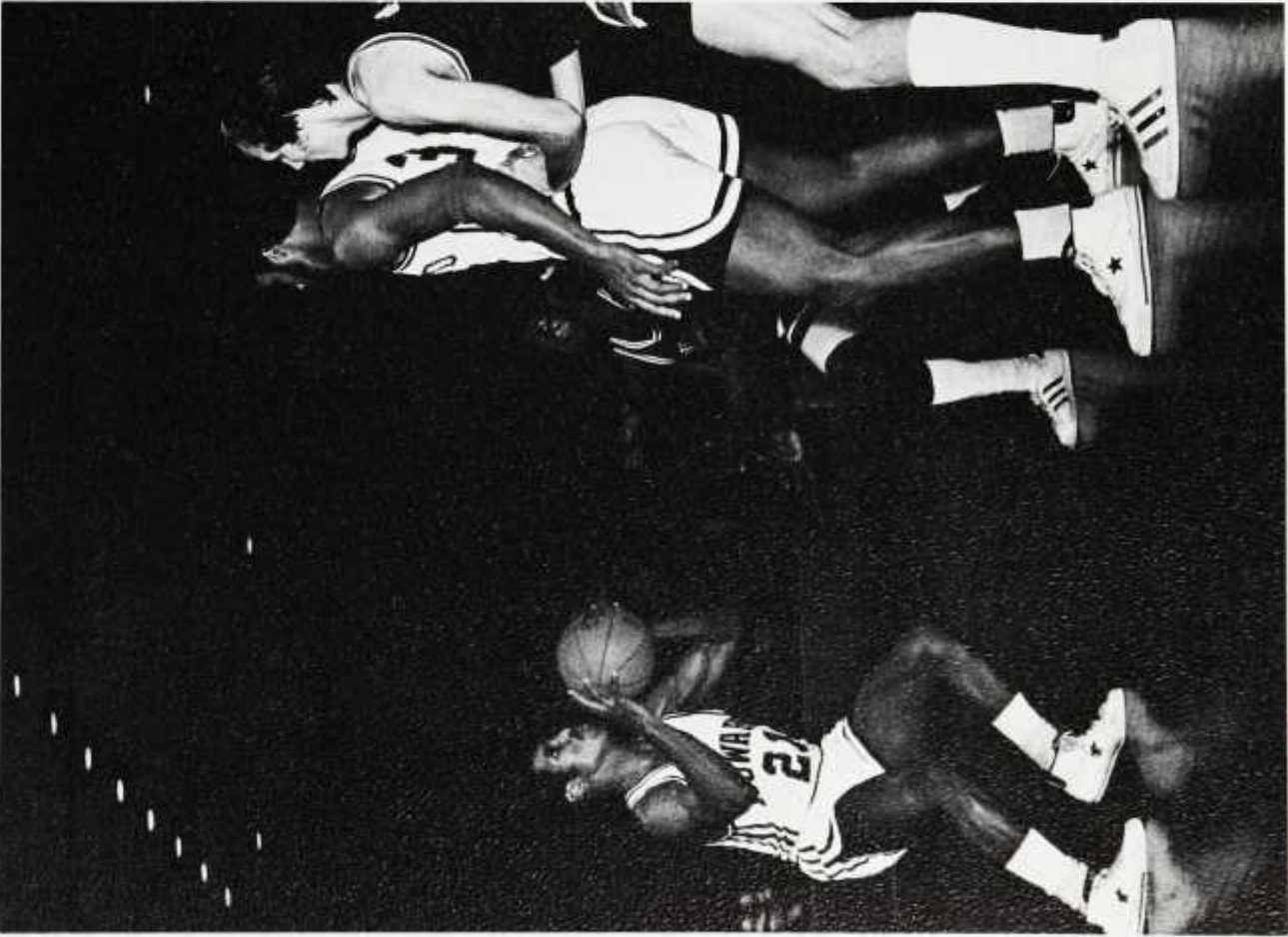


Freshman Gerald Glover aims for 2 points against Morgan defenders.

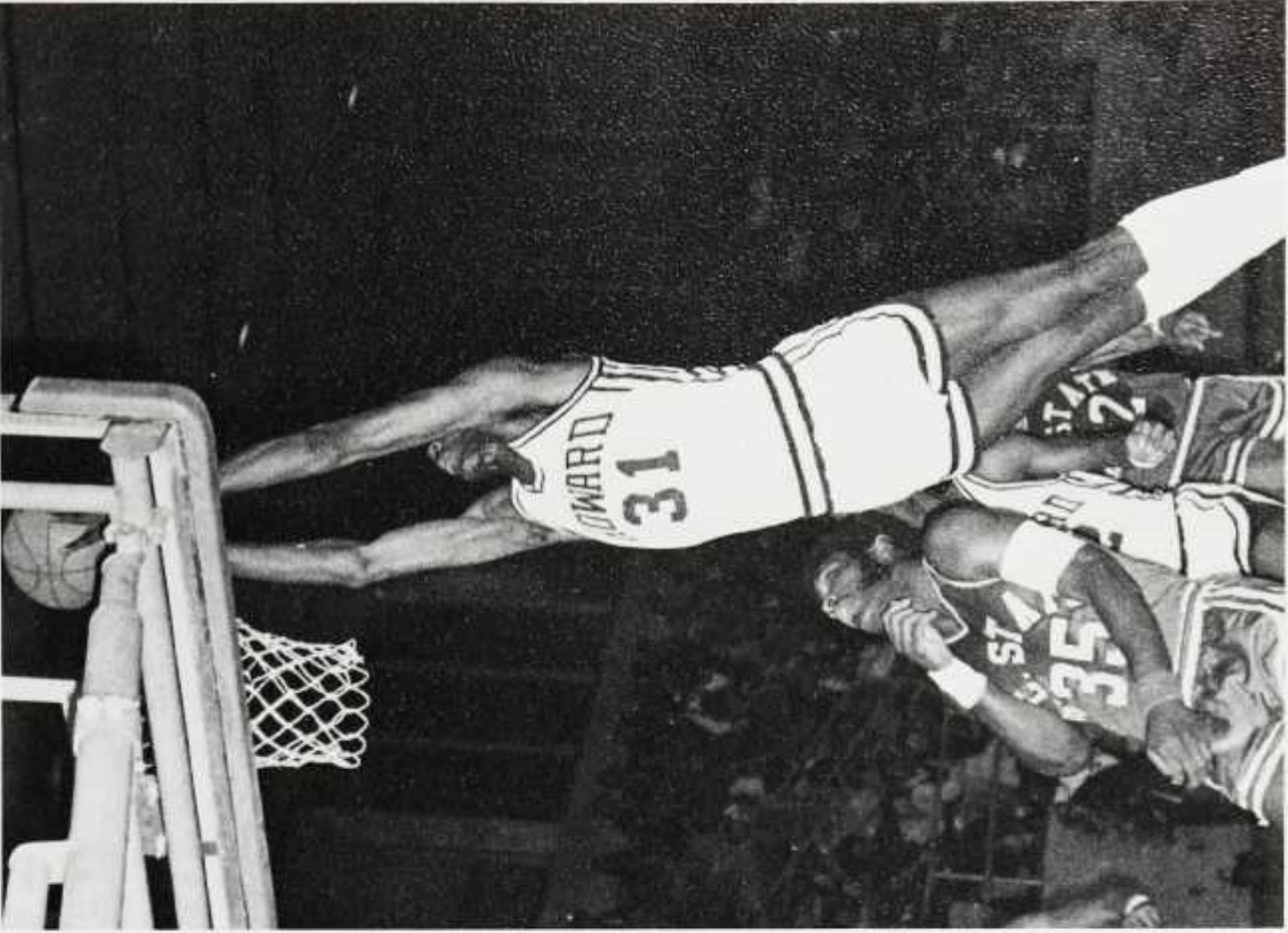


Mike Nettles (#31) and Tyrone Hart (#21) stretch for the rebound as All-MEAC Vadnay Cotton (#30) looks on.

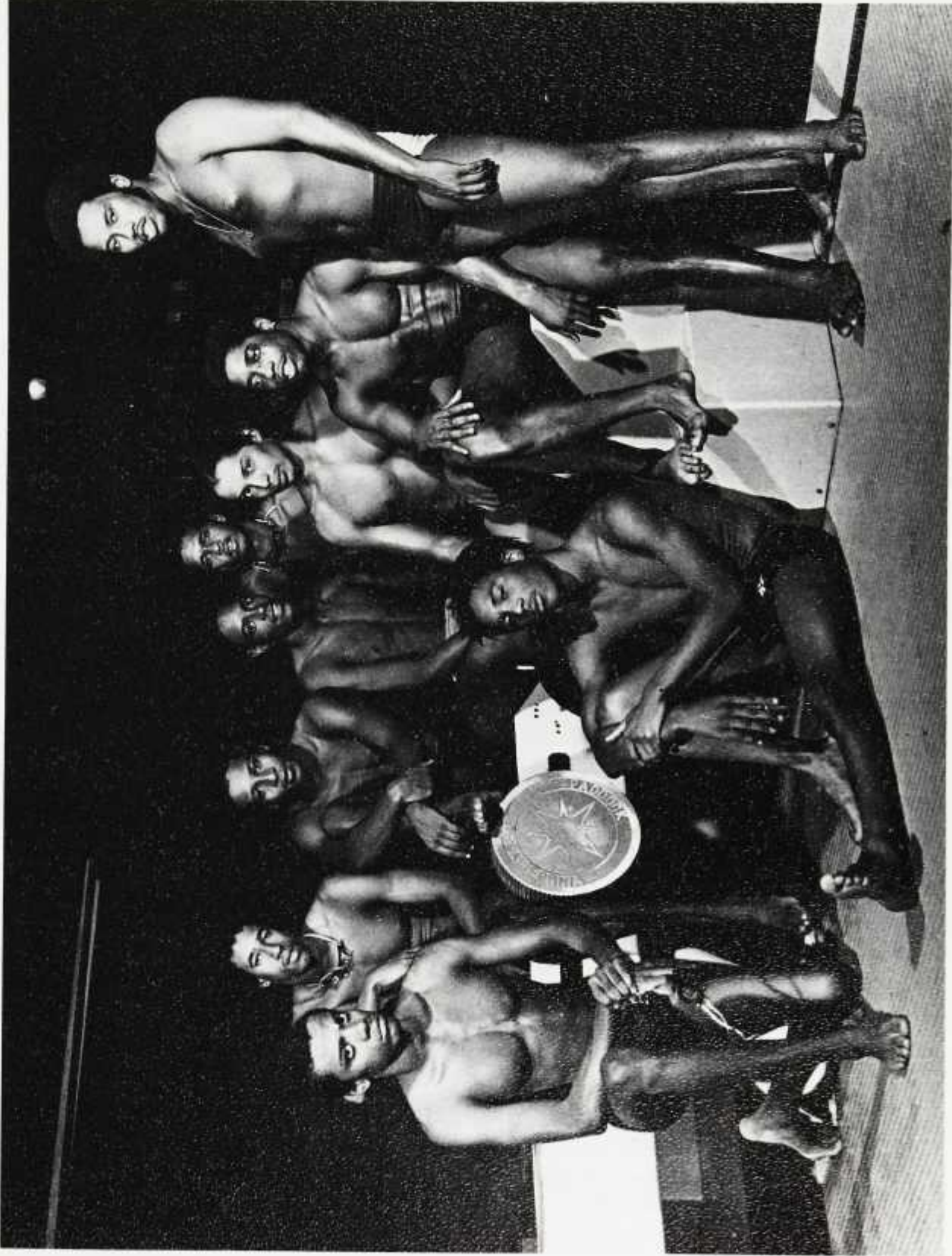

# Gymnastics Team



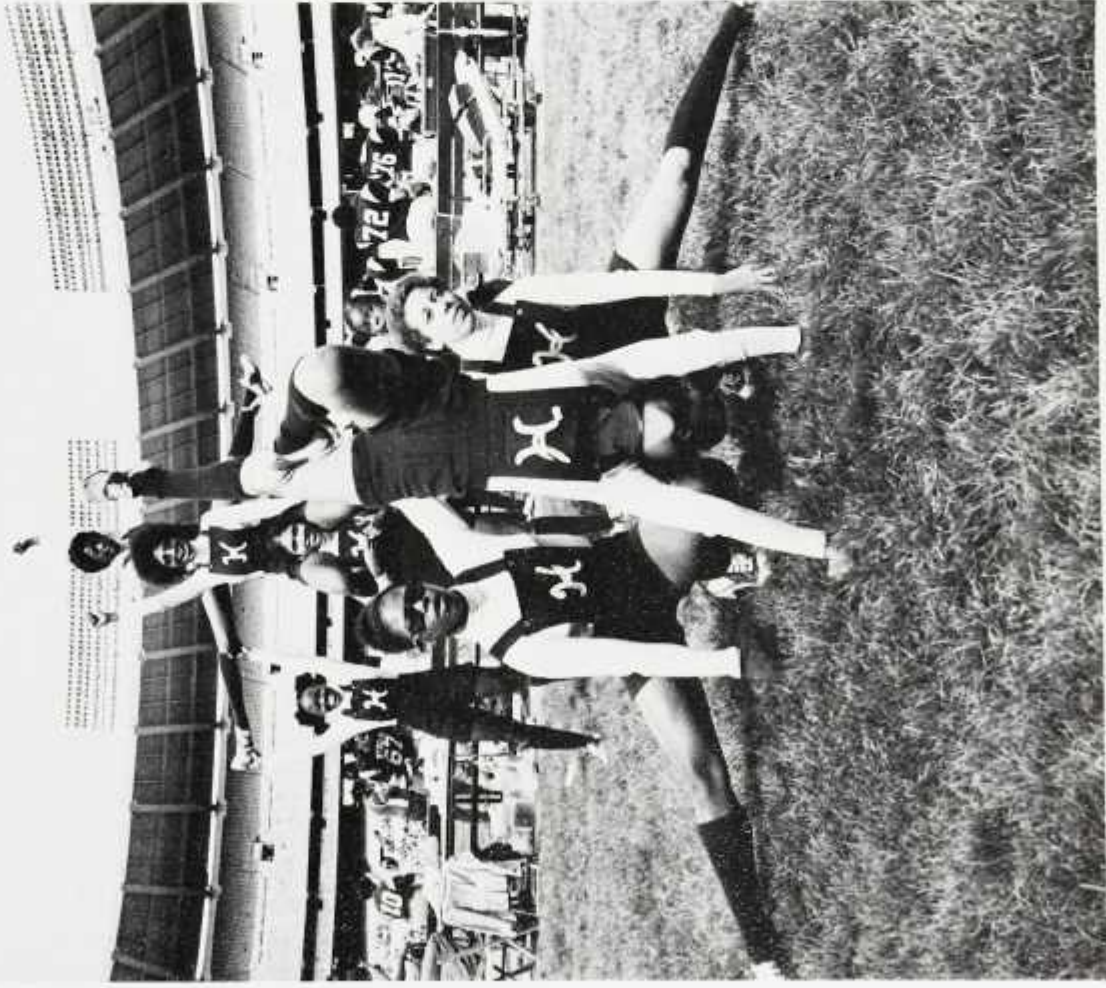

# WHUR

- Acquiring new vending machines for the Student Lounge

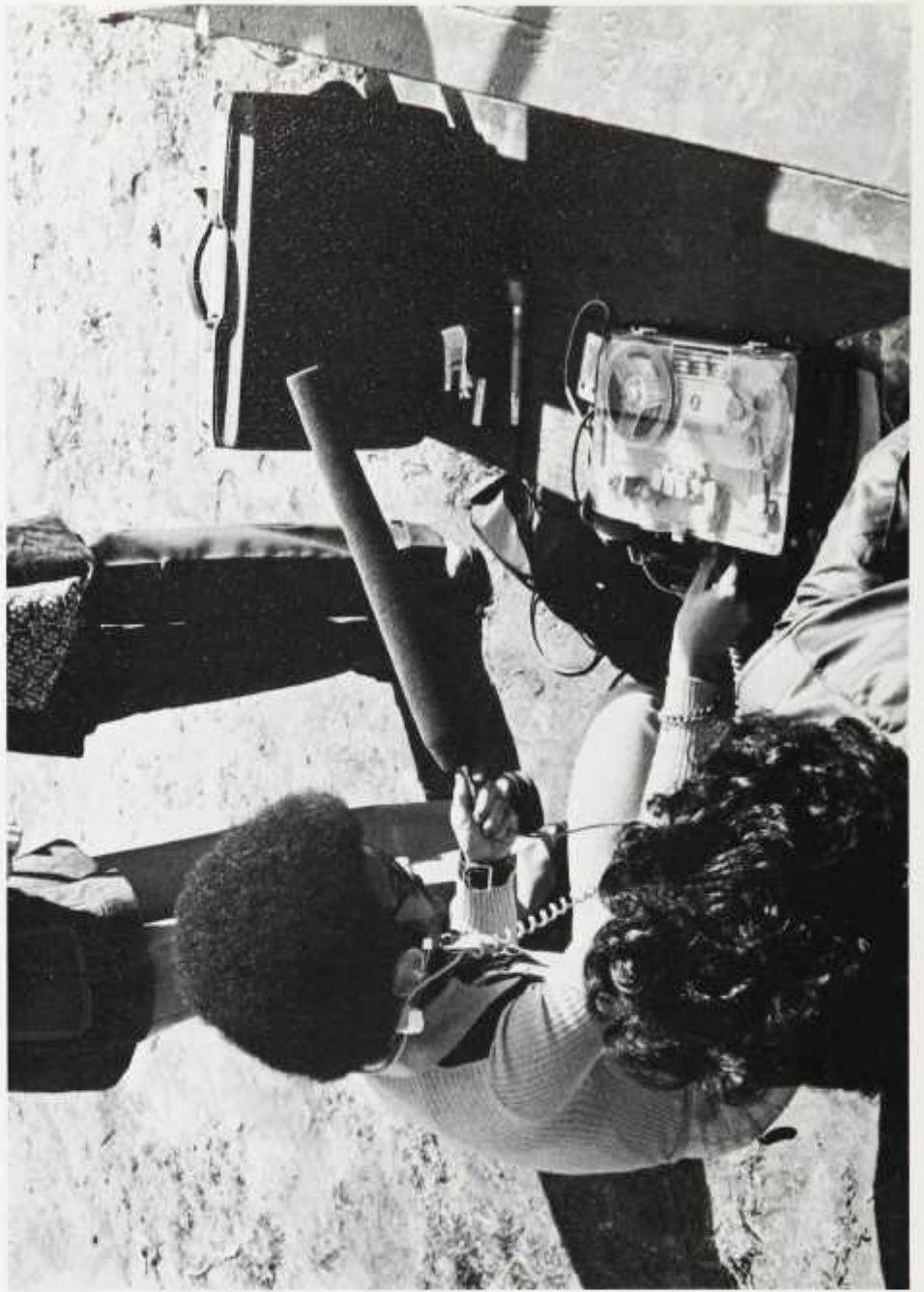

# College Of Dentistry



In the last nine years thirty-three innovative programs have been developed at the college of Dentistry. Among the new programs are those which enable the dental student to render health care to the home borne as well as centers and hospitals. These opportunities sensitize the dental student to work in community hospitals and other areas where dentists are badly needed.

The recent court ruling which stated that businesses or schools should never take a position from a white applicant who is more qualified than a minority applicant increases the college of Dentistry's responsibility to provide a wider range of educational opportunities for Blacks to gain dental training. The College of Dentistry will meet this challenge through the diversity of its present programs and those projected for the future. Recently the college has been awarded a 9.1 million dollar federal grant which must be matched by 1.8 million dollars in matching funds which are to be used to better the educational facilities which at the present time are among the finest in the country.

## The "Hydro-Papa"

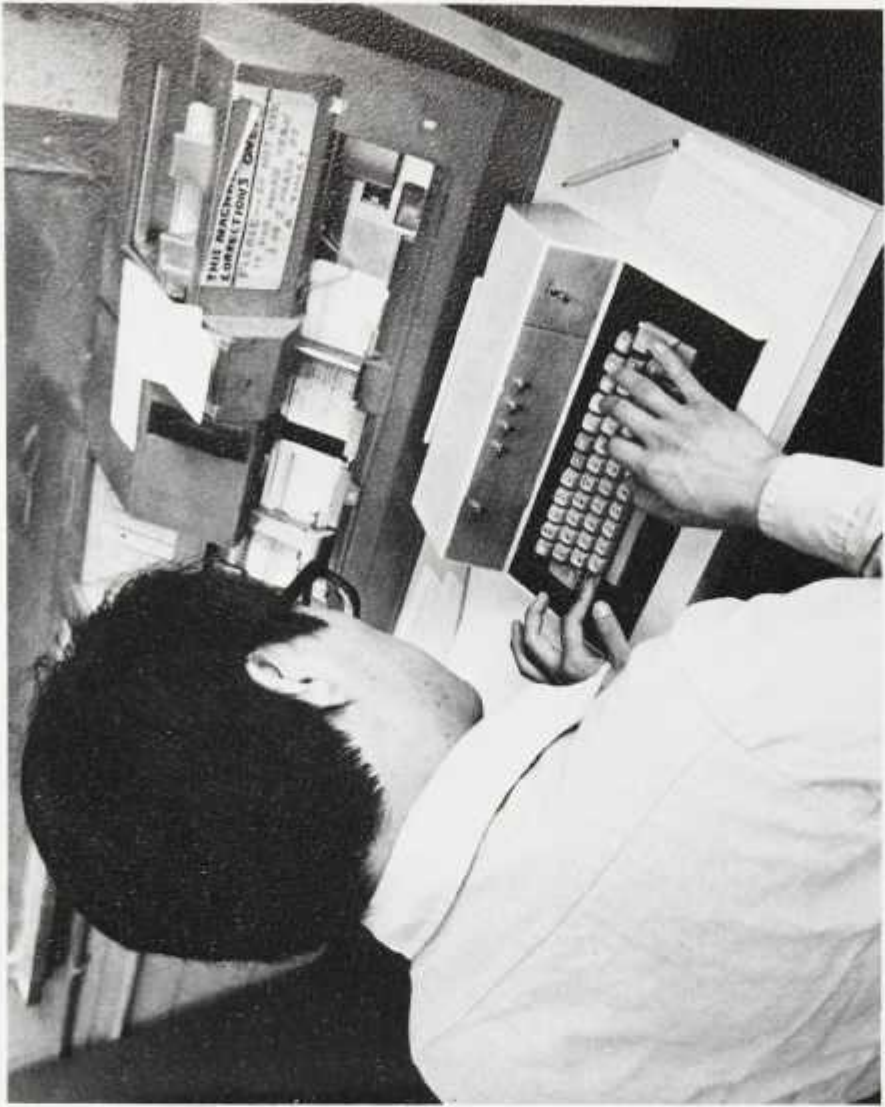

The original objective of the College of Medicine was to prepare students for the general practice of medicine, and to provide a resource in the basic sciences for the education for the university's student in Dentistry and Pharmacy. In keeping with the increasing demand for specialization, the tremendous growth of medicine as a science, and the widening of horizons revealed by research in the bio-physical and social sciences, the objectives of the College of Medicine have been expanded. In medicine, the college provides the environment for learning by undergraduate medical student, interns, residents, graduate and fellows. In the paramedical fields, the faculty provides opportunities for learning by technicians and aids within the College of Medicine and the Hospital.

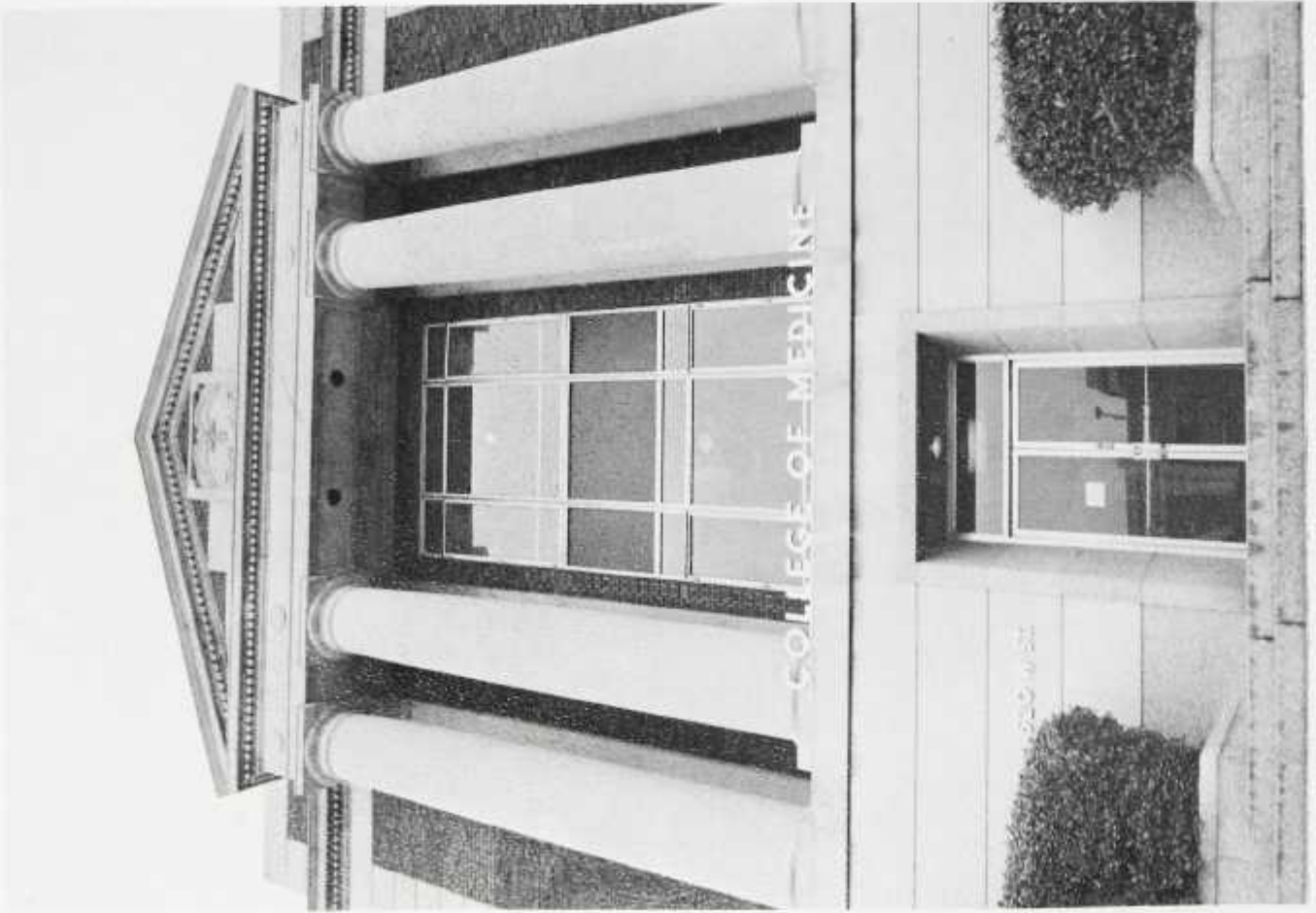














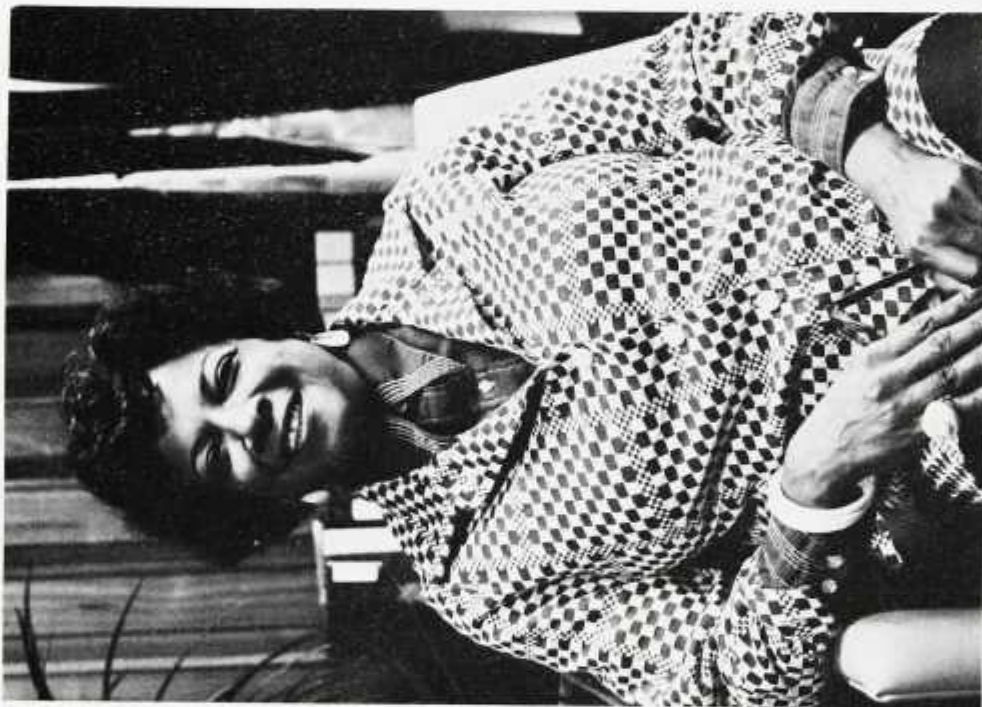




# School of Nursing

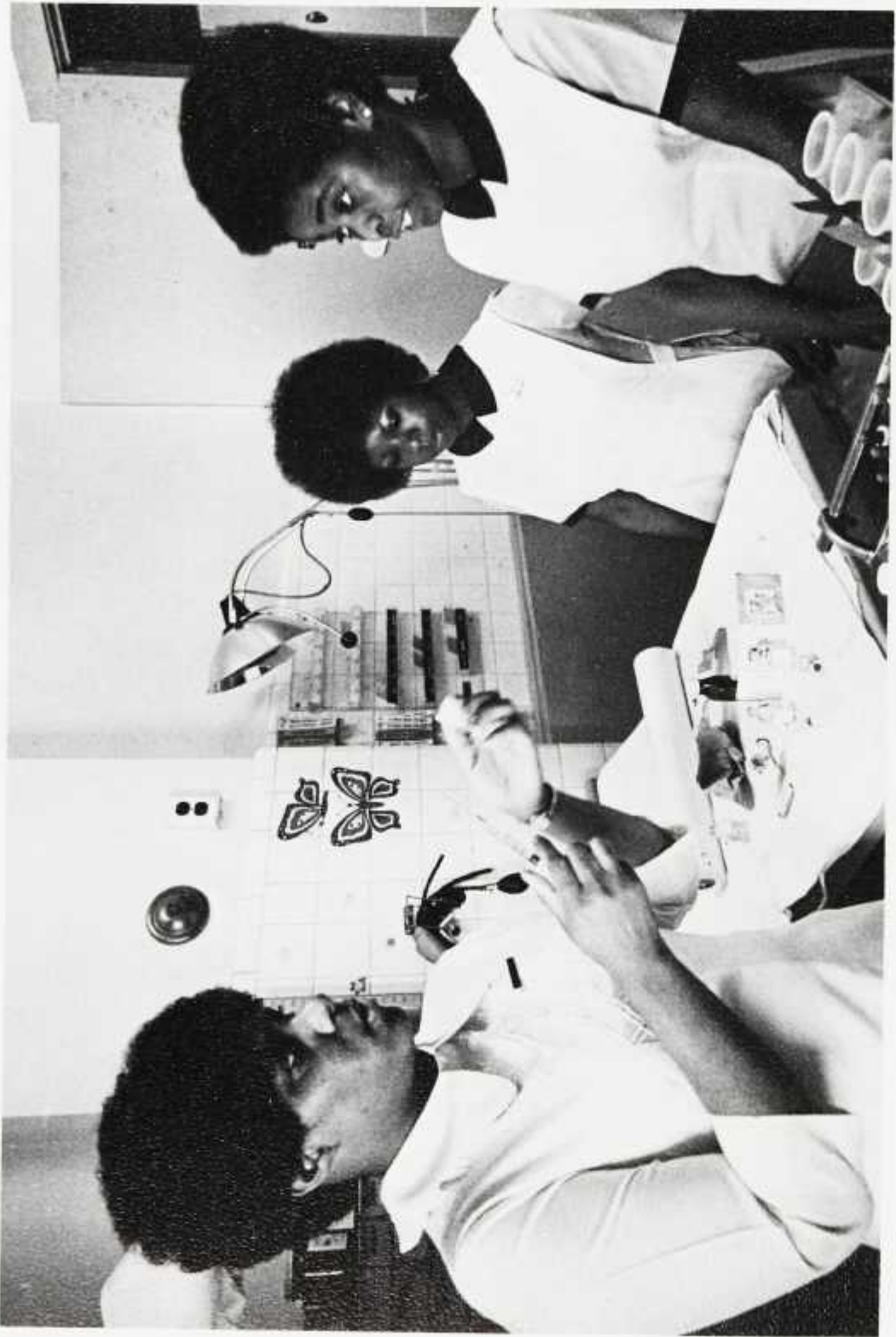

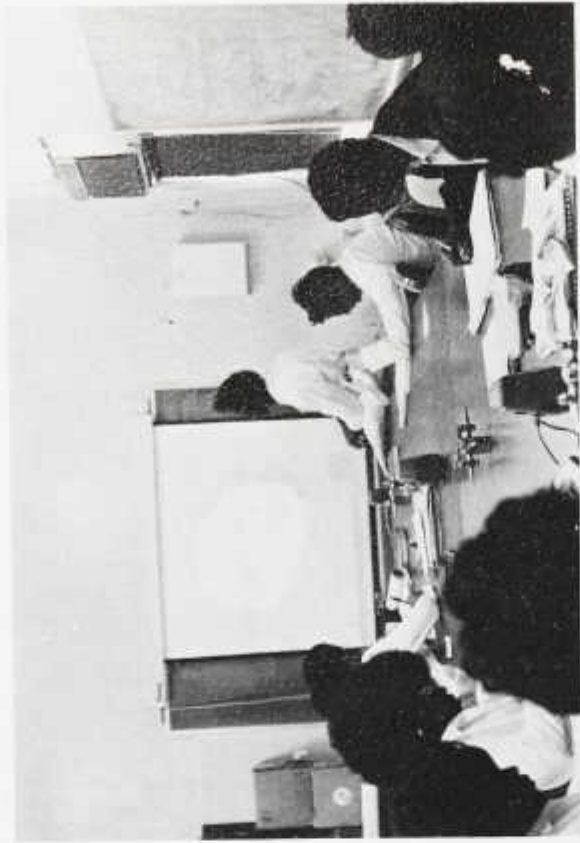

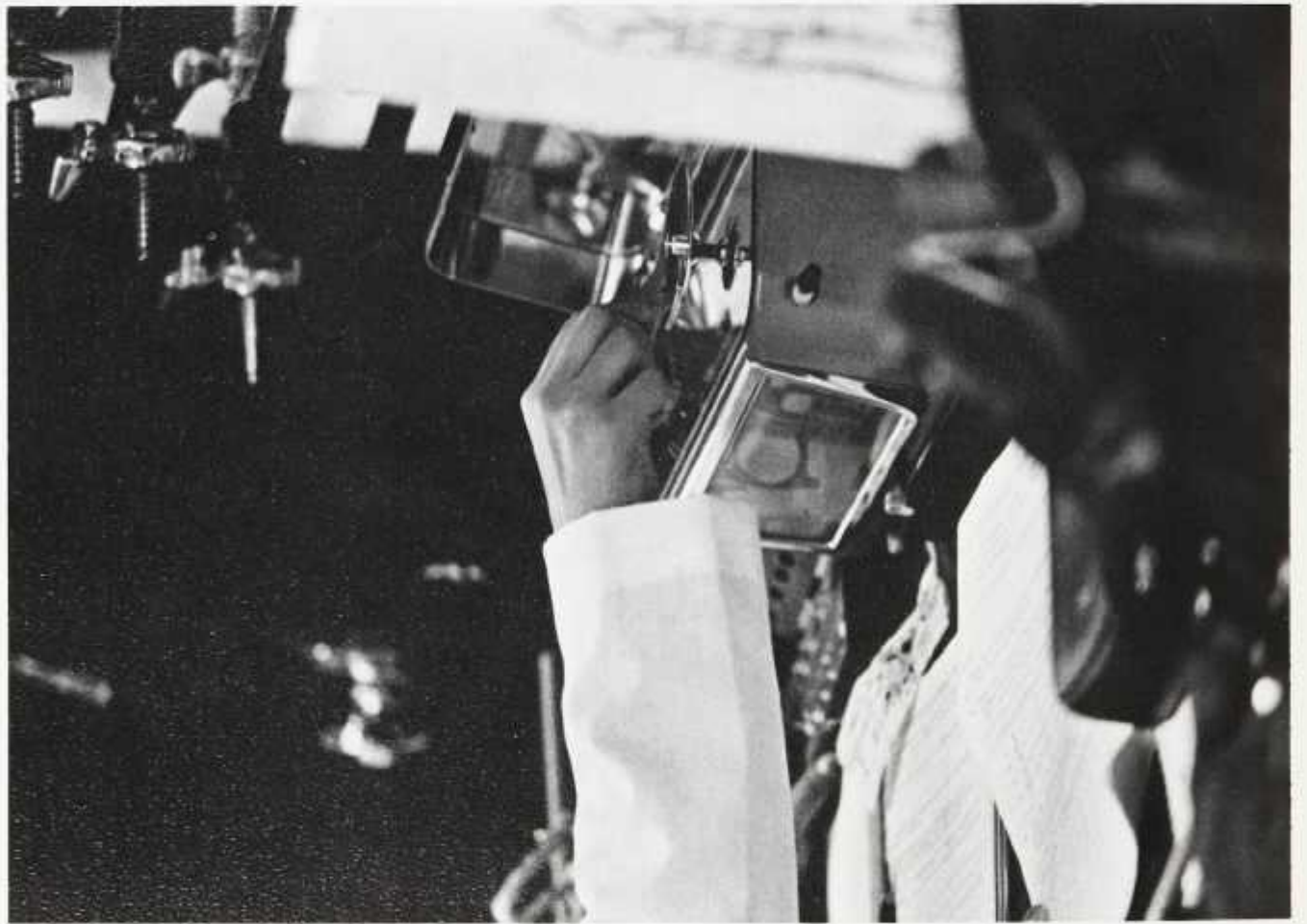

# School Of Religion

Talbot O. Shaw, acting Dean of the School of Religion states, "My belief is that any attempt at defining Black identity must include the Black Church. The Black Church has influenced the Black family, Black politics, Black economics, Black education and the notion of self worth."

The School of Religion's role is that of helping the student understand who he is coupled with what his potential is. The school requires all it's students to take courses in the Black experience as it relates to the Church and the rest of the world as well. Religion students are also required to take courses in Black heritage.

Dean Shaw feels that Howard is working toward becoming a community oriented university, although there are some areas that need improvement. "The School should make the community more aware of its resources, so that they might be utilized by people in the community", states Dean Shaw. He also said that steps should be taken to create a cooperative approach to Black education within the University so that one day Social Work, Law School, School of Religion, Department of History might have an inter-acting curriculum.

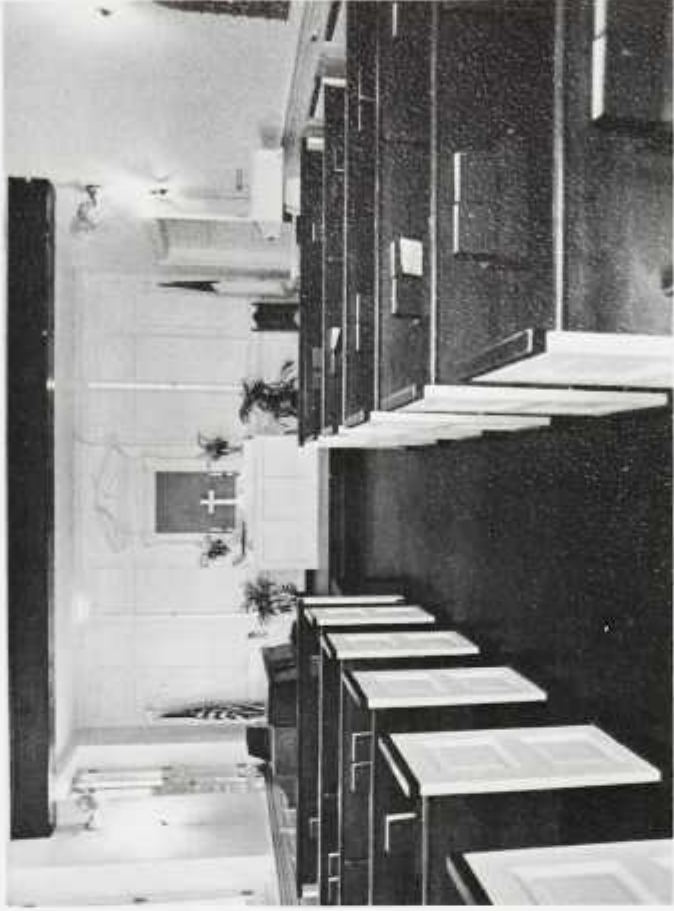

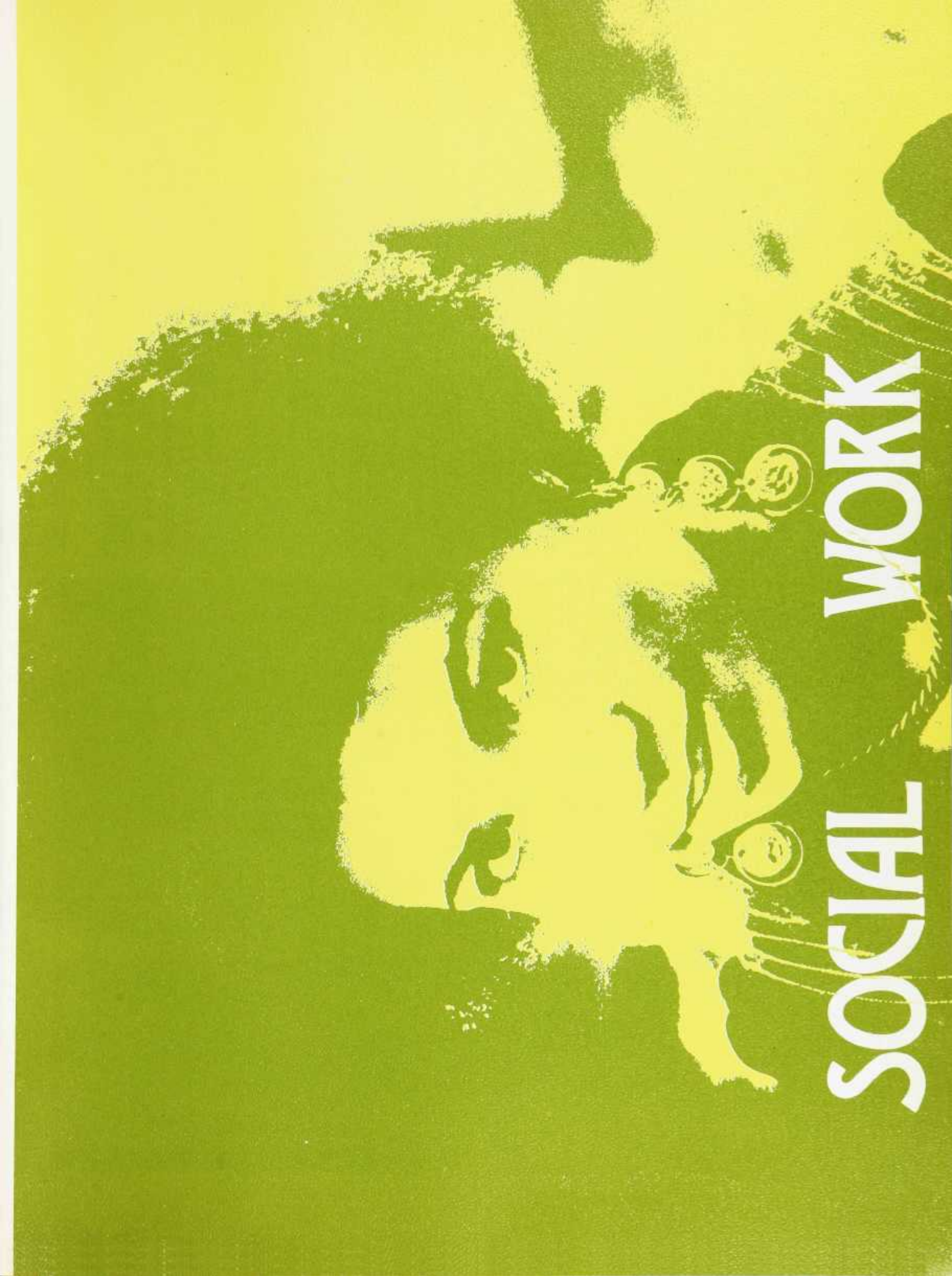

# School Of Social Work

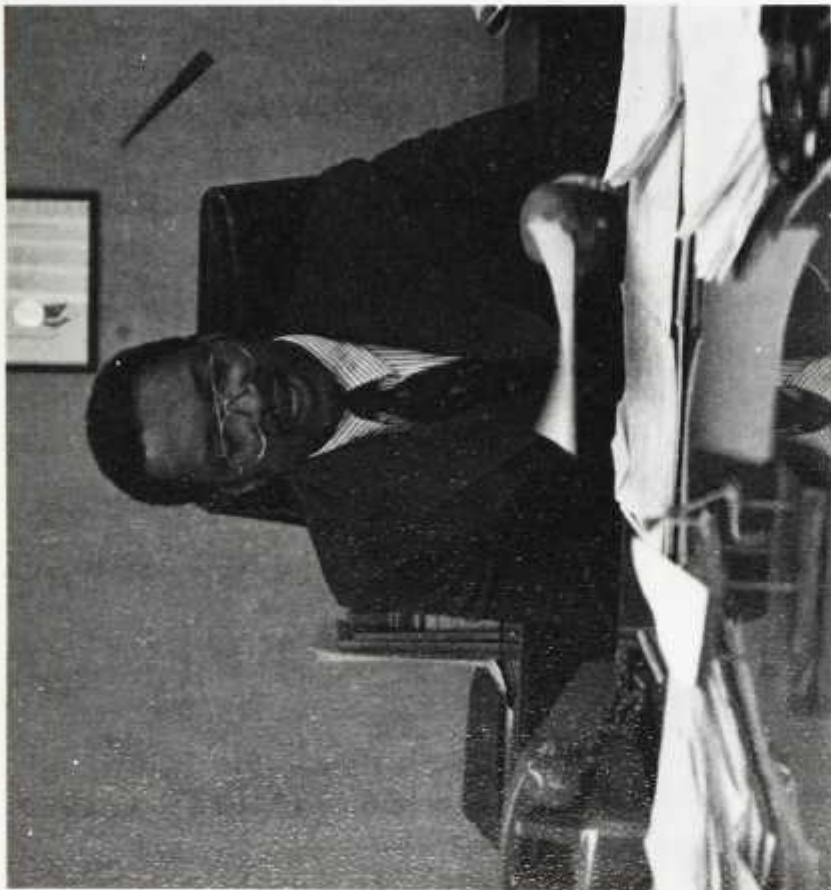
The School of Social Work must expand its programs and offerings in meeting its obligations to the community, and in continuing to train social work professionals at the highest levels of competence. Toward these ends, our objectives over the present academic year and for the next few years are as follows:

- 1) The establishment and implementation of our Continuing Education Program that was approved by the Board of Trustees in December, 1974. Our first offering will go forth in the Spring and Summer of 1975.
- 2) The establishment of a Ph.D. program in Social Welfare at the School. Our proposal for this will be sent to the Graduate Council and Board of Trustees, this Spring.
- 3) Further work and development of a Bachelor of Social Welfare degree program in cooperation with the College of Liberal Arts.
- 4) The further development of an International Program, continuing the start we made in Jamaica during the Summer of 1974. Plans include practicum for our student in the Caribbean and in Africa.

Dean Chun states, "Our overall objective within the context of the above is for excellence in all of our programs and efforts, and to be of service to the Black community as we train professional social workers, competent to deal with the many complex problems within society."

# Howard University Hospital

Now standing on Howard's campus, amidst the scene of Washington, is this glassy edifice. It is the Howard University Hospital, a modern full-service teaching facility, that features twenty-three research laboratories, seventeen service laboratories and twelve main operating rooms. The hospital is a seven-story, five hundred-bed, 632,707 square-foot building that replaces Freedmen's Hospital. All patient rooms are either private or semi-private. Other facilities include small group teaching rooms, a modern auditorium, spacious dining quarters, an audio-visual system, and numerous student laboratories.

The new hospital will continue to be the teaching hospital of Howard University. As proclaimed by mayor Walter E. Washington, "The Howard University Hospital will continue Freedmen's commitment to the health needs of our citizens, and to the training of dedicated and responsible health professionals who will take their medical talents to underserved communities throughout our nation and the world.





**Dr. Frank M. Snowden, Jr.,  
Professor of Classics  
College of Liberal Arts**

Dr. Snowden has served Howard University in various capacities - Professor, Chairman of a Department, Director of University Continuing Education, Dean of the College of Liberal Arts. He has achieved magnificently at the University in each of the charges given him, but his zenith has been reached as Professor of Classics. ### Liberal Arts

Dr. William A. Banner, Professor of Philosophy

For more than a score of years, Dr. Banner has stimulated a cognitive strength in students at Howard University by his inspiring lectures and counsel to students enrolled in his classes in Philosophy. Throughout the years, his name has appeared on outstanding teaching lists of students, peers and administrators. He is unusually dedicated to the ideals of excellence in teaching.

### College of Medicine

Dr. Henry Lloyd Garvey, Asst. Professor of Pharmacology

Dr. Garvey brings to Howard University a varied background of educational expertise. He is an energetic man sometimes being described by his students as enthusiastic. He possesses the ability to relate to students on both educational and social levels, and does not subscribe to the "greater than thou" philosophy often existing between the faculty and students. Dr. Garvey feels that many of Howard's medical students lack the confidence vitally needed in the medical profession. He advises students to be strong and confident and works daily to help them build this confidence. Dr. Garvey is held in highest esteem by medical students and was chosen one of the instructors most influential in their evolution to physicianhood.

Dr. Walter Lester Henry, Professor of Medicine

As former head of the Department of Medicine at Howard University, Dr. Henry is respected and admired by students and peers for the depth and scope of his command of internal medicine. With endocrinology as his subspecialty field, he is viewed as an authority on such diseases as diabetes mellitus and thyroidism. Though a quiet, easygoing and unassuming man, his mastery and amazing recall of the principles of both basic and clinical sciences adequately and powerfully testify to his thorough grasp of the etiology and course of the pathological process. He is armed with knowledge, tempered by experience and guided by the high ideals of medicine.

The number of practicing physicians today who have been inspired by the quality of his instruction is too numerous to count. He represents a high level of thinking and concern that gives honor to his specialty.

Dr. Willie Turner, Chairman, Department of Microbiology

The Department of Microbiology has been often characterized by students as one of the most "together" departments in the College of Medicine. This is due to superb instruction and organization under the guidance of its Chairman, Dr. Willie Turner. He explains that he has kept his department together by recruiting Blacks who really want to be in a Black institution and give of themselves to students without compromising standards of excellence.

Dr. Turner's practical down-to-earth philosophy dictates, "You got to get yourself together or you will be in a heap of trouble." Through living and transmitting this philosophy to others, Dr. Turner is well-respected by students, faculty, staff, and the medical community at large. As students say, "Dr. Turner is really an alright dude!"

### College of Nursing

Mrs. Nancy Mulder, Asst. Professor of Maternal Child Nursing

Mrs. Nancy Mulder was awarded a Masters of Science degree in Maternal-Newborn Nursing from the University of Maryland in 1973. She has been a faculty member of the College of Nursing for the past three years. Mrs. Mulder has been one of the dynamic forces toward the development of professional nurses. Mrs. Mulder has displayed concern for individual potential and has instilled in the minds of her students the importance in providing quality patient care. These qualities have indeed distinguished her as an outstanding Faculty member.

Ms. Grace Jarrett, Instructor of Community Mental Health Nursing

Ms. Jarrett received her Bachelors of Science degree in nursing cum laude, from Hunter College, New York. She received her M.S. degree in the Administration of Community Health Services and Maternal Child Nursing from Columbia University and is currently enrolled in a doctoral program at Catholic University. Ms. Jarrett is a certified midwife and was honored in November 1974 for her outstanding volunteer services as a "Big Sister" to emotionally disturbed children. As an instructor in Community Mental Health Nursing for one year she has been an ideal advisor as well as a friend to nursing students.

### College of Pharmacy and Pharmacal Sciences

Dr. Samuel M. Herman-Ackah, Professor of Pharmacy

Dr. Herman-Ackah excels in presenting orderly and clear instructional materials for students; encouraging and answering questions eagerly and expertly; and demonstrating mastery of complex subject matter such as biopharmaceutics and pharmacokinetics, while doing so with sufficient clarity as to stimulate learning among his students. He represents scholarship and excellence in both teaching and research activities.



# Class History-1971-75

A lot of us could hardly wait to get to Howard in 1971, after pacing through the fiery Sixties when all eyes were focused on the universities and we sat in high school classrooms. But when we arrived there were no riots left to be led, no speakers on the steps of the Mordecai Wyatt Johnson Administration building to cheer on, no effigies to burn.

1971 started out a sleepy year, with time to adjust to living away from home, cooking on one-burner hot plates, always taking showers and never baths, and to twenty-four hour visitations and coed dormitories.

What we did arrive to was a housing shortage, so much so that many of us remember our first days at Howard on cots in the lobbies of Tubman Quadrangle and Meridian. We were given a student government budget of \$300,000, the second largest in the nation. The traditional homecoming queen was overlooked for it was the year when everyone was hoping to "Free Angela". Instead there was an honorary homecoming court with three sisters signifying red, black and green.

Howard scored a breakthrough that year in the field of communications when the first Black school of communications opened on this campus along with the student formed National Black Communications Society, WHUR (Howard University Radio) 96.3 FM became the first Black controlled station in the metropolitan area. Meanwhile, Robert Taylor, Hilltop Editor-in-Chief, was getting raves about the Hilltop. He would go on to become News Editor at WHUR. In one of its more controversial issues, the Hilltop attacked integrated couples on the campus in a picture essay so dramatic, that it led to the disappearance of such relationships.

The spirit was one of community cooperativeness. Hundreds of Howard students spent a Saturday cleaning up the streets, alleys and neighborhoods of the District

Ground was broken for the new hospital which we were to see completed last semester.

And it was a year of firsts: The Liberal Arts Student Council sponsored its first Career Day; Howard captured all four Ward One seats at the National Black Political Convention in Gary, Indiana. The Black Caucus gave its first benefit dinner and the Bisons gained their first mid-Eastern Conference victory. Following their predecessors' steps, ninety students went to Mississippi to campaign for Black candidates.

Unfortunately, all memories cannot be good ones. The freshman class lost two members: Helena Gail Richardson, 18 from Jamaica, New York; and Julian Keith Weekes, 18, son of a Howard alumnus.

The 1972 school year began in a political fury as HUSA president, Charles Hall, resigned in October, only to be reinstated in November. Four basketball players left the school over grievances with Coach Emery who was removed this year. The National Collegiate Athletic Association stripped the soccer team of its hard-earned 1971 Intercollegiate Championship trophy.

Students protested to save Black Journal, one of the few Black national shows on public television, produced by Howard's Dean of the School of Communications, Tony Brown. And a national strategy was developed to Save Black Schools at A & T University in Greensboro, North Carolina.

The sophomore class lost another member, this time its president, Horoid W. Jackson, who was killed on his way back to school for the fall term.

Many students boycotted classes in protest of the two students killed at Southern University.

The next year saw us still fighting to preserve Howard, as students marched on the Capitol in silent protest against the Reorganization Act which would have placed the school under the control of the District of Columbia.

It was also the year when two young Black girls in Salem Alabama were sterilized in a family planning clinic of OEO. Dr. Frances Weising, noted Howard University psychiatrist, had her Cress Theory of Color Confrontation brought to national attention.

Mayor Walter Washington, a Howard alumnus, declared October 23, Howard-Morgan Day, recognizing the traditional football rivalry between the schools.

In the College of Fine Arts, students were outraged when the School of Music, the only Black music school in the United States was made a department in the College of Fine Arts. The Law School faculty approached the teamsters union to negotiate with its administration. Three deans were asked to resign - the School of Religion, Social Work and in the Graduate School. Ezekiel Mobley, Editor-in-Chief of the Hilltop was suspended and reinstated that next week.

Black students saw the light and denounced streaking, unlike their enthusiastic white counterparts at the University of Maryland, The Dunbarton campus, at Connecticut and Van Ness Streets, N.W., became the site of the new Law School.

This year saw students as hard hit by the waning economy as the rest of the nation. Dormitory and food service prices increased.

Student politics and student politicians were as tumultuous as ever. HUSA President, Victor Bryant fired four key staff members and rehired them the next month. Bryant also accused a staff member of assault with a deadly weapon as the story deepened. It took HUSA until the end of the semester to ratify the constitution.

Radio students were up in arms, charging WHUR with noncompliance with the FCC as their charter says the station has a dual function, one of which is to serve as a training laboratory for students.

The Hilltop saw its first female editor in over five years when Frankie Reed assumed the job after the resignation of Jawanza McIntyre.

The Soccer team finally received the honor it was due capturing the NCAA championship by beating St. Louis in their own stadium, in an atmosphere of racial tension.

Students from the Schools of Business and Communication attended the 74th National Business League convention in Atlanta on the theme, the Power of Unity. The National Conference of Afro-American Writers was held right here on the Campus.

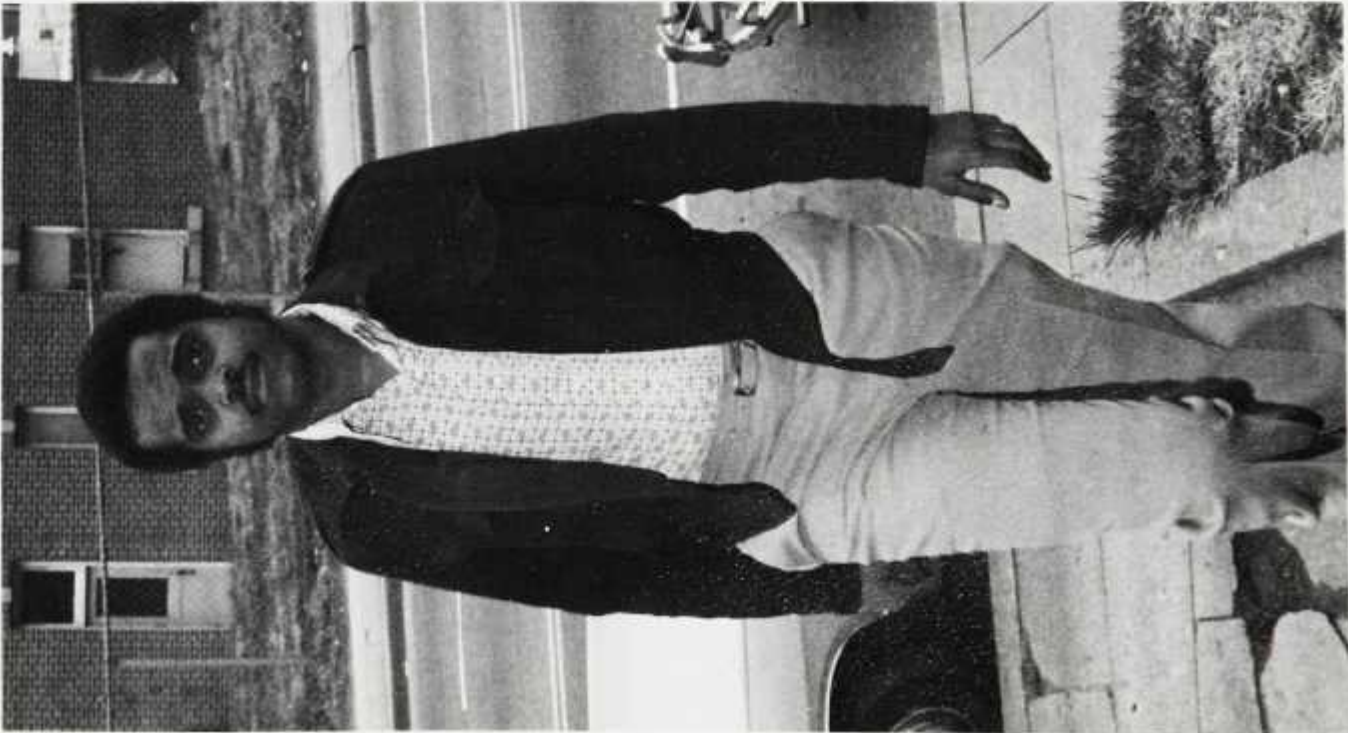
