Imagine this advertisement: "Fully furnished apartments with brand new appliances. Building features include 24-hour security, computer lab, conference room and a turn of the century, southern style lounge open to all residents." Then, throw in the fact that the Prince George's Plaza Mall is directly across the street.

If you think this is a listing for a luxury condominium, then you'd be wrong. Instead, it is the Towers at University Town Center, a new development that introduces luxury living to student housing. The sixteen-floor apartment building features a rooftop pool that is set to open in the summer of 2007, with an outside deck to check out the awe inspiring view of Prince George's County. The Towers, or UTC, also boast a fully equipped gym, complete with weight area, tanning booths and personal monitors to track your progress when running on the treadmill. Oh, and you can't forget to mention the game room straight out of MTV Cribs.

UTC is home to undergraduate and graduate students from colleges and universities around the Washington, D.C. metro area. Opening its doors in August, the Towers became the first of the University Town Center development to debut. The development could not have come a moment too soon as, this school year, many Howard students opted to live off campus rather than in the dorms.

"On campus housing is not comfortable," said Rodney Young, a sophomore broadcast journalism major. "On campus there are too many rules, and if one person messes up, we all get punished." Many agree with Young and enjoy their plush alternative to living on campus. However, life at UTC is not all good times and state-of-the-art amenities like it may seem. Sophomore finance major Rohan Burgher picked up on one downside to living in the Towers. "A downfall is that it's far from campus," he said. "When you go to campus, you have to make sure you get everything done. It costs like \$50 a week in transportation."

Despite the twenty-minute ride it takes to get to the Shaw-Howard stop on the Metro's green line, the Towers are just a hop, skip and a jump away from the P.G. Plaza metro stop. "The green line is right here, and the mall is across the street," said junior mechanical engineering major Justian Rich. "I like it [here] because it's convenient and comfortable. Also, when I needed to transfer apartments, the leasing office was very accommodating."

It seems like everyone agrees, the Towers at University Town Center has it all. From its modern décor and new furnishings to its on-site gym, pool and game room, the Towers has everything a college student could ever wish, dream or hope for in student housing—a major upgrade from the traditional one-star conditions of on campus housing.

...for International Students

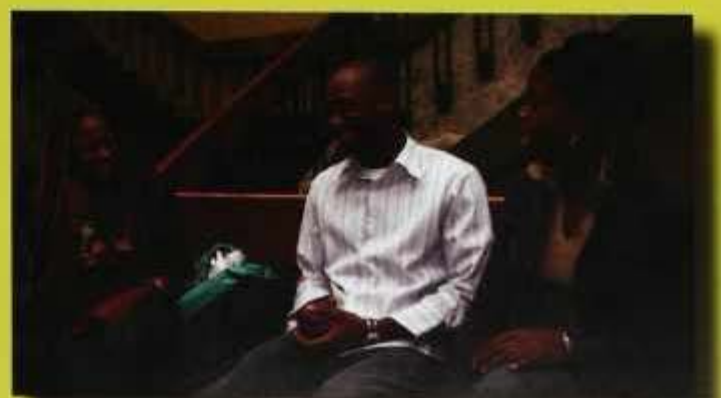

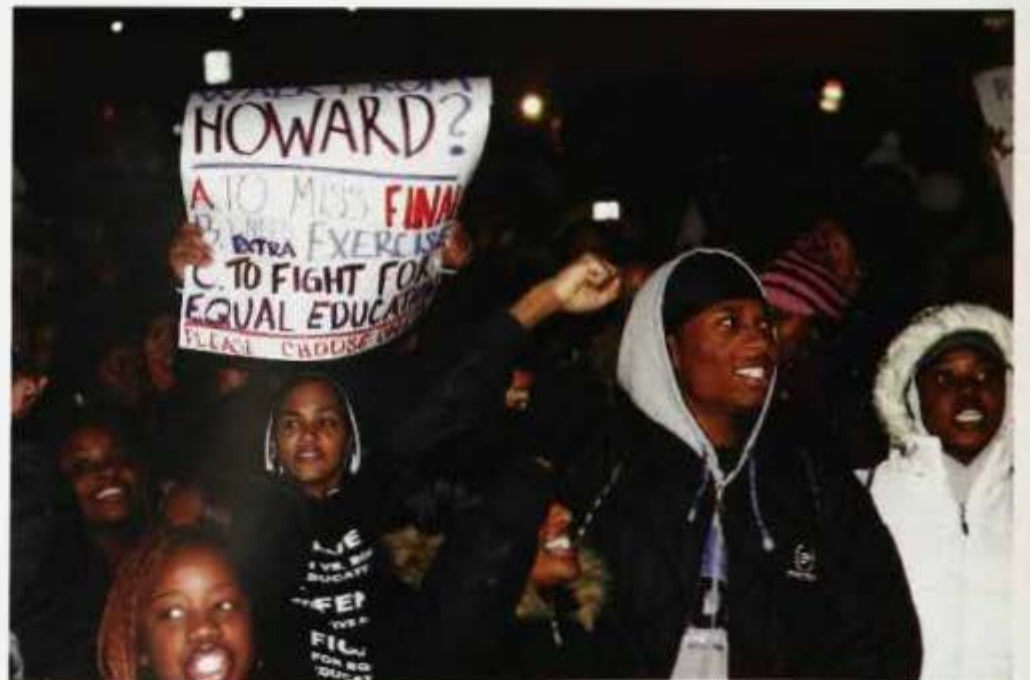
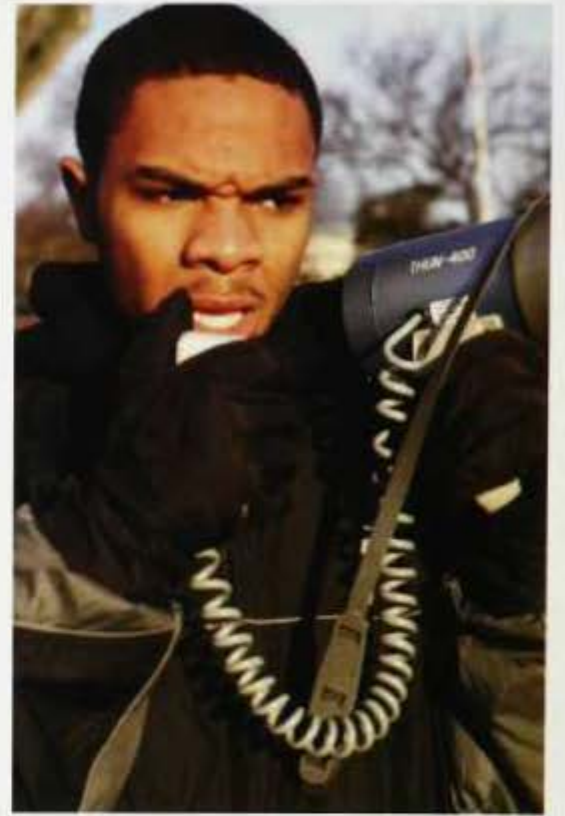

Within the past 5 years, President H. Patrick Swygert and the Board of Trustees have thrilled and delighted students across campus with an onslaught of new facilities and improvements to the University, including a spacious Howard University Bookstore (HUB) on Georgia Avenue, the Information Lab (I-Lab) @ Technology Center, the new and improved Punch Out, and perhaps the nicest facility on our campus, the Louis Stokes Health Sciences Library.

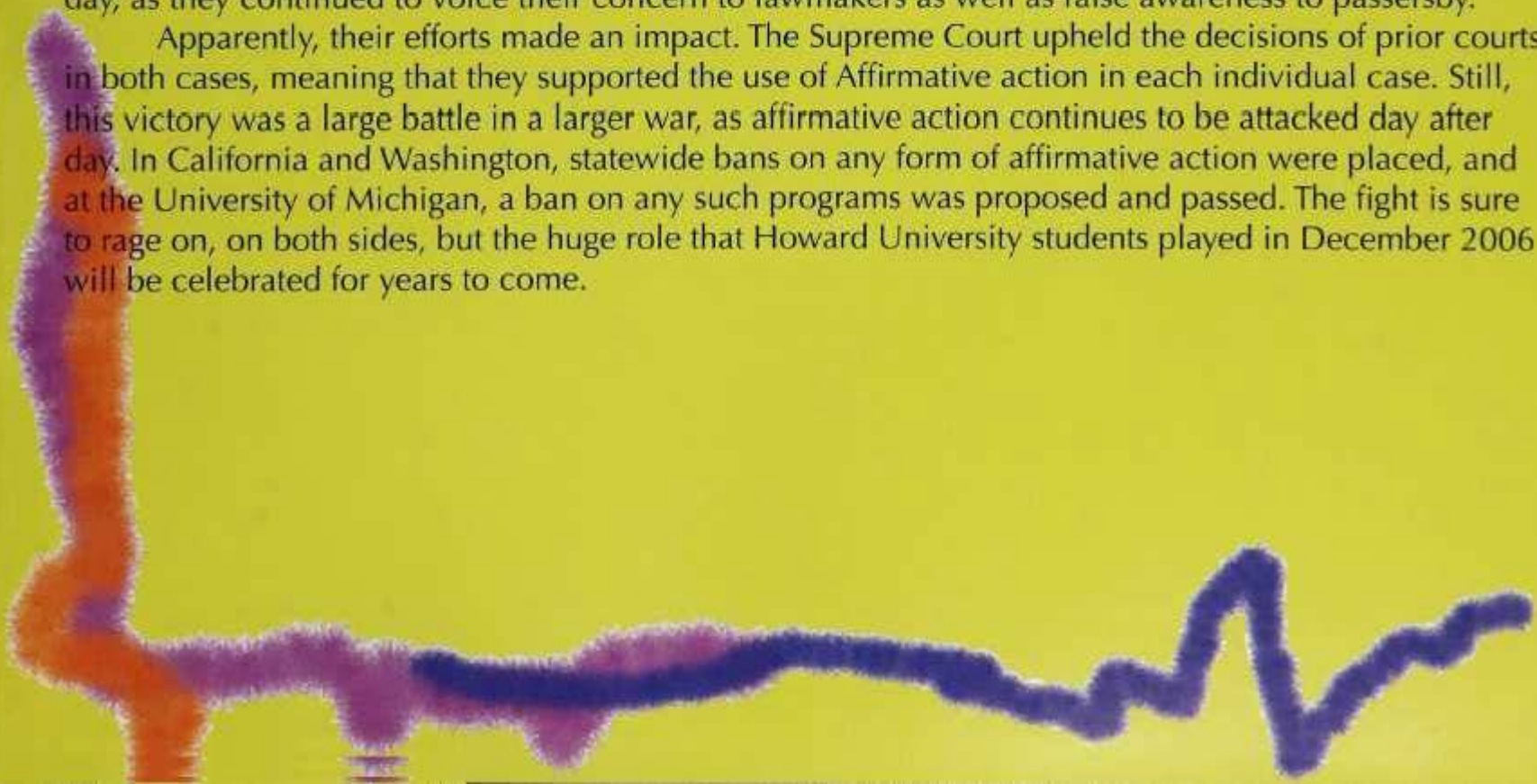

...at THE MARCH

Almost since 1867, when Howard University was founded, students here have been practicing activists, protesting and speaking out against the wrongs of the world. Recently, we have been accused of apathy, having lost that original militant spirit. On December 4, 2006 however, these accusations were shattered as HU students flocked to the "Black Monday" march on Washington. Organized by civil rights group BAMN (By Any Means Necessary), the march aimed to defend the 1954 landmark decision of *Brown v. Board of Education*, as the Supreme Court again reexamined desegregation and affirmative action in the schools. In that court case 53 years ago, the idea of "separate but equal" was abolished and the nation's highest court moved to desegregate American public schools, simultaneously spawning the Affirmative Action movement. On the day of the march, the Supreme Court was to decide on two cases, *Meredith v. Jefferson County Public Schools*, and *Parents Involved in Community Schools v. Seattle School District*, considering whether or not the programs implemented as a result of the 1954 case were still legal and relevant over 50 years later.

Spearheaded by members of UGSA, who dressed in all black with black and white face paint in order to raise awareness prior to the march, Howard students became very active in the protest, making up a large amount of the 5000 total marchers that were present. The day began around 5:00 am on Howard's campus, and continued to the National Mall where a rally was held. For Junior broadcast journalism major Natalie Wilson, the day was especially poignant. "I was there to cover it for Spotlight, [a program on WHUT], and it was a very powerful day. From the moment people stepped off the bus, they began chanting and holding up wooden signs. It looked like a huge human chain". Protesters could be heard shouting "Integration Now, Segregation Never" and other such chants throughout the day, as they continued to voice their concern to lawmakers as well as raise awareness to passersby.

Apparently, their efforts made an impact. The Supreme Court upheld the decisions of prior courts in both cases, meaning that they supported the use of Affirmative action in each individual case. Still, this victory was a large battle in a larger war, as affirmative action continues to be attacked day after day. In California and Washington, statewide bans on any form of affirmative action were placed, and at the University of Michigan, a ban on any such programs was proposed and passed. The fight is sure to rage on, on both sides, but the huge role that Howard University students played in December 2006 will be celebrated for years to come.

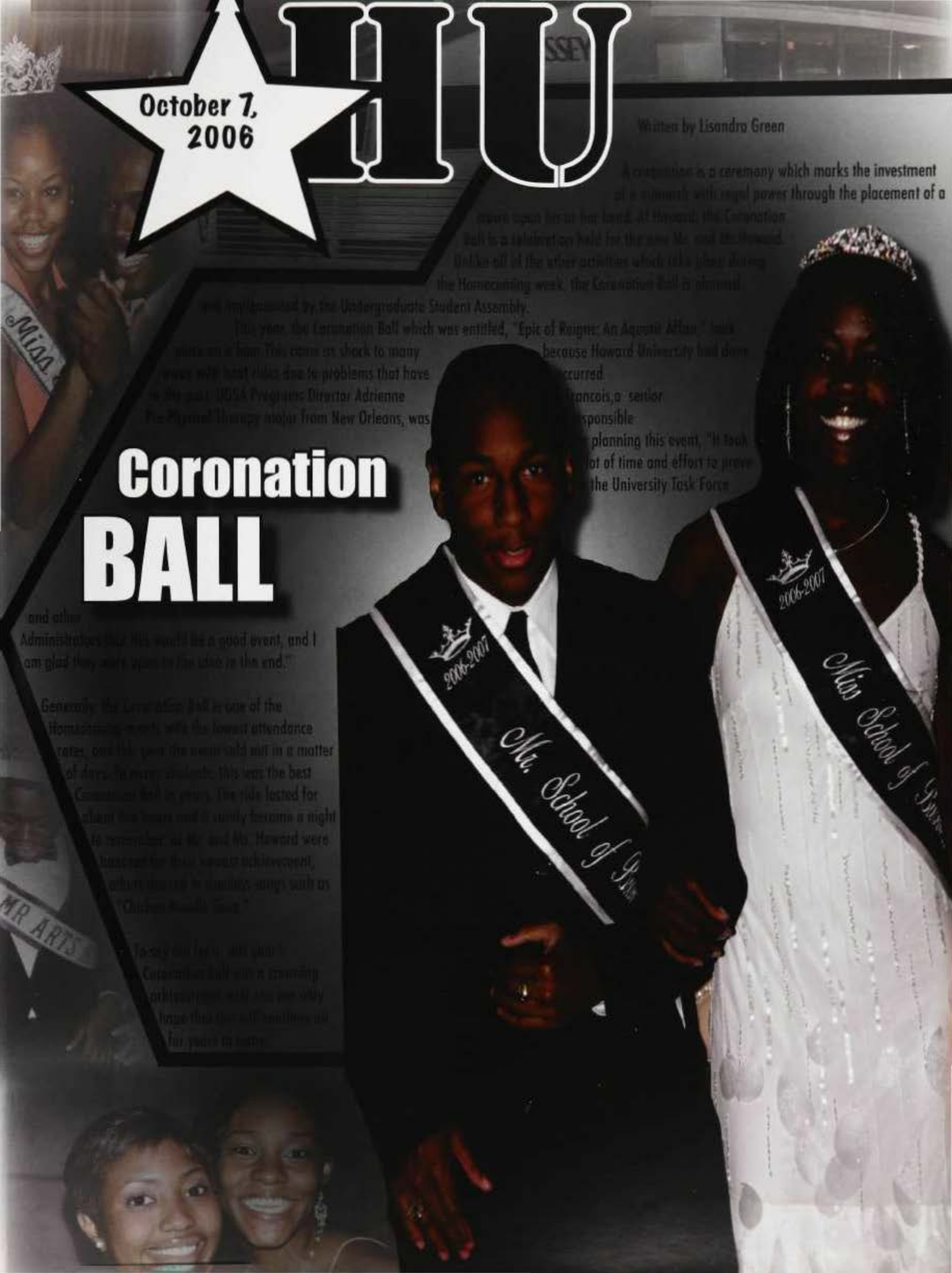
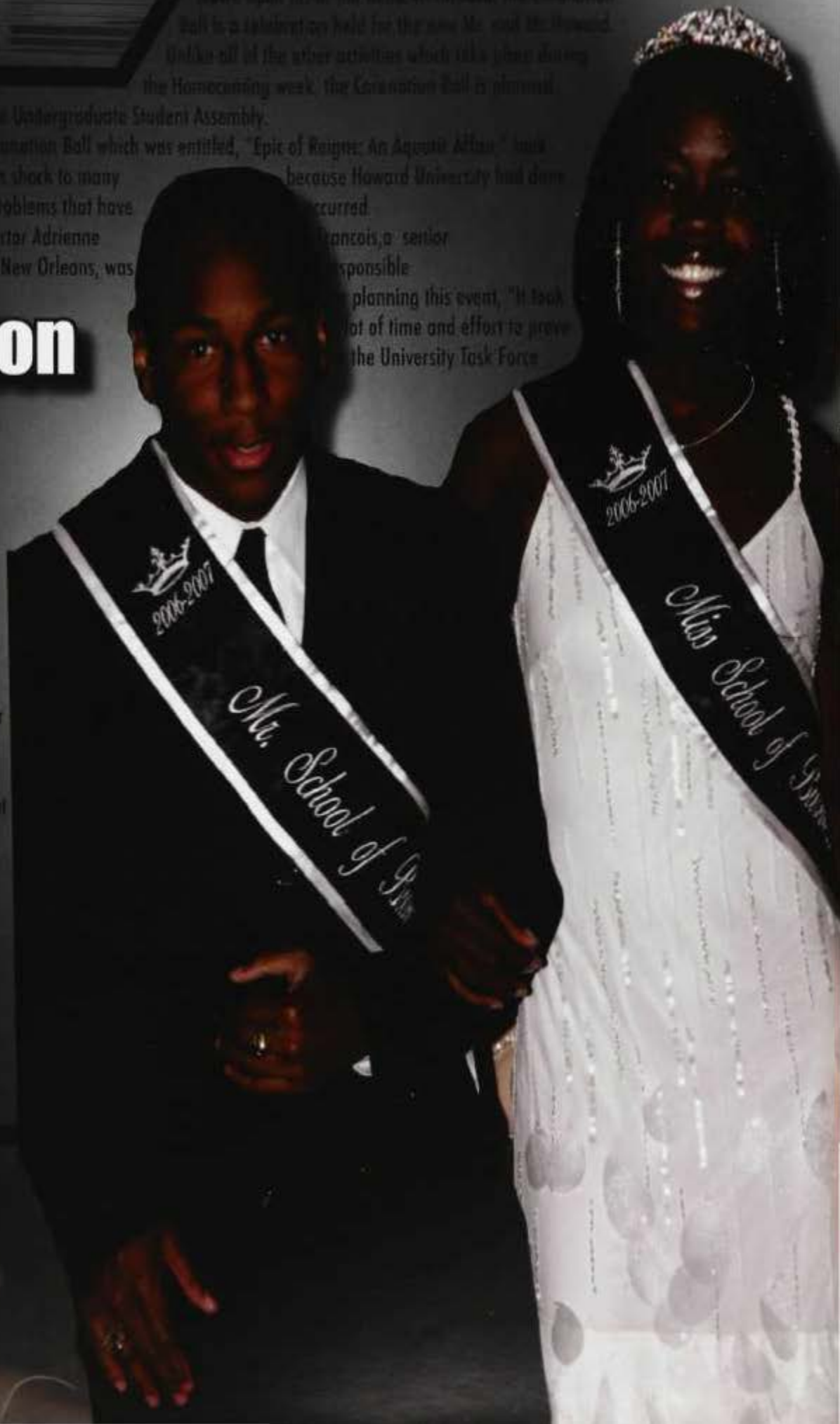
because Howard University had done so well. Francois, a senior responsible for planning this event, "It took a lot of time and effort to prove to the University Task Force

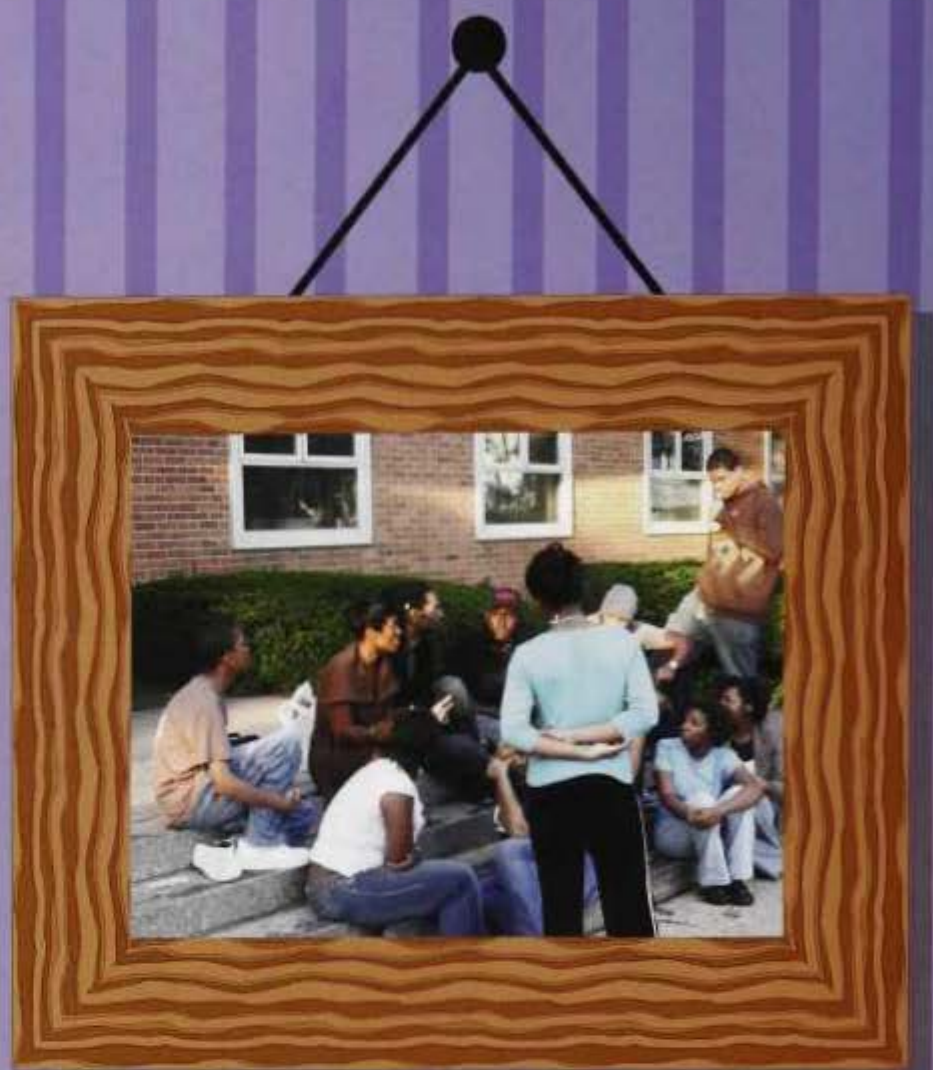

Flipping through the 1949 BISON, the reader is greeted with page after page of old school Howardites. All of the young ladies sported the standard press and curl of the era, while young men looked dapper in suits and lettermen jackets. Fast forward to 2006, when girls sport curly afros, relaxers, micros, blow-outs, and weaves, and male students don't put on a suit unless it's Tuesday in the School of Business. In the 57 years that have passed since the issuing of that early yearbook, a lot more than attire has changed. Whether or not they are true, recent allegations imply that Howard students are apathetic to the current crises and issues of the world. At least compared to our predecessors of the Civil Rights era, this may be the case.

In March of 1968, after rising tensions both on campus and in the nation, students took over the "A" Building and staged a five day sit-in, demanding that Howard adopt a more "Black" curriculum. As a result, the African-American cluster requirement, that we all know and love so well, was instituted. In October of 1975, students protested the steadily rising costs of tuition, and the lack of attention paid to international students. Although a takeover of any administrative building would be unheard of today, the Bison still voice our opinions, unruly if need be. In 2005 alone, the Main Yard was stormed in anger, after students were told to use back entrances to academic buildings during the visit of President George W. Bush. Courtland Milloy's infamous remarks in the Washington Post caused an uproar in 2006, and Howard students demanded his resignation at the Washington Post office.

From the social standpoint, not much has changed over the years. Howard students have always loved a good party and good food. Campus Pals, just as they did in the '40s and '50s, serve as the first liaisons between freshmen and the Howard social scene. Some things that were familiar to the campus of old are gone now, such as the Wonder Bread factory on Georgia Ave., the old Punch-Out, and several restaurants and hang-outs around campus. As long as we keep in mind the prestige from whence we came, and the honor of following in the footsteps of such distinguished alumni, then perhaps we can bridge the gap between the Howard of the past and the Howard we know and love today.

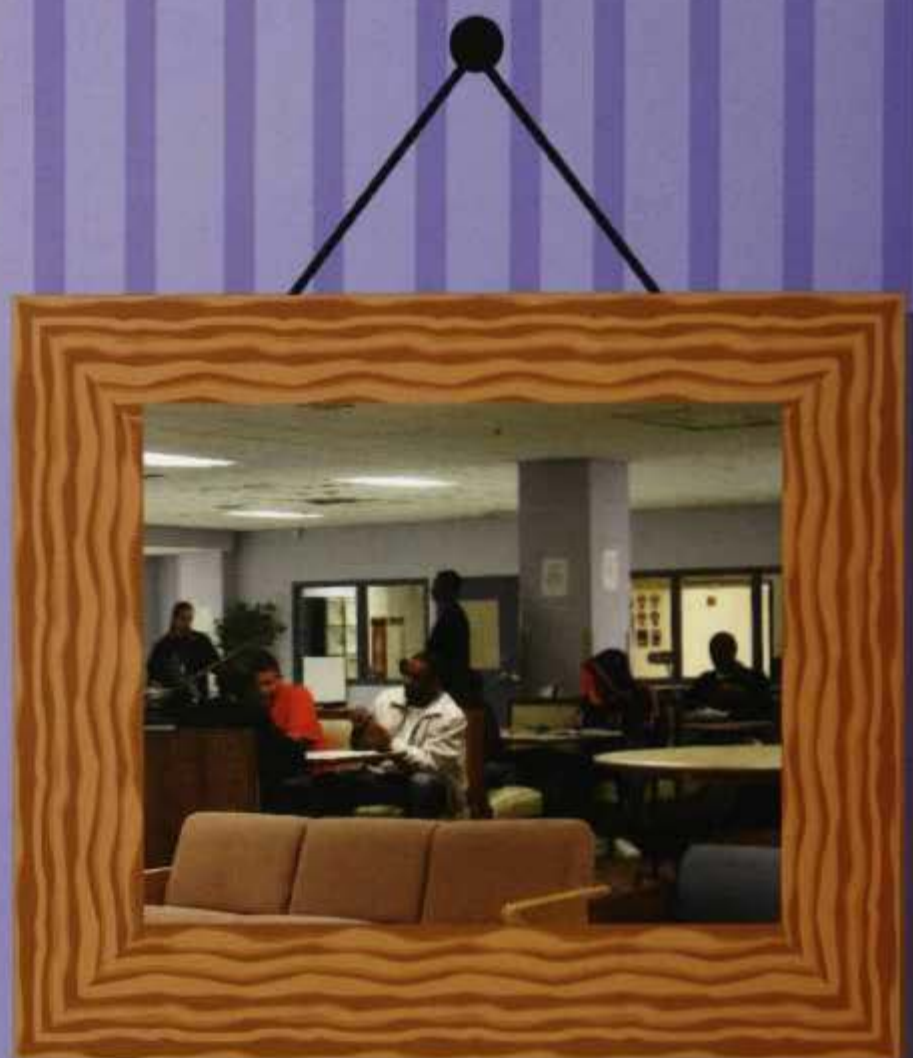
Business People at Howard

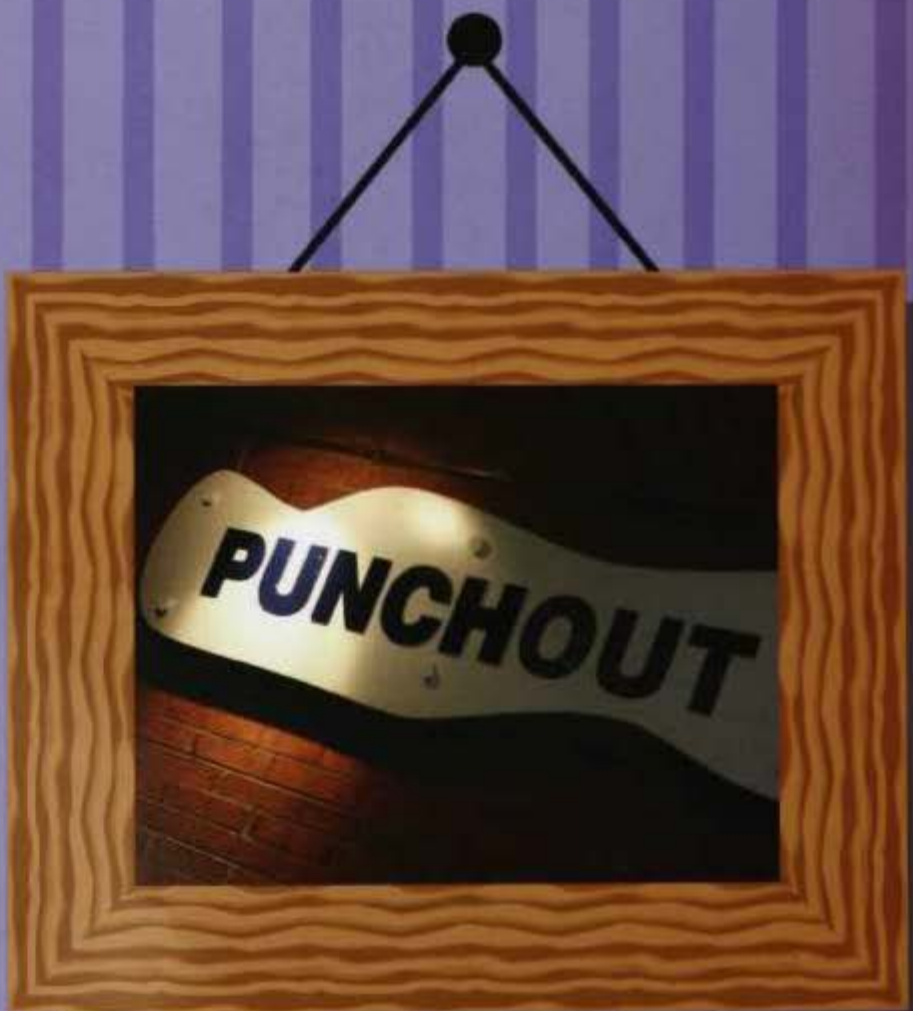


Designing Women

It's no secret that in today's society, one cannot be as sexually free as they might wish. The prospect of becoming pregnant or contracting an STD is real a threat as it ever was, and television viewers are bombarded with PSAs touting the virtues of abstinence and HIV testing. Yet, we still neglect to be as careful as we should be. Many people go to the club every Saturday night, only to wake up to a new, unfamiliar face on Sunday morning. Half of the songs we listen and dance to on the radio feature rappers bragging that they don't know the names of the girls they bring home, and the six-week number one Billboard charter was "Promiscuous" by Nelly Furtado. Could it be that we don't take the threat of disease seriously enough?

As of 2004, the Center for Disease Control estimates that approximately 19 million people a year are infected with notifiable STDs, i.e. chlamydia, gonorrhea, and syphilis. This data fails to include the effects of other prominent afflictions like herpes, genital warts, and trichomoniasis. The statistics for Howard are even scarier. According to a 2005 group interview, approximately six out of ten HU students have at one point had an STD. For a school that focuses so much on appearances, attraction, and sexuality, this is quite an alarming number. So what is the amorous Bison to do? There are several options. The first is to avoid any sexual contact of any kind, resisting the urge to invite that beautiful girl from your chem. class over to "watch a movie". But we all know how well that will go over.

Realistically speaking, the first and most obvious choice is the use of contraceptives. The Student Health Center, located at 2139 Georgia Ave., N.W. offers latex condoms free of charge to all students. Free screenings are available there as well, for most common STDs, as well as HIV. For students who can't find the time to make it to the Health Center, various organizations offer HIV testing throughout the year. In the past, BLAGOSAH, our campus' bisexual, lesbian, and gay student advocacy group, has been the most visible distributor of condoms, ensuring that anyone who wants to accept the "gifts" can get them free. Hopefully, these efforts can result in a solution to Howard's STD problem. If nothing else, pull out some statistics the next time your body is telling you "yes," and soon your mind will be telling you "NO."

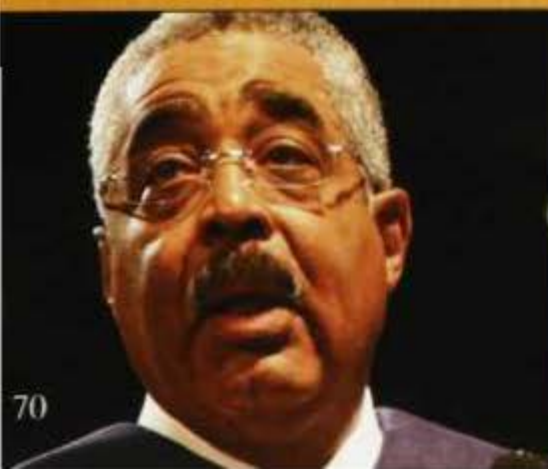

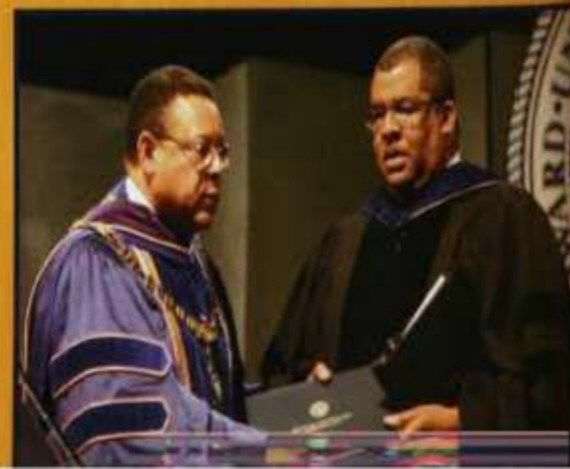

Commemorating the founding of our beloved institution in 1867, the 139th annual Opening Convocation was held on September 29, 2006. In the past, the event has drawn such renowned speakers as U.S. Representative Harold Ford, entrepreneur Earl Graves, and Ossie Davis. This year, Howard was graced with the presence and words of our very own Rev. Dr. Bernard Richardson. Faculty and administration entered the auditorium, regally dressed in full academic attire, while the Class of 2010 sat back and absorbed their first formal introduction to Howard University. Every year, Opening Convocation marks the official beginning of the school year with acclaimed speakers bringing messages to Howard students. Keynote speakers take their listeners into account during their addresses, and generally speak on motivational topics that will inspire action. The 2006 speaker did that and more. Richardson, the dean of the Andrew Rankin Memorial Chapel, spoke to the mostly freshman audience of the high esteem to which they should hold the University, and themselves. He began with a retelling of alumni Zora Neale Hurston's first Convocation as a freshman, saying "She whispered to the Spirit of Howard University: You have taken me in. I am a tiny part of your greatness. I swear I shall never make you ashamed of me." The dean implored not only the freshman, but continuing students as well as faculty to make this same pledge to the school. Throughout, he mentioned the names of great men and women who have attended convocations as students, promising students that they too are as great as those who have gone before us. Above all, Richardson's words served as a call to action to all associated with Howard University to never forget the prestige and honor of our school, and to go out into the world and use the knowledge gained here to make real change. As the dean stated, "When we no longer hear the call of great things; when we no longer understand that we are dealing with matters of life and death; when we fail to realize that there are people who are looking to us to make our nation and the world a better place, then all that we do here will be in vain."

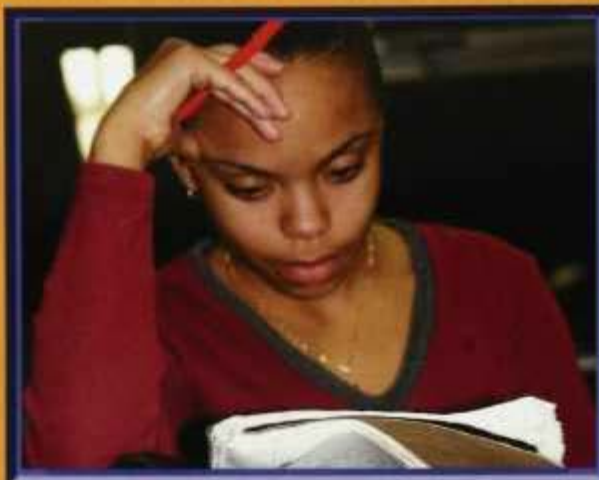

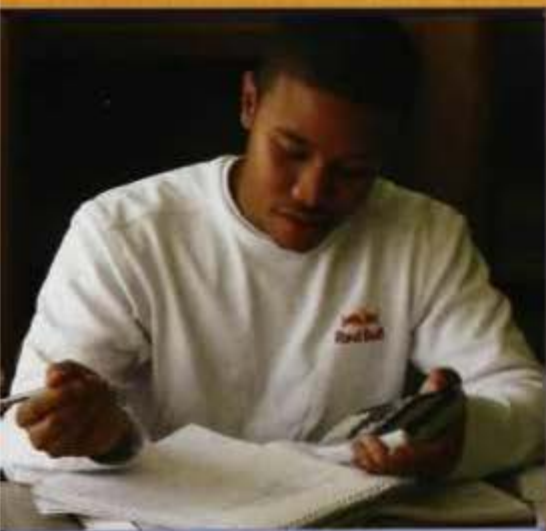

The yard is the glue that holds Howard University's main campus together. Every Bison that attends Howard is aware of the campus and its many historical attributes. But what most might not be aware of are the other campuses that are apart of Howard University's rich legacy. The Divinity and Law schools play an integral role in the Howard University experience. Both campuses have an abundance of history while sitting on pristine land. As undergrads, we are continuously encouraged to explore the other campuses to see what they have to offer. Some students are even sent to the other campuses to use resources. The Divinity School can be traced all the way back to 1867 with the establishment of Howard University. Howard was originally designed for the training and advancement of teachers and preachers, and the school has since carried out this mission. The School of Divinity has been moved around a lot from its beginnings in Douglass Hall. After several relocations, it was stably located in 1987 to 1400 Shepard Street N.E. Washington, DC. Students both live and go to school in this building, which is called Benjamin E. Mays Hall. This building was named after Benjamin E. Mays, a man who was the Dean of Religion in the 1940's. Thanks to his vision, the Divinity School was able to purchase a large amount of the Auburn Seminary Library collection which played a great role in securing the school's first accreditation. The Howard University Law School which is located at 2900 Van Ness Street N.W. Washington, DC has been operating at this location since 1974. The Law School's roots stem from Jan. 6th 1869 when Professor John Mercer Langston instituted the department of law with 6 students, and now it has grown to a considerable size. What started as a law department educating students at night in the homes of various professors has grown to have a reputation of educating some of the best and brightest lawyers out there. Along with the school of Divinity, it comprises a small yet essential part of the Howard experience, preparing eager young minds to go out in the world and make use of the knowledge they have received. The Law and Divinity campuses are not just a part of the Mecca's history; they will undoubtedly factor in on the University's future as well.

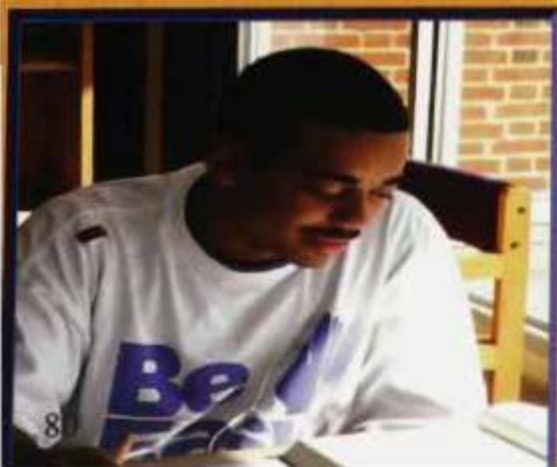

At a typical HU football game, the sights and sounds are usually the same. The crowd watches in anticipation, singing various school chants and cheers. Over the loud-speaker, the announcer echoes "It'll be first and ten...Bison, You Know!" This year was no different, as the 2006 Bison Football team experienced quite a few ups and downs throughout this season. Coming off of a 2005 winning seasonal record, both fans and team members alike had high expectations for this seasons match ups.

It could not have been a more exciting opener than with the head to head match up against our nemesis, Hampton University on September 9, 2006 on the road. Head Coach, Ray Petty openly voiced his concerns about the Bison opening up the season to the nationally ranked Hampton Pirates, who have already won their first game. Petty's concerns were valid as the Bison were dominated in all aspects of the game, experiencing a devastating loss, 46-7. The season continued to look dismal as they lost to Florida A&M, 31-23 and experienced yet another devastating loss to undefeated Rutgers University from the Big East Conference 56-7.

The Bison offense was led by Brian Johnson and Antoine Rutherford who rushed for career highs during their battle against the Norfolk State Spartans, which led to a Bison win, 13-10. During this game, Brian Johnson rushed for 142 yards and Rutherford rushed for 91."The one thing we stress is that we play well in all three phases of the game," said Howard Coach Ray Petty. "We weren't able to do that earlier in the season and now we have all three phases playing well." The defense is doing very well this season also. "The defense is reaching a point where we feel we are not going to give up points," said middle linebacker Timothy Lockett. Cornerback Thomas Claiborn had 9 tackles, middle linebacker Timothy Lockett had 8 tackles, safety Randell Means had 8 tackles and defensive end Rudy Hardie had 6 tackles, (4 tackles for losses, 2 sacks).

Resfest 2006

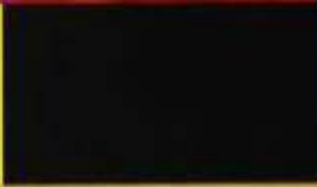
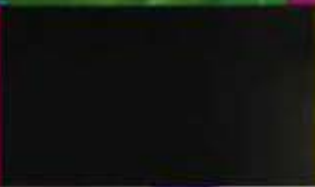

- Howard Hall was originally called "Howard House."
- President Oliver O. Howard was a war general, for the union army, from the Civil War who became the first president of Howard University.
- President Oliver O. Howard lived in Howard Hall from 1869-1874.
- Howard was established on March 2, 1867.
- The University's original thought out name was "The Howard Normal and Theological Institute for the Education of Teachers and Preachers."
- General Howard was one of the founders of the institution and was president from April 5, 1869- Nov. 30, 1873.

- The trustees voted to change the name to Howard University on Jan. 8th, 1867.
- The school opened with 5 students, all white women that were the daughters of two of the trustee members.
- The first foreign students that were recorded in Howard's history were 3 Chinese students that entered the University on Feb. 28th, 1870.
- The tuition per year for the medical school, during its first few years, was \$135.
- The home of Dr. Charles Boynton, a trustee member, was the location of one of the first meetings, of the founders of Howard, to discuss the plans for the school.
- The first charter was an act to Incorporate Howard University, Dec. 3, 1866
- The first black man to be elected to the board of trustees was Henry Highland Garnet (1867)
- By June 1867, the trustees had sold \$110,000 worth of property because they did not need that much land and because they had no money to build on it.

1870's



- During the reign of President Patton (1876-1887), both houses of congress granted \$10,000 toward expenses for the university.
- A time of panic because of all of the anarchy that was all around. The school of law had been shut down, professors were resigning left and right, and students resorted to gambling and other bad activities (1873-1878).
- The cost of housing for professors, at Howard, in the 1870's was \$300-850 dollars per year.
- In 1871, the salary for the president was \$5,000 per year.
- John Henry Smyth, a law school graduate, served as the United States Minister and Consul to Liberia (1878-1885).
- The first graduates of the medical school, three white and two black students, received diplomas in 1871.
- John Wesley Cromwell graduated from the law school in 1874. He was the author of "The Negro in American History," which was published by the American Negro Academy in 1914.
- "Howard University Cadets," discontinued on May 21, 1874, young men that were physically fit would be put into in fantry companies. They would be taught how to use guns, bayonets, swords and sabers and gymnastics.
- Charlotte E. Ray, daughter of a minister and abolitionist, was the first woman to graduate from the law school (1872). She was also the first woman to be admitted to practice law before the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia.
- The first Alumni Association was the Medical Alumni Association on March 10, 1871.

1880's



-- Clark Hall was the first male dorm built on campus (1880).

-The president's house was built for Jeremiah E. Rankin in 1890 and housed presidents until 1960.

- University President Patton was able to get the Episcopal Church to open a school on campus, King Hall, where all of the theology classes were taught (1889).

- The ambulances used by the Freedmen's Hospital, in the 1880's, were horse drawn buggies.

- To decrease the rights of the students, the Executive Committee voted on April 8, 1884 not to allow students to use University facilities to hold meetings in which they would and could voice criticism of any kind.

1890's

- Andrew Rankin Memorial Chapel, was built in 1895, the brother of President Jeremiah E. Rankin. Rankin's widow contributed a lot of money.

- The first Law building was built, it stood at 420 fifth street NW (1892).

- The first honorary degree was given to Alexander T. Augusta, on June 30, 1896, the degree was entitled "Medical Doctor."

- The Teachers College was established in 1892, a great accomplishment for Howard University.

- Under a ruling on November 8, 1893, by the Executive Committee, athletic games were allowed to be played on all school year days except for Sundays, Games were permitted from 3-7pm in the summer and 3-6pm in the winter.

- No more than 5 match games, games in which Howard played another school, were permitted during each semester.

- Charles C. Cook was a volunteer football coach from 1892-1905.

- During the Spanish-American war, November 4, 1899, the board looked into the cost of a University Cadet Corps.

- On April 29, 1896, the Korean Minister asked that rooms be made available for 6 Korean young men so that they could study at Howard.



1900's



- *Freedmen's Hospital* was the main teaching hospital of the largest number of Negro administrators, physicians, dentists, pharmacists, residents, nurses, and interns of any hospital in the world (1909).
- *Andrew Carnegie building* was the original library. It houses a few offices, a library, small auditorium and chapel (1910).
- *Lulu Childers* organized the *Howard University Choir* in 1908.
- The "*Long Walk*" was a tree lined dirt walkway that bisected the main quadrangle and was used daily by most students.
- *Alpha Chapter, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated* was established on Howard's campus on January 15, 1908.

- *Booker T. Washington* was elected to the *Howard University Board of Trustees* in 1907.
- *Beta Chapter, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated* was established on Howard's campus. Although the second chapter of this organization, it was the first fraternity on Howard's campus in 1907.
- *Alain Leroy Locke* was an author, educator, and so much more. He was a spokesperson for "*The New Negro Movement*" and served on the Faculty at Howard University. He was also the first black Rhodes Scholar (1907-1910).
- On Oct. 30, 1909 a memorial service was held on campus for General Howard who died on Oct. 26, 1909.
- The board voted, on May 31, 1904, that study conducted in the preparatory department could last no less than 4 years.
- The "*Commercial Department*" was established on May 20, 1903. This department included: Economics, Political Science, Math, History, Science and Language.

1910's

- *Miner ball* had a fire on Oct. 28th, 1915
- *Dr. J. Stanley Durkee* was unanimously elected president of the university, decide to abolish both the secondary and normal schools on June 4, 1918.
- *Alpha Chapter, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.* was established on January 13, 1913
- *Student Army Training corps* practiced on the main quadrangle in 1918.
- *Frisolity Day*, a campus event where students dressed up in costumes, (1915).
- A large service was held for WWI soldiers who were killed in the war (1919).
- *Alpha Chapter, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated* was established at Howard University on January 9, 1914.
- *Alpha Chapter, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Incorporated* was established at Howard University on November 17, 1911.
- March 13, 1913, the members of *Alpha Chapter, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.* participated in the *Women's Suffrage March* down Pennsylvania Ave.
- "*Red Summer*," of 1919, was filled with riots. A Howard University professor bared the danger and went into the eye of the riots to bring back news. His news helped to save many blacks however when the riots ceased, just as many whites had killed blacks as blacks killed whites.
- *Jessie Moorland*, a black theologian who was also an alumnus and trustee of the University, donated his private library collection in 1914.
- The first casualty as a result of WWI, at Howard University, was on May 23, 1917.
- Howard University gave 100% support to the war which is evident by the establishment of the radio school on November 19, 1917.
- *James C. Napier*, lawyer of 1872, was the Register of the United States Treasury (1911-1930)



1920's



- Lucy D. Slowe was elected Dean of Women
- The greenhouse was erected (1922) for \$8,000
- A new dining hall was erected for \$201,000 in 1922
- United States President Calvin Coolidge addressed the graduates at commencement in May of 1924.
- The university baseball team played Mainichi of Japan in Griffith stadium on June 4, 1925.
- Congress passed a bill, on March 2, 1925, that authorized \$570,000 for a new medical building.
- Dr. Sara W. Brown, a white woman, became the first woman trustee (1925).

- Albert Irwin Cassell was the Howard University Architect, from 1924-1938, that designed and constructed the gym and athletic field, human ecology, founders library, Douglass hall, chemistry building, power plant, steam tunnel, and three women's dorms to name a few.

- Mordecai Johnson was installed as Howard University's first African American president in 1926.
- Annual Thanksgiving classic featuring Howard vs. Lincoln University was an event that wasn't to be missed (1920's).
- Commencement used to start with the graduates processing down the "Long Walk" (1921).
- Howard University established a summer school (1920's).

1930's

- 1939, Alpha Phi chapter of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. is chartered.

- 1931, Tubman Quadrangle is built to house Freshman girls

- 1937, Founders Library is constructed on the site of the old main building. It holds more than 500,000 volumes including the Channing Pollock and Moorland-Spingarn rooms and collections.



- 1935, School of Social Work established

- 1936, Douglass Hall is built, designed by assistant professor and architect Albert Cassell

1940's



- 1940, Cook Hall built, originally designated as a men's dorm
- 1941, Freedmen's Annex was built, planned to treat African-Americans suffering from tuberculosis. It now serves as the Allied Health building.
- 1948, Slowe Hall built as a residence for Black female government workers. 1948, Carver Hall was built as a counterpart to Slowe
- 1947, Campus Pals officially recognized as a campus organization by administration.

- 1948, Zeta Phi chapter of Alpha Phi Omega established
- 1949, Howard Players become first college drama group to travel throughout Europe as goodwill ambassadors.

1950's

- 1953, Alaine Loekke founds Gamma chapter of Phi Beta Kappa at Howard
- 1954, Howard University Law students are instrumental in the groundbreaking case of *Brown v. Board of Education*
- 1956, Ernest E. Just Hall, designed by famed architect Paul Williams, is dedicated as the University's Biology buildings.
- 1957, The College of Arts and Sciences implements the first Honors program of the University.



1960's



- 1964, The University purchases Griffith Stadium, the original home of baseball team "The Washington Senators", to house the University Medical Center
- 1964, WETA-26 TV station launched
- 1963, Gamma Sigma Sigma established on campus
- In 1965, President L.B. Johnson delivered a commencement speech outlining his plans for civil rights legislation.
- 1966-University president James Nabrit, Jr. named Deputy Ambassador to the UN.
- 1968, students seize the "A" building, demanding Afro-American courses.

- 1967, A group of student protesters prevent a discussion with Gen. Lewis Hershey, Director of the Selective Service system.
- 1969, Howard Gospel Choir debuts to the campus community

1970's

- 1970, present-day School of Business is founded; is the second largest school in the University.
- 1971, School of Communications established
- 1970, For the first and last time ever, Spring Finals are replaced with "community workshops"
- 1971, Students raised a Red, Black, and Green "Liberation Flag" over Founder's Library
- 1972, Plans begin for a new, state of the art student center; it eventually becomes Blackburn
- 1972, WHUR station is given to Howard by the Washington Post-Newsweek company
- 1975, Howard University Hospital relocated to its current address on Georgia Ave.
- 1973, Women enroll in the HU ROTC program for the first time





1980's

- 1987, *The Divinity school finally found a permanent home in N.E. after having been displaced for years.*
- 1982, *Chi Eta Phi established on campus*
- 1986, *International Pals created*
- 1984, *Kappa Kappa Psi established on campus*
- 1989, *Annenberg Honors Program established*
- 1986, *Greene Stadium is opened*

1990's

- 1993, *Bisonette Dance Ensemble founded*
- 1994, *Chapel Assistants founded*
- 1997, *The School of Engineering and the School of Architecture and City Planning unite to form the College of Engineering, Architecture, and Computer Sciences.*
- 1993, *the International Affairs Center is renamed the Ralph J. Bunche International Affairs Center*
- 1998, *Groundbreaking ceremonies are held as the Louis Stokes Health Sciences Library is opened.*
- 1998, *The Howard House, a National Landmark, is renovated and turned into the University Alumni Center.*



2000's



- 2004, *The Hilltop is ranked #1 campus newspaper by the Princeton Review*
- 2005, *The Hilltop becomes first HBCU paper to be issued daily*
- 2000, *Student Prince Jones is killed by police, setting off widespread protest in the Black community.*

Born on September 12, 1981, in Chicago, IL, Jennifer Hudson caught the public's attention when she was cast as one of the finalists on season three of American Idol. Her voice was so beautiful and soulful that many couldn't help but to love her. It was that beautiful voice that also captured the ears of the casting directors who ultimately chose her for the role of Effie, in the Broadway musical turned movie "Dreamgirls." A boy by the name of Ben Ownby, aged 13, was abducted, after he stepped of the school bus, by Devlin and found, in his apartment, four days later. After his arrest, Devlin confessed to kidknapping Ben Ownby. He was taken into custody and held on \$1 million dollar bond.
