
(rifles included). Their performance was unique and precise as they pretended to be marines who couldn't seem to stop being snakes despite their efforts.



TRADITIONS THEN & NOW



Not following the norm for the first time in history a woman candidate was a real contender in the Demo-







Howard University's 16th President, Dr. Sidney A. Ribeau

When Dr. Sidney A. Ribeau accepted the presidency of Bowling Green State University in 1995, he envisioned creating a premier learning community whose graduates are uniquely equipped to meet the world's challenges. In the decade since, Bowling Green's ninth president has led the University to adopt a values-centered mission-something rare at a public university-and provided an academic environment that develops culturally literate, technologically sophisticated, productive citizens prepared to lead and to inspire.

During his presidency a number of innovative, signature programs have been created, such as the newly implemented Scholarship of Engagement Initiative that encourages collaborative faculty involvement with private and public groups to identify and resolve relevant issues through scholarship. The President's Leadership Academy, begun in 1997, and BGeXperience: Vision and Values, started in 2003, are two others. The President's Leadership Academy enables select students from diverse ethnic and economic backgrounds to enhance their leadership skills through mentoring and co-curricular programs during their academic careers. BGeXperience integrates values education, critical thinking, character development and civic involvement while helping students make the transition from high school to a university campus.

Dr. Ribeau has upgraded the University's communications and computing technology and encouraged collaboration with other institutions to increase operational and cost efficiencies. He has championed collaborative research and instructional programs as well. One example is the nationally recognized Center for Photochemical Sciences, which received a \$2 million Wright Capital Project grant in 2003 from the state to create a laboratory that will work collaboratively with business, industry and nonprofit organizations to bring innovations in the photochemical sciences to the marketplace. Another is Partnerships for Community Action, a small grant program that underwrites programs initiated by faculty, student and community groups who come together to achieve a common educational goal or provide a special service to those in need.

In 2003, Dr. Ribeau was recognized by the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators, which presented him with its President's Award for his "courage and leadership in guiding the Bowling Green State University campus community to develop a community focused on student learning and designed to educate the whole student by taking students' personal and intellectual growth into consideration."

Alumni and friends of the University also are supportive of Dr. Ribeau's vision for BGSU. Contributions to the University have grown steadily during

SR: For me personally, being a President at any University is a real honor to be selected to serve, but there's more of a sense of purpose and mission I find being here at Howard that I did find at any other University where I have worked. It's really a mission deeply rooted in the experiences that African Americans have achieved at Howard University. That mission drives you to want to do more like taking a 14 hour day and making it an 18 hour day.

BY: Many students have stated that you are more personable and that they actually see you walking around campus more than previous Presidents. How important do you feel it is to build a relationship with the student body?

SR: I think its very important to be out talking to the students, faculty and the staff listening to them. I think my wife and I see our role here to be a part of the community and to contribute to it in ways that are helpful and useful and that's very important to me. I try to make sure that a couple of times a week, I walk around the yard or get over to Blackburn. Or even last semester I walked through the Arts and Sciences building and a faculty member invited me to sit in on the class, so I think that's real important and I enjoy it I don't feel like it's an obligation, it's actually some of the better parts of my day.

BY: How did it feel to be named the 16th President of the historic Howard University?

SR: I felt really honored and thought that it would be a great opportunity to work with the students and the faculty on some issues that are not only important to prepare students to graduate from Howard University, but to prepare the next generation of leadership. Also to really allow us to be on the national stage, I think that it's refreshing that the world symposium that we're having around the inauguration is bringing together scholars from all over the country and is getting media exposure all over the country. Even though its produced by Spike Lee and supported by Pepsi its really a partnership with Howard University, so we're right there in the forefront talking about very important issues during this inaugural time. So I think that's one of the benefits of being at Howard that you don't have at another institution that you really are on a national stage in a very positive way.

BY: It's often said that students at Howard University are not in touch with the surrounding community, how do you plan to bridge the gap?

SR: Well I think there are things going on in different departments in schools, like the School of Social Work and even students in Arts and Sciences participating in Alternative Spring Break. This year they're going to be out in the DC community as well as going to New Orleans, Chicago and Detroit. So I feel that there are things like that, that have been done that are going to be expanded to the greater Washington, DC area. There are a number of things in the School of Social Work and in Arts and Sciences where students are working with faculty members on projects in the community and there's a pretty extensive

list, so I feel we need to just do more of these things and we need to highlight them and make it easier and more effortless for students to get involved in those type of activities.

BY: What changes can the students expect under your new administration?

SR: Well I think Students First is one series of things that have come to me from the students as being their highest priority to improve services offered on campus. Services from financial aid, registration, advising, all the support services, facilities like classrooms and Resident Halls and all those things students have expressed as being very important and at the top of their list. That's why we launched the Students First Campaign and a lot of these issues will be addressed and we have some excellent staff members and faculty members to help us carefully assess what needs to be done and how to address it in a timely fashion.

BY: What vision do you have for students entering Howard University and matriculating into the "real world?"

SR: I think it's our opportunity and obligation to prepare students to not only be confident in their majors or disciplines like sociology, business, journalism or whatever it might be, but we need to make sure they have skills. In addition to that I'd like to know and it goes along with the tradition of Howard the legacy of leadership, the leadership for the global economy. For example they won't just be engineers, but they'll be the lead engineer on a project and that they won't just be attorneys, but partners shaping the direction of law firms. I think if we do our jobs well in and out of the classroom and in student organizations we will achieve these goals. Like the other evening I was visiting with the Marching Band in their preparation for their participation in the inaugural Parade. We need to encourage students to take advantage of these situations and to not only have a good time but to learn how to lead. I think if we do that students will depart from Howard really making a difference in the world.

BARACK OBAMA FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA



BARACK OBAMA'S BIOGRAPHY

Born to a father from Kenya and mother from Kansas, the story of **Barack Hussein Obama** came to symbolize what many Americans believe makes the United States the greatest country on Earth. Obama's remarkable journey began at his birth on **August 4, 1961** in Honolulu, Hawaii. After a short stint in Indonesia with his mother and Indonesian stepfather. Obama relocated back to Hawaii where his maternal grandparents raised him, his background came to represent the melting pot of cultures that is synonymous with American culture. While attending the **Punahou School**, where Obama was one of three black students, he struggled with his multiracial heritage and became keenly aware of race relations in America.


Upon graduation in 1979, Obama attended **Occidental College** for two years before transferring to **Columbia University**, where he would earn his bachelor's degree in Political Science. After graduation in 1983, Obama soon went to work for the Business International Corporation. However, Obama desired to embrace, and fight for the African-American community, and by 1985, he had moved on to Chicago's south side where he became a **community organizer for low-income resident's** in public housing developments. During his years in the community, he worked closely with church-based non-profit groups to support housing and support for the working poor families of the city.

In the years to follow, Obama's ambitions had taken him out of Chicago, and on to **Harvard Law** School, he became the first black president of the Harvard Law Review in 1990. Obama's success at Harvard garnered a book-publishing contract, a faculty position at the **University of Chicago Law** School, and an opportunity to practice Civil Rights Law at a prestigious law firm in Chicago. Despite the opportunities to teach law full-time, or represent high-profile clients, Obama chose to continue his work for African-American communities in Chicago. While working part-time at the University of Chicago, Obama organized voter registration drives during Bill Clinton's 1992 presidential campaign.

Having already achieved moderate success as both a community organizer and Civil Rights lawyer, Obama began his career in politics in 1997, when he took office in the Illinois State Senate as a representative of Illinois' 13th district. During his tenure, Obama pushed for tax credits for the lowincome workers, welfare reform, and increased subsidies for childcare. By 2003, after two re-elections, Obama became chairman of the Illinois Senate's Health and Human Services Committee, where he championed legislation to monitor racial profiling and a mandate for videotaping of all homicide interrogations. Having already gained local notoriety in Chicago, Obama emerged on the national stage when he sought office to the United States Senate in 2004. Beating his closest opponent by 29 percentage points in the senate primary thrust Obama into the spotlight as the Democratic Party's shining star, and earned him the honor of delivering the keynote address at the 2004 Democratic National Convention. After serving two years as a Senator, Obama announced his candidacy for president on the steps of the Old State Capitol building in Springfield, Illinois.

Obama battled his same party opponent, Hillary Clinton, in a bitter primary race, but in August of 2008, **prevailed with the Democratic nomination.** He then went on to combat Republican John McCain on major issues such as the economy, the war and healthcare.

On November 4, 2008, after a rigorous twenty-one month campaign, series of debates, and messages of hope and change, Barack Obama made history by becoming the first African-American elected to the Presidency of the United States of America.
