





Revolutionary Thought

Tags: culture events twitter blast from the past

Like a black suited and thick-framed EI Hajj Malik EI Shabazz ready to take the stage for debate in the 1960's, or like Stokley Carmichael as a Bison post introduction to SNCC, young African-Americans have maintained the courage to fight for their rights although the medium for doing so has changed over the years.

Through late night meetings, flyers, and word of mouth, young black students across the nation became not only the mobilizing force, minute men, and armies behind the voices of Martin Luther King Jr., Jesse Jackson and the like during the Civil Rights Movement, but the leaders of various "radical" movements and protests on college campuses and the surrounding communities. Howard University has a history deeply intertwined with that of hard fought protests that have been quite uniform, until now.

On March 20, 1969 over 1,000 Bison, including former President H. Patrick Swygert and other current members of the HU faculty, entered the Administration building because 38 of their classmates had been threatened with expulsion after being accused of disrupting that year's Charter Day ceremonies. After making the University come to a halt, protesting students would remain in the A-building for four days until all demands save one, the removal of James M. Nabrit as President, were met.

Two decades later on March 9, 1989, hundreds of students barricaded themselves inside the Administration building. The primary reason for their protest was that Lee Atwater, the Republican national chairman who at the time was publically seeking to lead African Americans to the RNC, resigned from the Board of Trustees. Student protesters in '89 (who included the likes of Sean "P. Diddy" Combs) also demanded that financial aid program be improved (Administration proposed to increase tuition by 15 percent that year), campus buildings be renovated, and for the "promotion of a more Afro-centric curriculum". Five days later their demands were met.

The first major Howard protest against the Administration to take place in our time occurred twenty years after the former on September 4th, 2009. Many of the same conditions that HU students have complained endlessly about for years were on the agenda as campus leaders took a stand. Though the all black attire, chants and handwritten signs remained, a new more "electrifying" aspect was added to the game. On the Mega phone atop the stairs of the A-Building, members of the 49th Administration of HUSA and other student leaders demanded that students get on Facebook to change their statuses to messages talking about the protests.

It was also demanded that students use Twitter to send "twitpics", tweets to others student encouraging participation, and most notably contacting @iamdiddy to inform him of our movement. After hundreds of tweets about the September 4th protest began to flood the Twitter waves, P. Diddy responded to the HU family by offering encouraging words like "Do what we did and take IT OVER!!! Let's go!," If your at HU go to the A building now and make sure they feel you!!" and "HU your worldwide now! Show em what u got!!" With the tap of an iPhone screen and the click of a mouse, the online world went wild for news on the Howard protest. Online newspapers published stories and video of the protest while entertainment blogs such as TMZ and The YBF informed their viewership of the way Bison get down.

With just about 350 students participating and some demands left unmet, this Fall protest may have been small compared to those that came before, but with the strength of the new age technology, we were able to give a glimpse to the world as we took a stand.

Amongst its diverse scholars, Howard University is filled with students interested and eager in exploring the world. Many students come from all over the world to indulge in the HU experience. In the same breath, many students travel overseas to experience life outside of the United States. For a wide range of reasons, HU students take the journey and find themselves in countries such as Japan, Egypt, Italy, and so on; all for the burning desire to explore.

Kwandrick Dwayne Sumler is one of the many students who took on the opportunity to explore. Sumler, a transfer student from Rockford, IL was granted the chance to travel to Tunisia with the U.S. Department of State Scholarship Program. Along with attending daily Arabic classes, the program gave Sumler the opportunity to explore Tunisia with frequently coordinated trips. A country known for its intriguing culture and history was home for Sumler for the entirety of the 2009 summer. While in Tunisia, Sumler lived with a host family where he learned first hand how a Tunisian family lives their daily lives.

Tunisia is a country curved and molded by the Islamic religion and with this being said, Sumler learned and demolished many stereotypes he held of Islamic Counties. Many Howard students can relate to Sumler's stereotypic views as it relates to women, freedom, and religious practices.

"All people are the same but yet so different". Sumler goes on to express some of the similarities and differences as it pertains to young adults in Tunisia and here in the States. "Young adults in Tunisia smoke shisha (hookah), go to night clubs, and watch soccer games amongst many things, as a means of having fun". Here at Howard relationships or the interaction between male and females can be different from various other schools and cities but it can be said that a man can simply approach a young lady and ask her out or ask her for the digits. It was very interesting how this process can be different in other countries. In Tunisia a man would never even think about approaching a young lady without knowing anything about her. "After approaching her friend or sibling and have learned several things about her, then he is ready to approach her." "Gained respect and acceptance of all humanity" Sumler explains the biggest lesson he has learned through his visit. When asked what cultural norm he would integrate into the American might look as if they are up to no good) and say hello odd to pass by a crowd or a group of young men (which in American might look as if they are up to no good) and say hello and start a conversation.

Junior sociology major Tremaine Huggins feels so passionate about studying abroad that she wants to work to make it a requirement for Howard University students. "And although you are going to school, remember that learning does not end in the classroom, " Huggins added.

Studying abroad proves to be an unforgettable experience, where students not only foster their intercultural development. but learn about themselves as well. Both Sumler and Huggins recommend students to fully live up to HU's mantra, "leadership for America and the global community."







The components of HUSA are a legislative branch known as the General Assembly (GA) which is comprised of all representatives from the Undergraduate Students Assembly (UGSA) and the Graduate Assembly (GA): a judicial branch known as the Policy Board, which is made up of university student officials including Student Council Presidents, that interpret the HUSA Constitution and the executive branch, which is comprised of the Executive President and Vice President. Just like our nation's government, we have a checks-and-balances system. Lest we not forget the students who devote countless hours volunteering for HUSA making sure that the office is open to all needing their voice heard at Howard University.

Words From the Wise

Name: Donald Temple Graduated: 1975 Major: Political Science

1. Why did you decide to come to Howard?

It was the Mecca, the greatest institution. I visited and was overwhelmed by the spirit and ambiance. I knew the history of the university and of its good academic reputation, in addition to its significant contributions to the African American community and its international sensitivity. Coming here was something that I aspired to do.

2. How was Howard in 1975?

Very vibrant, there was a war in Vietnam, president Nixon was leaving office, and we were the first post Stokely Carmichael era. Black power still reigned supreme and was seeping from our lectures, rhetoric, clothes and classes. We were sensitive to Africa and had a connection to the Diaspora. It was a phenomenal environment.

3. What were the issues within Howard University at the time?

I was in UGSA and student government when I was on campus so we were connected to student issues. The issues are basically the same; tuition, registration, and instruction.

4. If you could go back and relive you experience, what would you do differently?

I would have learned a language and learned more about the African Diaspora. If I had the power I would make it mandatory that students do a semester abroad. I would also have students complete a series of required courses and reactings to be made aware of the fundamentals of US society, global society, slavery, and colonialism. We need to be deeply rooted in knowledge of ourselves, and it shouldn't be an option.

5. How did you handle student life on campus?

Some of my best friends in my life are people that I met a Howard. We have life long memories, yet while all school sometimes we took for granted our experience. I took it all in and had a wonderful student life experience. We had the best speakers and concerts on campus. We saw the likes of Earth Wind and Fire, Stevie Wonder, and Bob Marley and I always walked around with some concert tickets in my back pocket. I was also very involved being on student government, playing sports, writing for the Hilltop, and founding Ubiquity, Inc. At that time people's minds were on fire. Students were extremely well read. In '75 the students were dynamic, ambitious, and motivated.

6. What is some advice that you would give to current HU students?

I would tell them that they have to be intellectually disciplined and curious. Like I tell my children, there are 158 hours in a week. Each is an opportunity in the laboratory of Howard University to feed their minds and learn from the world around them. Also, read everything that isn't nailed down. View being educated as a chance to grow your knowledge base, not just being able to regurgitate professors' words.




finishes out the list with their black and white. As with every year, people disagree with the results but the numbers show that the Annex took the trophy as this year's ResFest Champions.

homecoming game with outbursts, seats filled and students lining the walls.




6. What tips would you give students who are currently at Howard?

History

Founded on January 6, 1869 with a class of only six students, the Howard University School of Law was established to train lawyers with a strong focus on dealing with the best interest of African Americans and their newly established rights during the monumental period of change in the United States.

In 1872, the School of Law graduated its first woman lawyer, Charlotte E. Ray and was accredited by the American Bar Association in 1931.

Witharichhistoryalreadybeingestablished, the School of Law has held true to its establishing principles of advocating for African Americans. Former School of Law Dean Charles Hamilton Houston and then student, Thurgood Marshall, broke segregation barriers in the nation's schools with the historic case of Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka. Both were associated with the School of Law.

The School of Law is now located on a 22acre campus in Northwest Washington D.C. The Dean, Kurt L. Schmoke, is responsible for over450lawstudentsthathavetheopportunity to participate in programs and organizations such as the Black Law Students Association, International Law Society, and Clinics focusing on giving students real world experience in the law field. Students also have the opportunity to practice law in South Africa and receive Bar Exam resources to further their chances of passing the Bar.

This year marks the 140th Anniversary of the School of Law. This celebration will host an anniversary gala, 1869 founder's reception, lectures, and symposiums. Students, Faculty, Alumni, and Guests have the opportunity to continue the legacy of the School of Law by donating to the 140th Fund.

Thurgood Marshall was not admitted in the University of Maryland School of Law because he was black. He then chose to attend the Howard University School of Law to become one of the greatest lawyers of all time.

History

Before Howard University became the Mecca of youthful afro-centricity, black intellectualism, and a mixing pot of various majors and interest, most students came to our campus seeking to be educated in either one of two disciplines: Religion or Teaching.

Thus, one of the oldest schools here a

t the university is the School of Divinity. Established in 1867 under the Charles B. Boynton Administration, the School of Divinity (formerly known as the School of Religion) has been a guiding light and moral conscious to the members of the HU community. Students of a culturally diverse background can complete studies to earn one of the school's three offered degrees: Master of Divinity, Master of Arts in Religious Studies, or Doctor of Ministry.

With social justice and activism being of the founding pillars on which the School of Divinity was built, students and faculty remain heavily involved on campus and in the community while obtaining hands on learning experience in become transformational leaders. Many in this school are involved with Alternative Spring Break and other service missions throughout the academic year. Also, while enrolled here one can become involved with HUSD Student Government and the HUSD Thurman Chapel. One little known fact about the school is that they host a Gallery of Religious Art which has housed the André Tweed collection of Ethiopian sacred artifacts and the Constantine Youssis collection of Greek icons. HUSD also publishes a weekly newsletter, The Word, edited by Pauline E. Hall. The Dean of the school, Alton B. Pollard III, Ph.D, continues to inspirationally lead the students and faculty of Divinity forward under their vision.

The Oldest

The school of Divinity is the oldest fully accredited historically Black theological school linked with the Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada.

The School of Divinity has been publishing a weekly newsletter since 1934 entitled The Word. This newsletters features inspirational words form the Dean, spiritually uplifting stories, announcements, and information about internships and scholarships.


History


Howard University is home to the nation's fifth oldest dentistry school. Since it's inception in 1881, the College of Dentistry has maintained it purposeful vision to serve the community as a teaching, research, and patient care institution. Here thousands of highly skilled dentistry practitioners have been trained to become world leaders in their field.

Students of culturally diverse backgrounds can complete studies in one of the school's various degree or research programs such as the Advanced Education Program in General Dentistry or Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery.

Under the leadership of Dean Leo E. Rouse, DDS, FACD, this high achieving academic flagship is sailing to even greater heights. Recently, assistant professor Dr. Allison Glascoe was named one of the 38 dental educators accepted to the American Dental Education Association Academy for Academic Leadership Institute for Teaching and Learning. Also the Dean of the Howard University College of Dentistry, Leo E. Rouse, D.D.S., has been honored as a recipient of the American Dental Education Association Presidential Citation.

For those seeking to stay involved within the dentistry school and surrounding community, there are many opportunities for students to serve the oral health needs of the District residents through the patient care facility. In their dental clinics an extensive range of treatments and oral healthcare services are provided for both adults and children. Dental and dental hygiene students under faculty supervision conduct dental treatments given in the pre-doctoral clinic. With hearts open to service and hands trained to heal, HUSD remains one of the nations most esteemed educational vessels for provided quality patient care and dedicated service to the community.

The College of Dentistry is committed to helping the underserved in the District of Columbia. The school has not only established community programs for HIV patients and the homeless, but provides preventative and restorative care for local school children.

Journalism.

The School of Communications was founded in 1971 to train people of color in the field of communications. John H. Johnson, a black communications pioneer became the namesake of the school in 2003.

Students within the John H. Johnson School of Communications have to opportunity to join numerous on campus organizations such as the National Association of Black Journalists (NABJ). Thomas Burrell Chapter of the American Advertising Federation (AAF), as the Howard University Film Organization to name a few. Not only do students have the opportunity to join nationally recognized organizations, they also can gain experience by participating in the student run operations such as WHBC 830AM. the #1 college radio station in the country; the Hilltop, a daily run newspaper started in 1924 by Zora Neale Hurston; and the Spotlight Network, a channel dedicated to showcasing the talent of future journalists and production teams. Annual events such as the Communications Job Fair, Paul Robeson Awards and National Association of Broadcasters Media Sales Institute give students a competitive advantage in the communications market.

The JHJSOC Student Council is currently under the Advance administration led by President Rodney Hawkins. The council acts as a liaison between the students and faculty of the school. With the "student" in mind, the council has hosted numerous events to increase its visibility such as game nights, campus clean ups, BBQs, and nights in the Cafe where they can be found sporting blue and gold Advance t-shirts.

The John H. Johnson School of Communications underwent renovations due to re-accreditation by the Accrediting Council on Education in Journalism and Mass Communications which resulted in a brand new tech center and editing labs. However, the school is still working fervently towards raising funds to build a new state of the art building.

History

The Howard University Graduate School is a separate entity within the university that is a leading research institution. It offers certificate programs, Ph.d and masters degrees in over 30 different disciplines and approximately 100 specializations. The Graduate School boasts nearly 10,000 students who have received their graduate academic degrees since 1919 and represents the single institution that has produced such a significant amount of African American and minority Ph.d recipients.

The President of the Graduate Student Assembly is Juris Doctorate Candidate, Yasmin J. Gabriel. Other programs in the Graduate School include the international initiatives such as the US Brazil Fund and the US/India Research Initiative.

The Graduate School is a member of the Oak Ridge Associated Universities, which is a consortium of 96 universities that assists in connecting the students and faculty of member institutions with access to federal research as well as staying informed on fellowships, scholarships, and research appointments. The Graduate School is also a founding chapter of the Edward Alexander Bouchet Graduate Honor Society along with Yale University, where Bouchet became the first African American Doctoral Recipient in the United States. The current Interim Dean of the Graduate School is Charles Betsey.



History

Located on 6th & W. The College of Pharmacy, Nursing, and Allied Health Sciences, also known as CPNAHS, is one of the 12 colleges at Howard University. Currently CPNAHS enrolls approximately 1,100 students, who are served by 108 full-time and 15 part-time faculty members. The College offers the following variety of accredited programs:

The School of Pharmacy: The School of Pharmacy has been preparing students to become leaders in the profession for over 138 years. This school offers the Doctor of Pharmacy Degree as well as a M.S. and a Ph.D. degree in Pharmaceutical Sciences in conjunction with the Graduate School. The School of Pharmacy offers modern programs that expose Howard students to a diverse, multidisciplinary atmosphere within Howard University's Academic Health Sciences Center.

The Division of Nursing: The Division of Nursing is dedicated to educating and socializing students for nursing practice, leadership in the profession, contributing to the research and development of the science of nursing, and providing service to the surrounding community. The Division of Nursing was established in 1969 with a program of studies leading to the bachelor's degree in nursing. In 1980, the Master of Science Degree in Nursing was initiated and recently, a Post-Master's Certificate Family Nurse Practitioner Program was added.

The Division of Allied Health Sciences: Since 1974, this Division has provided challenging educational programs for numerous allied health professionals. The Division offers undergraduate programs in Clinical Laboratory Science, Health Management Science, Nutritional Sciences, Physician's Assistants, and Radiation Therapy. Graduate programs include a Master's in Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy, and Master's and Ph.D. programs in Nutritional Sciences. The Division of Allied Health Sciences seeks to enrich the lives of students as future health care providers, and as useful members of society.

The CPNAHS is part of the University's Health Sciences Center, which also comprises the College of Medicine, the College of Dentistry, the Louis Stokes Health Sciences Library, the Howard University Hospital, the University Cancer Center, and the Center for Sickle Cell Disease.

Greating a Socially Conscious Roward School of Social Work

The building that houses the school of social work is known as Isabel Burns Lindsay Hall, and was named after the under-recognized Social Work pioneer who was the first dean of the school. Dr. Lindsay worked to end segregation and discrimination in the field of Social Work, and was an avid and prolific writer on social injustices.



1900-1983

The social work program was part of the University's Graduate School of Arts and Sciences until 1945, when it was established as an autonomous professional school.

History

After originally providing its instruction under the department of Sociology. The Howard University School of Social Work was established as an independent program in 1935. At this time, America's political and economic climate called for the development of more formal, structured programs for social work education, as the nation was engulfed in the Great Depression, and strides were being made to help out the suffering general population through the passing of the Social Security Act and other social services. There was particular interest in building such a school at Howard University, as Black Americans represented the majority of people who sought social work education in Washington D.C., yet none of the recognized and accredited schools of social work admitted Black students, due to segregation.

Accordingly, the student enrollment is higher and more diverse than ever. The vision of the school is to link practice, policy and action with research. Students enjoy a rich curriculum, under the direction of Dean Cudore Snell, with organized community outreach and knowledge development programs, plus excellent research facilities in Howard's own E. Franklin Frazier Center for Social Work Research.

In addition to the ardent desire to provide its postgraduate constituents with the best education and preparation for the field of social services, the school is strongly influenced by concerns for the well being of black people in our society. The school is committed to guiding its students, regardless of race, gender, sexual orientation, and disabilities, to become educators and researchers who will assist in solving institutionalized social problems, particularly those that affect the Black community. There is a strong sense of Black identity in the school of social work; it prides itself on its dedication to the historical roots of Howard University and its commitment to the community. Each of the guiding principles is pertinent to deeper understanding, development and greater advancement of the African Diaspora.

Equality for all

Despite its evident pride in African-American history and culture, the school emphasizes a special sensitivity to all oppressed and underrepresented groups in American society, and is open to working with all groups who seek equality.

History

The College of Arts and Sciences, established in 1867, is the flagship college on Howard University's campus. It was founded during the second year of the universities existence and is currently lead by Dean James A. Donaldson. The College of Arts and Sciences, known to many Howard students as COAS, is the most popular choice among undergraduate students, making it the largest college by population. Today with over 3,000 students enrolled, COAS is comprised of four essential divisions and offers twenty-one degree-granting programs. The divisions of COAS include: Fine Arts, which is comprised of Art. Music, and Theatre: Humanities, which includes Classics, English, Modern Language and Literatures, and Philosophy; Sciences, including Biology. Natural Chemistry, Comprehensive Sciences, Health, Human Performance and Leisure Studies, Mathematics, Physics and Astronomy, and Psychology; and Social Sciences, comprised of African American Studies, Afro-American Studies, Air Force & Army ROTC, Economics, History, Political Science, Sociology and

Students in the College of Arts and Sciences have the opportunity to travel to Kemet in the summer for an enriching program in Egypt. COAS also hosts a variety of symposiums and forums on a variety of topics such as Theatre Arts and Social Sciences.

The COAS Student Council is currently under the leadership of Council President, Dorien Blythers, and the Greenlight administration. The Council along with the Howard Players host an annual competition for Freshmen called "The Howard University Campus Detour", where students travel throughout the District of Columbia in a scavenger hunt style competition modeled off of the hit show, The Amazing Race.

The College of Arts and Sciences is also home to the Howard University Center for Urban Progress. The center focuses on mobilizing the surrounding community with research programming, community initiatives, and addressing the urban issues with academic programs.

The first African-American President of the President of the American Cancer Society, Society of Surgical Oncology, Society of Surgical Chairmen, the Washington Academy of Surgery, and the American College of Surgeons is Howard University College of Medicine Graduate and Professor, Dr. LaSalle Leffall, Jr.

Global

The Liaison Committee on Medical Education and the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) and the American Medical Association (AMA) accredits the College of Medicine. 70% of the student body is U.S underrepresented minorities and a number are from foreign countries. In 1868, shortly after the conclusion of the Civil War, the College of Medicine opened its doors to train physicians to respond to the growing healthcare needs of the population, especially the black community. Since inception, the school has taken great pride in the high standards they have set for their students. Compassionate patient care, excellence in research and scholarship, and socially conscious service are the main objectives of the College of Medicine; Current Dean, Robert E. Taylor is committed to ensuring that the main objectives remain the focus of the school.

For over a century, the College of Medicine aims to cultivate physicians that will be pioneers in their respective specialty, as they live and work to serve the underserved. Staying true to its founding principles, the College of Medicine in conjunction with the Howard University Hospital launched a free healthcare clinic for the uninsured this past June to provide healthcare to those in low-income communities and battling the current epidemic of lack of insurance.

Students within the College of Medicine have the opportunity to work in the Basic Sciences or Clinical Sciences departments, which house specialties such as Anatomy, Pathology, and Radiation Oncology to name a few. To assist with attaining real world work experience, students can participate in numerous Research Centers and Institutes, such as: the Cancer Center, National Minority AIDS Education Training Center, and the Women's Health Institute. The College of Medicine offers a Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree program as well as a Master of Public Health (MPH), Graduate Medical, and Dual Degree programs, which allows students to receive two degrees in a shorter period of time.



Five Year Plan

Dean, Bradford Grant

Interim Dean, Bradford Grant was introduced at the College of Engineering, Architecture, and Computer Sciences Town Hall Meeting hosted by the CEACS Student Council in August.

History

The College of Engineering, Architecture & Computer Sciences (CEACS) came into existence in 1997 due to a merger of the School of Architecture and Planning and the School of Engineering.

With the beginning of the undergraduate program development starting from the 1900's, CEACS undergraduate programs were fully established by 1934. CEACS has six sub-departments including: Architecture, Chemical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Electrical and Computer Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, and Systems and Computer Sciences.

Former Associate Dean Bradford Grant, who also serves as the Director of the School of Architecture, is currently the interim Dean of CEACS and strives to make sure his college holds true to its motto, "We Give Our Students the World By Design." CEACS hosts a variety of organizations such as Tau Beta Pi, National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE), Society of Women Engineers, and the Society of Systems & Computer Science to name a few. CEACS is also home to the Howard University Chapter of Engineers Without Borders, an organization that gives students the opportunity to travel abroad and assist people in international communities such as Kenya and Brazil. "FaceLift: Leading to Inspire Forward Thinking" serves as the theme for the 2009-2010 CEACS Student Council Administration.

The Howard University Science, Engineering, and Mathematics (HUSEM) Program is an important program of not only CEACS, but also the university. HUSEM strives to increase the number of minorities who receive degrees in the science, technology, engineering, and mathematics disciplines. This program encompasses nine of the departments within CEACS as well as the Science and Mathematics departments in the College of Arts and Sciences.

This year Howard University will be the host of the 2009 ACM Regional Programming Contest in November as well as compete against North Carolina A&T in the Intel Student Design Challenge. Over the years students in CEACS have been able to win accolades in competitions within their respective majors. Such competitions as the Windows Media Player Skin Design Challenge not only give students much needed experience but also promote Howard University.

The Educational Agenda School of Education

Since 1932...

The Journal of Negro Education is a quarterly review that has been published by the School of Education since 1932. In its history the publication has addressed the many problems that have characterized Black education in America. The journal plays an essential role in the collection of statistics and the dissemination of information to individuals, libraries, and institutions about African American in the realm of academia history.

History

Formerly known as Teacher's College, the School of Education is on a mission to "Prepare teachers, administrators, researchers, program evaluators, and human development professionals for leadership in urban and diverse educational settings" while influencing the "national education agenda for African American children". Being one of the earliest disciplines at Howard and one of the first that African Americans seeking an education were exposed to, the study of education has remained significant not only to our university but to all descendents of African slaves who formerly were denied access to education.

HUSOE (Howard University School of Education) offers 4 doctoral and 23 master's degree programs as well as 9 certificates of advanced studies. Students who study under these programs look forward to careers in school psychology, teaching, school leadership, human development, school counseling, and educational research and policy making.

In the Fall of 2009, the School of Education and Howard University received a grant in the amount of \$ 800,000 for renovations from Secretary of Interior, Ken Salazar as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA.) This historic building that resides on our campus was the home of the

Miner's Teachers College, formerly known as the Miner Normal School for Girls, which served as the academic building for the training of colored teachers. With this new government grant and through other programs such as, the Early Learning Program that serves ages 3-5 and their 75-year-old research publication Journal of Negro Education, the Howard University School of Education continues to light the path for future urban educators.

Myrtillia Miner

Miners Teacher's College was named after Myrtillia Miner, a white educator and abolitionist from New York who opened the Normal School for Colored Girls, in Washington D.C. Miner led the school for many years until illness onset. She later passed away after being involved in a carriage accident in 1864.

\$800,000

was given to the School of Education by Secretary of the Interior Ken Salazar to renovate Miner Teacher's College. Under the White House's 1980 Initiative on HBCUs, over \$14.25 million in historic preservation grants will be given to **Historically Black** Colleges to aid in the renovation or upkeep of buildings that are important part of American history.

1. Why did you decide you go to Howard?

I won an academic scholarship to Howard and at that time it was known as the best black school in America.





2. What was Howard like in 1961?

Howard was a bedrock of student involvement and the upperclassmen played a very significant role. I was greatly influenced by Kwame Ture, known then as Stokely Carmichael, and a man from South Carolina named Cleveland Seller; both were at the forefront of the campus movement for civil rights. I was a freshman and couldn't do a lot, but I did use the mimeograph machine to print flyers then I'd passed them out. Under their leadership I also contributed by spreading the word about rallies and keeping the student body informed.

3. What were the prevalent issues within Howard at that time? How did you deal with them?

At this time the institution itself was against students being active in the civil rights struggle. The administration did everything to discourage us, thinking that our involvement would get us hurt, in trouble, or bring negative attention to Howard. In later years faculty became more involved with the fight.



4. If you could go back and do it all over again knowing what you know now, what would be different?

I am very satisfied with the life I live, but if I could change anything I would probably not have been as much as a surface person involved in the struggle. Howard pulled my scholarship, I planned to worked a semester then come back, but I was drafter to the Vietnam War. The adults of that date were very apprehensive of the civil rights movement. I feel they pulled my scholarship because they were against the struggle.


5. How did you handle your academic load?



The Evolution of Social Networking

With song lyrics such as, "shorty sent a twitpic, saying come and get this, LOL smiley face" blasting through iPod speakers and across airwaves, it is obvious to see how deeply engrained the use of the Internet and social networking have become in our society. For most Americans, using websites such as Twitter and Facebook have become as much a part of their daily routine as eating or brushing teeth. The noteworthy evolution of this medium is quite undersized compared to those of magazines or television, but the rapid changes make the story of social networking that of a grand hustle.

The way that technology and the Internet are used today vastly differs from the past. The Internet was created when Lawrence Roberts of MIT connected a Massachusetts computer with a California computer in 1965 over dial-up telephone lines. The ARPANET, the first name for the Internet, was up and running in 1969 and initially connected four major computers at University of California Los Angeles, Stanford Research Institute, University of California Santa Barbara, and the University of Utah. Government researchers, engineers, and librarians originally used the Internet. Through continued progression this medium became used by the masses not only for research but to socialize, network, and express thoughts and feelings. The creation of online social networking puts power in the hands of the people and makes communication a little more electrifying.

The Buddy List features of AOL partnered with the "friend" surfing and affiliation features of Classmates.com inspired the creation of Sixdegrees.com, the first social networking site that launched in 1997. Sixdegrees.com allowed users to create profiles, list their friends, and surf other people's friends list. The combination of those online actions was unheard of at the time, but as technology would rapidly change so would the function of sites. With the waning popularity of Sixdegrees.com, a new generation of networking domains was born and the parents were members of the minority community. BlackPlanet, AsianAvenue, Cyworld (specific to people of Korean decent) and MiGente (for those of Hispanic origins) created a fresh new avenue for users to discuss issues particular to their culture while maintaining personal, professional, and dating profiles. Culture specific networks such as Black-Planet thrived for almost a decade and created an amazingly popular and lucrative boom in the online social industry. As all great things come to an end, a new wave of high tech, more personalized sites flooded the net bringing an end to the past social networking dynasty. With the newest music, colorful backgrounds, friends, games, and more, MySpace.com changed the social networking game with its arrival in 2003. Sites that were previously popular and praised struggled to keep visitors when Chris DeWolfe and your favorite friend Tom Anderson gave the world an all-encompassing site that allowed users to connect to people, check out videos and music, and create their own unique space. Though the jazz of MySpace is what first attracted the millions of users to the domain, site users began to have a taste for the more simplistic. Facebook, created in 2004 by Mark Zuckerberg, and Twitter, created in 2006 by Jack Dorsey, are quite clean in appearance and basic in use. The purpose of these two sites is almost totally to communicate, like to see whether or not Howard Homecoming 09 is popping like they said they would or to see if Diddy responded back to your tweet.








5.What first peaked your interest in Greek Life? What was your experience with Greek Life like while attending HU?








PURPOSE BEYOND CHEER


PASSING THE BATON



calling me and I'll come running. The benefit is to be a part of a family and tradition. Traveling and stuff is great, but nothing means more than being able to call someone your friend, and mean it."

WHY DID YOU DECIDE YOU GO TO HOWARD?

I came to the U.S. to play soccer and I always wanted to go to school to study Physical Education but I never had the grades. I signed a contract with the Baltimore Bays, a professional soccer team, and they made it possible for me to go to school and I enrolled into junior college. The Howard Coach, Ted Chambers, invited me to come over to Howard University after meeting me at the Special Olympics, then I decided to enroll and at the same time I became the soccer coach.

WHAT WAS HOWARD LIKE IN 1970?

Revolutionary. It was during the Civil Rights era, where everyone was pro black and a lot of the students were very proud and participated in protests and wore their hair in big afros. Although that was the common style I never allowed my players to wear the big "bush", I wanted all of them to be clean cut so they could be uniform at all times, it was my way of instilling discipline.



WHAT WERE THE PREVALENT ISSUES WITHIN HOWARD AT THAT TIME?

Factions. We had locals, the Americans, the West Indians, and Africans. It was very little that we had in common, we had mutualities but not commonalities. It was very difficult for the Africans and the West Indians to really do anything on campus. We weren't interested in football or baskeball, and couldn't understand baseball.

HOW DID YOU DEAL WITH THEM?

Ted Chambers decided that the Caribbean people should have something in their college life so he introduced soccer and Criket.

IF YOU COULD GO BACK AND DO IT ALL OVER AGAIN KNOWING WHAT YOU KNOW NOW, WHAT WOULD BE DIFFERENT?

No, It was a great moment and I'm a winner. I was able to get good players and impact their lives for the better.



Properly represent blackness and fight against the stereotypes that have been set in the media about blacks.
















1. What was the Howard experience like while you were in school?

WORDS FROM THE WISE AMY HILLARD Graduation Year: 1974

1. Why did you decide you go to Howard?

I very much wanted to go to a Historically Black College, and Howard was, and continues to be, the top HBCU. Additionally, several of my family members are alums of Howard, so I had a lot of encouragement to go.

2. What was Howard like in 1974?

1974 was an interesting year. Student government was very active and the boycotts of 1969-70 were still fresh. The District of Columbia had a black mayor, and Howard was a political place. Louis Farrakhan spoke regularly on campus and was very popular. It was at this time Homecoming had been elevated to a major entertainment venue, with the Fashion Show at Cramton and acts like Stevie Wonder and Ike and Tina Turner.

3. What were the prevalent issues within Howard at that time? How did you deal with them?

There were not many prevalent issues within the university at the time, but being in student government, I was active in all political discussions.

4. If you could go back and experience Howard again, knowing what you know now, what would be different?

I would have lobbied for a bigger, better business school. What Howard has now is outstanding! Back then, the business school seemed like an afterthought. Also, I would have loved to have studied abroad for a semester or a summer, but those programs were hard to find back then.

5. What was unique about your Howard University experience that made you stand out as Who's Who member?

I think what made my experience unique was that I was very active in school activities, but also had a job throughout my time at Howard. It also may have been because I came to Howard with a Debate Team scholarship, there were very few of us on the team so that made me stand out.

6. What advice would you give to current HU students?

Keep your studies the priority, but be active in student life. The rewards are great and you feel so much more a part of campus life. Get to know your professors, as so many of them have very interesting lives. Also, try to get some time internationally while at Howard because today's economy is global.






Dr. Sidney A. Ribeau

Sidney A. Ribeau, Ph.D., is the 16th President of Howard University and the sixth African American to serve as its Chief Executive Officer. He was President of Bowling Green State University (BGSU) in Bowling Green, Ohio, for 13 years before coming to Howard. Under his leadership, BGSU was recognized for its residential learning communities, values-based education and innovative graduate programs. He began his teaching career in 1976 as a professor of communication studies at California State University, Los Angeles. Eight years later, after being honored as an outstanding teacher and student adviser, he became Chair of the University's Pan African Studies Department. He held that position until 1987, when he was named Dean of Undergraduate Studies at California State University, San Bernardino. Three years later, he became Dean of the College of Liberal Arts at California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo campus. In 1992, he was named Vice President for Academic Affairs at California State Polytechnic University, Pomona, a position he held until his appointment to Bowling Green. Currently, he serves on the boards of the Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association-College Retirement Equities Fund (TIAA-CREF) and Worthington Industries. He has served on the boards of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), the United Way, the Regional Growth Partnership, the Andersons Inc. in Maumee, and Convergys Corp. Some of his numerous honors include distinguished alumnus awards from Wayne State University and University of Illinois, scholarly recognition from the National Communication Association and the President's Award from the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators. He received a B.S. degree President, Howard University from Wayne State University, and M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in communication from the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign.



Renee Higginbotham-Brooks, Esq., a member since 1997 and Vice Chairwoman of the Board since April 2005, is the Chair and Chief Executive Officer of Block Capital, Inc., an investment services firm in Fort Worth, Texas, established in 2005. Previously, she was the sole proprietor of the Law Office of Renee Higginbotham-Brooks for 19 years specializing in public finance. She earned a B.A. degree in political science, graduating Phi Beta Kappa, magna cum laude from Howard University, and a J.D. degree from Georgetown University School of Law. In 1991, she became the first female and first African American appointed to the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission in its 56-year history where she served as its Chairwoman until 1994. Later, she served on the Texas Department of Commerce Policy Board and on the Board of Visitors of the University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center. Some of her numerous honors include: 2003 HU Distinguished Alumni Award; 2002 Excellence Award, National Dental Association; NAACP 1997 Thurgood Marshall Award; National Association for Equal Opportunity in Higher Education, 1997 Distinguished Alumni Award; Dallas Morning News Quest for Success Award; and the City of Fort Worth 1994 Outstanding Woman of the Year Award (Superwoman Category).

The Howard University Upward Bound Math and Science Initiative Program is named in her honor. She is a charter member of the Howard CEACS alumni network and serves on the boards of the Center for Quality in Urban Education and the Howard University Middle School of Mathematics and Science.



He is the Chief Architect of the American Cancer Society Initiative on Cancer of the Poor, for which the "Harold P. Freeman Award" was established in 1990. He is a past Chairman of the President's Cancer Panel, having been appointed for four terms, first by President George H. W. Bush in 1991, and later by President William Clinton in 1994, 1997, and 2000. He pioneered the concept of "Patient Navigators," a program to provide low-income patients with personal guides through the health care system. 



1. Why did you decide you go to Howard?

I decided to attend Howard because I wanted to learn more about my history and culture from a global perspective inside and outside of the classroom. The cultural and historical diversity of HU is second to none. The fact that it was in Washington, DC, the nation's capital, was a plus due to my interest in politics and communication. Lastly, Howard has produced the most amazing alumni in the world: world changers, people who have truly left an impact, and I wanted to join their ranks. Plus, once I came on the tour I truly felt at home and knew it was where God intended me to be.



2. What are your hopes for the university's future?

I hope that Howard continues to recruit and produce the best leaders for America and the global community. I want us to be the #1 resource for research by and about people of color in the world. And, of course I want us to improve our services in the administration building, build more academic (libraries included), recreational, residential, and social buildings, become less dependent on our Congressional Appropriation, be able to completely fund more student's education, and have a multi-billion dollar endowment.



3. What were the prevalent issues within Howard at that time? How did you deal with them?

The prevalent issues issues within Howard while I was there for undergrad was of course issues in the administration building, need for a better technological infrastructure, better facilities, our changing mission statement, accreditation, and a transition in university leadership. 
4. If you could go back and do it all over again knowing what you know now, what would be different?

I would have made the time to go to Egypt with Dr. Carr, spent a semester at Columbia University as a domestic exchange student, and applied for more fellowships and academic honors. I would have attended more conferences, done more research, and experienced DC more.



5. What propelled you to run for the position of Undergraduate Trustee?

I wanted to make a lasting change at the university and change the way people viewed the role of Undergraduate Trustee. The time that I was at Howard was one of great transition and I wanted to be a part of the decision making process that decided the direction of my Alma Mater while making sure that the direction was not only good for Howard, but for my peers (the students) as well.



6. What were some of your most memorable moments while serving as the Undergraduate Trustee?

My most memorable moment while serving as Undergraduate Trustee was being a part of the decision to allocate the funds to help 300 students stay at Howard, changing the bi-laws of the board to be more inclusive of alumni in its decision-making, and making sure that the mission statement of Howard still advocated for the "promising" students who have the leadership potential to be great, but need a place like Howard University to push them to be their best. I also will remember getting calls at 2 am about a student emergency and having to figure out how to best address the issue. I ran a low-budget, grassroots campaign for one of the traditionally most expensive positions to run for at Howard, so actually being elected and having the honor to serve my peers was also memorable.

7. What words of wisdom would you like to give to current Howard students?

Be yourself. You will learn more, experience more, be liked more, and like yourself more if you stop caring what other people and organizations think about you and just live. Sometimes students at Howard feel as though they have to fit into a certain mold to be successful, but you will definitely be more remembered if you create your own mold. No one wants a copy: everyone wants an original. Lastly, remember why you came to Howard. It was not for student government, to pledge, or to fit in, it is for your studies. So focus on your academics, do research, compete for prestigious fellowships and scholarships like Marshall, Rhodes, Pickering, and Fulbright. Don't just be a student: be a scholar and an exemplar!







Interview with President Ribeau

Bison Yearbook: How has your education inspired you to go into the field of teaching and administration?

Sidney Ribeau: Early on I decided that I wanted to be either a teacher or an attorney. It was obvious that attorneys seemed to resolve problems after one finds them self in trouble, however I began to understand the importance of shaping one's future before they land into trouble. Such an epiphany was life changing for me. As a teacher, I had the opportunity to see how education can really open doors, not only to employment, but to self-confidence and opportunity. I taught high school and adult students for more than 12 years. And this teaching experience led to several administrative appointments, which led to higher positions and prepared me to become a president.

BY: What were some of the organizations you were involved with in college?

SR: Like most students in college, I was actively involved in a number of student organizations participating in intramural

sports and was a supporter of intercollegiate athletics. Along the way, I became involved in the Debate Team, which allowed me greater opportunities to engage the intellectual capacity of my peers and to develop collegial associations with other students from across the nation. I also became a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, one of the Divine Nine fraternities and sororities, and maintained a strong involvement in the African American Studies lectureship while in college.

BY: What is a fact of life that you learned from your college experience that reigns true for current students?

SR: What resonates most is that you do not always have to be the best, but you always need to do your best. I believe the effort that one makes in life is just as important as what you do in life. Realize the importance to always to do your best and not be discouraged when things do not go as planned. Persistence leads to success.







BY: What do you feel is your biggest accomplishment thus far in your administration?

SR: Focusing our attention to the needs of students! While we haven't been able to modify or change many processes and systems to reflect that need, the mandate is clear; and we expect to make considerable progress as we begin to create structural changes. This process will take at least another year to fully implement; but I am confident the changes will make the experience better for our students.

BY: How does your experience at Howard University contrast with that of Bowling Green University?

SR: In many ways, the experience is similar. Both institutions value the importance of teaching, research and student development. But at Howard, we have an opportunity to educate students from throughout the world. While Bowling Green has a much more regional focus, Howard is a world class university with the potential to re-shape the world for a better place.

BY: How has social media affected your Presidency and relationships with students, alumni, and faculty?

SR: Most importantly, social media has given me additional opportunities to have immediate access to a number of audiences. It has been an ideal way of staying better informed about what's going on across our campus and in the community.

BY: On your down time, what places do you frequent in the District?



SR: We have reached a point where we need to come together as a university community. We need to identity our centers of excellence. 
Anna - you are one of the sweetest girls at Howard and don't change for anybody. You keep it real and if somebody doesn't like it, oh well!
