Scope Note

The papers of Merze Vernie Tate (1905-1996), educator, scholar, author and world traveler cover the time period 1906-1995. Dr. Tate served as a professor of diplomatic history at Howard University College of Arts and Sciences in the Department of History from 1942 -1975. The collection includes 12 series: personal papers, correspondence, financial records, writings by Dr. Tate, Howard University, organizational affiliations, subject files, writings by others, photographs, films and audiotapes, artifacts and oversized items. These various series contain materials documenting the life of Dr. Tate as a scholar and award-winning researcher as well as her expansive world-wide travels. There are approximately 35 linear feet of material. The papers were donated by Dr. Tate.

The bulk of the materials documents the professional life of Dr. Tate in the role of pioneering scholar and academician from her honors graduation from the Battle Creek High school in Michigan to being the first African American awarded a doctorate in government and international relations from Radcliffe College now Harvard University. Of particular note are writings by Dr. Tate, photographs, correspondence, Howard University teaching materials and faculty committee involvement, as well as, subject files. These select series provide a window into the creation and development of Dr. Tate as a world-renowned scholar.

Her prolific writings represent a broad interest in human development. Of note is a nearly complete manuscript of her work on a Hawaiian royal, Kamehameha IV. Other topics explored imperialism, Australia and Australasia and African railways hold unique insight to historical and developing trends.

Scope Note continued

There are numerous photographs chronicling the life of Dr. Tate and the Tate family. There are a number of examples where she received earned and honorary degrees, as well as, candid shots from her two worldwide tours. There are images of with Dr. Tate with Eleanor Roosevelt, Lorraine Williams, Flemmie Kitterell and Ida Van Smith.

This collection contains a wealth of information pertaining to Howard University during her tenure. In the Howard University series Dr. Tate's personal struggle with gender equality is evident in correspondence as well as involvement in the Women's Faculty club. Her involvement at Howard contributed to the Browsing Room committee's choice of publications. Over the course of her teaching career, she was able to nurture aspiring young talent and contributed to their evolution. A number of her students co-authored articles with her, while other select student papers she kept and referred to as source material. Moreover, there are syllabi for a number of courses she taught as well as reserved reading listing and bibliographies for select classes.

Another series of interest is Organizational Affiliations. Her work on the advisory committee to the Radcliffe College Schlesinger Library's Black Women's Oral History is remarkable. Biographical information about potential interviewers and interviewees, as well as, regulations and guidelines about the oral history process is informative regarding this invaluable source. In this series her personality is evident in her serious involvement with the American Bridge Association as well as the regional Bridge Builders club. A trophy winning Bridge player Tate rounded out her life with recreation. Her active membership of 50 plus years in Alpha Kappa Alpha shows remarkable dedication.

Series Description

Series A Personal Papers

Box 219-1 This series includes biographical information and materials such as Tate's FBI to Box 219-2 file. There is information about her academic and professional career from her early days as a student at Western Normal College. There is a subseries of family letters between Tate and her siblings as well as her mother. Of note are travel diaries.

Series B Correspondence

Box 219-3 The bulk of this series contains correspondence involving her international travel to Box 219-6 and research. A number of librarians, African corporate representatives and publishing houses are well represented. The next largest population is those academic institutions such as Radcliffe College and Western Michigan University where Tate donated significant sums of money for scholarships and establishing a research center in her name. Notable scholars, popular personalities and activist are evident in this series, persons such as John Hope Franklin, Claude Barnett, Lorraine Williams, Mary McLeod Bethune, Alain Locke, William Stuart Nelson, Charles Thompson, Ida Van Smith and Frank Snowden.

Series C Financial Records

Box 219-7 This series includes receipts and grant proposals. Tate received a number of prestigious grants and scholarships which contributed to her research in Asia, Europe and the Pacific Islands. During her career at Howard University she obtained research grants for her work in documenting African railways.

Series D Writings by Merze Tate

Box 219-8 A prolific writer and researcher this series provides a composite view of the vast to Box 219-16 subject matters that Tate wrote about. Her training in international affairs contributed to a growing interest with countries in Africa, Asia, Europe and the Pacific. Included in her writings are a number of articles ranging in topics from Hawaii/the Sandwich Islands to Disarmament to African mineral railways. Of note is nearly complete manuscript documenting the reign of Hawaiian royalty Kamehameha IV.

Series Description continued

Series E Howard University

Box 219-17 This series provides a portrait of Tate's tenure at Howard University. Tate's to Box 219-18 involvement with campus life through the Browsing Room committee, Women's Faculty Club and the Association of Howard University Retirees are of interest in documenting female faculty life. Include in this series is Dr. Tate's affiliation with the Prometheans an organization of members of Howard University's army specialized training program (ASTP)1942-1943. Also of interest is material documenting the Department of History courses taught by Tate, as well as, Rayford Logan, Lorraine Williams and Tate lecture series.

Series F Organizational Affiliations

Box 219-19 Files include professional and social groups. Tate's 50 plus years in Alpha Kappa to Box 219-20 Alpha gives a snapshot of an active member. While her membership in the American Bridge Club and the Bridge Builders explore her social interactions. Of note is the material pertaining to the Black Women's Oral History Project initiated by Radcliffe College. The BWOH conducted oral histories of prominent Black women in various fields. Tate served as a member of the core committee as well as interviewer.

Series G Subject Files

Box 219-21 This series contains research materials collected by Tate for teaching, publication to Box 219-22 and general interests. There are clippings on Black life, Black women, women and women historians. The breath of topics from African railways to Germany's Brown babies to select HBCU demonstrates her consummate intellect. Of note is material on the Historical Evaluation and Research Organization and the Kalamazoo Girls Club.

Series H Writings by Others

Box 219-23 Files include article and book length publications that Tate utilized in researching, teaching and writing. Areas of interest are imperialism, Hawaii and women.

Series I Photographs

Box 219-24 The images span the range of Tate's life. There are numerous family portraits, as to Box 219-25 well as, images documenting her life from infant to graduate to doctorate. As a traveler this series contains a number of international images and negatives that document her international experiences. There are a number of images from her years in Oxford and her lecturing to domestic audiences about international affairs.

Series Description continued

Series J Films & Audiotapes

Box 219-26 Files contain reel to reel and eight millimeter film documenting her travels. On to Box 219-27 reel to reel Tate's travel to Angkor Thom, Bavaria Germany and Delhi South India. There are also films about Hawaii, Egypt and Ethiopia.

Series K Artifacts

Box 219-28 This series contains items collected and used during her travels. Of interest are her to Box 219-29 silver and ivory hairpins and video camera. Also of note are trophies from various Bridge tournaments.
