SCOPE NOTE

Collection dates: 1924-1988

Size: Six linear feet

Historical notes: Journalist Enoch P. Waters (1909-1987), worked as a correspondent and editor for more than thirty-five years. Waters began his professional life in Chicago, where he wrote for the Chicago Defender, and later the Associated Negro Press (ANP). In the early 1960s Waters reported on the unfolding African independence movements for the ANP. Between 1965 and 1968 Waters served as United Nations (U.N.) Correspondent for the Continental Press Service. He later worked as an information officer in several agencies of the federal government.

Scope and Content: The collection is arranged into six series: personal papers, correspondence, writings by Enoch Waters, printed material/writings by others, photographs, artifact, and oversize. Writings by Enoch Waters, the largest series, includes book manuscripts, news articles, reports from Africa and the U.N., and E.E.O.C. press releases. Most of the correspondence relates to Waters's search for a publisher for his memoir, *American Diary: A Personal History of the Black Press*.

Notes: Waters used the first names "Enoc" and "Enoch" interchangeably.
