Prepared by Wilda Logan Willis July 1983 Dr. Charles 1. West served as a professor of anatomy of Howard University Medical School from 1907 to 1933. The Charles 1. West Papers, spanning 1/2 linear foot, were donated by his niece, Mrs. Marea Ogle, in 1973, And in 1975, Mrs. Ogle donated Dr. West's Howard University medical degree. The time period of the papers is from the 1880s to the 1920s.

Dr. West's papers include an important photographic scrapbook. The first section deals with his travels around the world with the U.S. Navy (1887-1891). Photographs of his ship, the USS Enterprise, along with photographs of historic landmarks during the four year around-the-world tour are included. Dr. West's humor is revealed in the holographic and typescript notes describing some of the scenic photographs. The second half of the scrapbook is a pictorial history of the early Freedmen's Hospital and Howard University Medical School. Starting with Dr. West's Freedmen's Hospital internship in 1895-1896, the photographs document the early hospital staff and facilities, There is also a group of anatomy class photographs. Most of these photographs include Dr. West, as instructor, with medical students dissecting a cadaver.

Many of the anatomy class photographs are identified by each individual student's name and class year. Of special note are several photographs of the Howard University Medical School faculty. Dr, Daniel Smith Lamb author of Howard University Medical Department, 1900 is in several photographs, One large framed photograph, taken in 1926, include Dr. West, Dr. Lamb, Dr. William A, Warfield, and Dr. Edward Davis Williston. Other items in the collection include a scrapbook of newsclippings, single clippings, and some printed material.
