SCOPE NOTE

The papers of Max Yergan (1892 - 1975) missionary, educator, civil rights activist, and sociologist are in 12 series: personal papers; family materials; correspondence; writings by Yergan; speeches by Yergan; writings by others; speeches by others; organizational affiliations; research files; photographs; subject files; artifacts. The bulk of this collection is made up of Yergan's writings, which span his entire career 1917 to 1968. Photographs include some portraits of Yergan. There are images of Yergan with notable figures such as Eleanor Roosevelt, Mary Mcleod Bethune and Prime Minister Nehru of India.

The family papers contain correspondence from his four children: Frederick, Mary Max Jr., and Charles. There is also school records, graduation programs, and medical information. The writings and speeches by Yergan chronicle his intellectual evolution. In April 26 1941, Yergan speaks to the issue of education and information afforded American students in speech entitled *School and Community in Defense of Democracy*. In his writings, Yergan's resignation from the Council on African Affairs addresses charges of communist sympathizing. In writings and speeches by others there is material from Mary McCleod Bethune, William F. Buckley George Schuyler and others. The collected speeches of others contain insight about South Africa and the Bandung Conference in 1955.

His organizational affiliations range from the Anti-Communist Book Club general membership to materials on the Council of African Affairs of which he was a co-founder. Especially rich is the African Studies Association, Inc. Bulletin from 1960 to 1962. This publication contains articles discussing African and African American scholarship and leadership in the academe, society and government.

Yergan's popularity in African countries such as South Africa, Ghana, Kenya and Katanga in the Congo is reflected in the numerous editorials written by and about his scholarship. His career began in 1917 when he first went to Eastern Africa. He eventually spent 17 years in South Africa. His presence in South Africa was instrumental in forming his scholarly

analysis on colonial studies. From 1937 to 1939 he was a lecturer in Negro and African History for College of the City of New York.

In the area of subject files, Yergan's collection is a composite of government publications such as *Ghana Today*, *Liberia Today*, *News from South Africa*, *Information Service of South Africa* and *South African Scope*. Also of special interest is printed religious material, including the *Congo Mission News*, a Presbyterian publication from 1951 to 1955 and *L'Evangelism* 1950 to 1959. In addition, there is printed material on colonial Africa.

The papers were donated by his daughter, Mary Yergan Hughes, on October 7, 1977.

The collection comprises 10 linear feet.

Series D Writings by Max Yergan

Box 206-5 This series contains writings by Yergan pertaining to numerous African countries, such as South Africa, Congo, Katanga, Ghana, Kenya and others. These writings examine the conditions of these countries specifically their histories.

Series ESpeeches by Max Yergan

Box 206-6 his series documents speeches presented by Yergan throughout America. Topics discussed are civil liberties, military history, African and African American history, politics and economics.

Series FWritings by Others

Box 206-7T his series includes information about political and historical events in various African and Asian countries. Authors include Mary McLeod Bethune, William F. Buckley and Ruth Jaffe.

Series GSpeeches by Others

Box 206-8 This series features items collected by Yergan throughout his career, including speeches by Carl Rowan, Paul Robeson, George Schuyler and others. Of interest is Elizabeth McFarland's "The African Women's Needs," 1937 and Willem J. le Roux, "South Africa's Position on the African Continent A Bastion Against Communism," 1962.

Series H Organizational Affiliations

Box 206-8 to Files include domestic and international organizations in which Max Yergan held membership. For example, the Council on Africa, the YMCA and the Conservative Union.

Series I Research Files

Box 206-10 to Items include news clippings from domestic and foreign newspapers. Many Box 206-11 articles pertain to political, economic and social developments within various African countries. Documented are historic cultural movements such as the Mau-Mau and Katanga Freedom Fighters.

Series J Photographs

Box 206-12 Images contain Max Yergan and wife Lena Halpern in addition to images of George Schuyler, Barbara Sutro and Indian Prime Minister Nehru.

Series K Subject Files

Box 206-13 to These files are primarily composed of government generated reports pertaining to Box 206-19 a number of African countries.
