





Whether dealing with a personal gripe or just plain competition for kine-of-the hill status, rappers often use their songs to air out frustrations they have against other artists.

Some of hip-hip's earliest beefs dealt more with a rapper's rhyming ability than with any serious personal conflict as in the case of the classic battle between Kool Moe Dee, who took on oldschool rapper flasy like in one of hip-hop's earliest documentaries. "Wild Sysie."

Beefs in rap have also transpired on larger scales as rappers have been able to mobilize geographic locations in their battles analist their concenents.

This was the case in the mid-80s when rap pionseer KRS-Cone, along with his Boogle Down Production (BDP) error, natives at the Brooklysi borough of New York, took on the Jelice Crew, a stable of young rappers from Queensbridge housing projects in Queens, NY, that included MC Shan, Rouamne Sharte, Big Markie, Big Daddy Kane and was led by all-star hip-hop producer Markey Mark lay hop producer Markey Mark lay her producer Markey Mark lay her producer Markey Mark lay her producer Markey Mar

The battle began when BDF attemped to the get their song played on a popular radio show, "Rap Attack," hosted by old school IU, Mr. Magic.

"This led the group to attack MC Shan and his song "The Bridge" in their debut single "South Bronx." A line from the song clearly illustrates the animosity KRS-One had towards the Queens cirew.

"Party people in the place to be, KRS-One attacks / Ya got dropped off MCA cause the thymes you wrote was wack / So you think that hip-hop had it's start out in Queensbridge / If you pupped that suck up in the Broas you might you fire."

This dies led to a succession of records released by both camps including "Kill That Noise by Shan, "Have a Nice Day" by Shante and "The Bridge is Over by BDP. In an interview with The Hillrop, MC Shant stated that the conflict helped to elevate both

artists careers.

"It started off to be serious early on, but KES-One put on in the history books. Without them making that record ["South Bronx"], we wouldn't have become as successful as we

The rivalry between the two groups had a tragic end, however, as BDPs DJ, DJ Scott La Rock was murdered in 1987 after trying to break up an afterontion between residents from the Roma and Ouserns.

There have been other histerior battles in hip-hop that often serve as the subject of industrytrade magazine articles and harbershop conversations. For example, U.T.F.O vs. Romane Shante (which produced two landmark rap records "Romanne, Romanne,"

MC Shan had lighted-hearted memories of the beef.

"Essentially, it wasn't really a battle. What they (U.T.P.O) used to do was unplug our mice thuring shows and charge us to use their equipment. But, we're all cost ones. I have Dr. Loca far member of U.T.P.O. in number in my above yield now.

Many Howard hip-hop "heads," or die-hard hip-hop purists, do not see the validity of cappers turning to music to handle squabbles, as in the case of fan, sophomore finance major.

Students Upset Over Departure of Players As NFL Teams Downsize


