At a Casual Camp, New Guinea

Mr. Nabritt

I know it has been quite some time since I last wrote to you, but for some time, my "moving about" has been a bit too often-

On Oct 16th I was transferred out of my Bn. to this Casual Camp, to await transportation back to the U.S. At present I am one of thousands here, whose daily prayer is: "Lord please send us a ship today, Amen." The latest "rumor" as of this morning is "That Gen. Mitchell will be here by Nov. 16, to take the entire camp of 4,600 GI's: Whether time or not, I am sure we will be out of here to be at our homes for the Xmas holidays. I hope to have arrived and been discharged at Fort Dix, N.J. by that time. Please don't bother to write, as officially, I now have no more military address, as far as Uncle Sam is concerned. My best regards to Mrs. Nabritt, Dr. & Mrs. Johnson, the faculty and all the others- Wishing you a very pleasant Turkey Day and hoping to be in D.C. to wish you a "Merry Xmas" in person, I am,
