Manuscript Division

Scope Note

The papers of home economist and Howard professor, Flemma P. Kittrell (1904-1980) span the period of 1924-1980 and measure approximately 10 linear feet. Dr. Kittrell was the head of the Home Economics department at Howard University from 1944-1971 and at Hampton Institute prior to that. Her collection of personal papers, correspondence, writings, photographs, and printed material provides valuable insight into her life and the field of home economics in the United States and abroad. Correspondents from Hampton include Mary R. Kennedy and Arthur Howe; at Howard, Mordecai Johnson, J. St. Clair Price and Frank M. Snowden. Other notable correspondents included in the collection are Mary McLeod Bethune, Charlotte Hawkins Brown, William Stuart Nelson, and Frederick D. Patterson. Additional sources reflecting Dr. Kittrell's accomplishments at Howard can be found in her writings which include fragments of her Ph.D. thesis and a proposal for developing a Ph.D. program in Nutrition.

While Dr. Kittrell was most closely affiliated with Howard University, the bulk of this collection deals with her experiences abroad. During the 1950's she devoted herself to Home Economics in India. Correspondence, the largest series in the collection, provides valuable insight into her activities. She had a strong affiliation with the Technical Cooperation Mission (TCM) of the American Embassy, New Delhi, chronicled by her correspondence with Levice Ellis, Clifford Liddle, Henry Niles, and Ruth Wright. At the University of Baroda, India, Dr. Kittrell helped establish a Home Economics Department. Correspondence with B.K. Zutshi, Hansa Mehta, Mary Francis Reed, and Justina Singh document her efforts. Other notable colleagues of Dr. Kittrell in India include Ava Hunt, Dorothy Pearson, and Rajammal Devadas, Chief Home Economist of India. In addition to correspondence, a 1951 Asian Diary, her writings, and photographs shed light on Dr. Kittrell's activities in India.

Dr. Kittrell also played an important role in the field of Home Economics in Africa. In the early 1960's she was Home Economics Consultant to the Congo Polytech Institute for the Women's Division of the Methodist Church.

Scope Note

Correspondents from this time period include Reverend Billy Starnes and Ruth Lawrence. Dr. Kittrell's accomplishments in Africa are also documented through photographs and through her writings which include a Liberian Nutritional Study and three reports on women in the Congo.

Acquired by the Moorland-Spingarn Research Center in 1985, Dr. Kittrell's papers provide a valuable resource to the study of the field of Home Economics in the U.S. and abroad, and to her role in its development.

- 1950 Received Fulbright Professorship to Baroda University, India where she helped organize a College of Home Economics and developed a research program for foods and nutrition
- 1953-1955 Returned to India for Point 4 Program and remained on assignment from U.S. State Department to continue completion of Baroda University College of Home Economics
- 1955 Elected member of the Board of Trustees, Hampton Institute; received Hampton Alumni Award as outstanding alumnus for the year
- 1957 Served as leader for U.S. State Department to accompany 22 Indian women to Japan and Hawaii to study home economics extension methods; participated in cultural tour to West Africa for the U.S. State Department
- 1958 Listed in Who's Who First Edition of American Women

- 1959 Participated in cultural tour to West and Central Africa for U.S State Department
- 1960 Conducted nutrition Survey of India and Thailand for United Nations
